

#### TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

We had sixteen hundred years' experience with one Eucharistic Prayer in our repertoire, and the liturgical reforms of the Council of Trent shaped the way we worshiped for four hundred years. In the last years of the Tridentine Mass, the early 1960s, we tended to see children as miniature adults. Fully rooted in the Sunday assembly by the decision of Pope Saint Pius X to push Communion back to the age of seven or so from the standard age of twelve to fourteen years during the early 1900s, children were still more tolerated than acknowledged. The Mass was in Latin, and by the 1960s the people had begun to regain their voices in the "dialogue Mass," so the focus was on training little children to recite or sing in Latin.

The new attention to the experience of children, their ability to enter into ritual, their spontaneity, their ability to grasp key concepts in faith, felt "untraditional." Yet we can trace in our tradition the ways in which children have long been given a special place in the assembly. From earliest times, boys have served in choirs and certain ministries in monasteries and in parish churches. Girls were sometimes entrusted to nuns, learning liturgical chants and the arts. Yet, in our day, the formation of a Lectionary for children and Eucharistic Prayers suited to them are truly tremendous breakthroughs in our treasury of prayer.

# PARISH PASTORAL COUNCIL Minutes of May 10, 2017 Meeting, Ministry Center

Father Ryan opened the PPC meeting with the Renew My Church prayer.

- 1. Agenda: The PPC Initiative with the focus on the parish school and religious education program. The sole agenda item was to receive the Bright Minds Marketing report from the consultant, Nick LeRoy, Indianapolis, IN.
- 2. The consultant, Nick LeRoy from Bright Minds Marketing presented the findings of the survey at the parish school faculty meeting at 2:30 p.m. and again at this PPC meeting. Mr. LeRoy presented an extensive overview of the parent and staff surveys that was conducted in January of 2017. The survey was conducted via an electronic survey tool and was designed to answer the following research objectives:

#### **Parents**

- Understand parents' overall satisfaction rates utilizing different questions.
- Understand parental satisfaction rates across different school dimensions: academics, specials, administration, technology, and communication.
- Perception of the parish school against competitive options.
- Qualitative feedback regarding the parish school.

#### **Staff/Teachers**

- Understand staff/teachers' satisfaction utilizing different questions.
- Understand staff/teachers' satisfaction rates across different dimensions: resources, professional development, administrative feedback, collaborative instructional tools.
- Qualitative feedback regarding the parish school.

Mr. LeRoy conveyed that this survey achieved a parental participation rate of 33% (134/401) and staff/teacher participation at 83% (34/41). The parental participation rate increased from the June 2016 survey which reported a 25% participation rate.

PPC members asked questions to Mr. LeRoy regarding overall key findings from the parent and teachers' survey as well as a thorough review of the recommendations. Mr. LeRoy provided an Executive Summary of the survey as well as the comprehensive overview of his presentation. Tom Purtell, Chair of the PPC, thanked Mr. LeRoy for the presentation, the Executive Summary, and the question/answer follow-up discussion.

Fr. Ryan asked Tom Purtell and Marty Bush to continue to converse with Mr. LeRoy on the survey findings. Fr. Ryan mentioned that further follow-up on the key findings and recommendations would continue with the hiring of the next principal for the parish school. A search committee has already been formed and will begin the focus of interviews and eventually recommending to Father Ryan the next principal.

The PPC expressed appreciation for the twenty-six (26) years of service for Mr. Roy Rash as principal of the parish school and wished Mr. Rash all the best in his retirement and future endeavors.

Father Ryan expressed appreciation for all those in attendance and for their dedication to the Parish. PPC meeting concluded with the Lord's Prayer.

# PARISH PASTORAL COUNCIL Minutes of September 26, 2017 Meeting, Ministry Center

The Renew My Church prayer was offered by Father Ryan to begin the meeting.

- **1. Congratulations:** Father Ryan offered congratulations to Tom Purtell for Diaconate Studies and to Pam Lynch, who just completed her Masters' degree and accepted the position of Director of Youth Ministry and Young Adult Formation in our parish.
- **2. Fix-It Campaign:** Jason Sfire distributed a hand-out, which included before and after pictures of the projects completed as of date. He and John Sfire provided an updated to the PPC on the Fix-It Together Campaign, which included the following items.
- a. There was discussion regarding the actual budgeted amounts versus the actual dollar amounts spent on projects completed thus far. Total savings from the original total budgeted amount is expected to be significant, even including the completion of added projects.
- b. Jason and John Sfire pointed out the main reason for the savings was due to *value engineering* (finding a more efficient way to complete a project). An example given was redoing the roofs and turning a three-step process into one step. This also applied to redoing the school and ministry building parking lots and completing them in four days versus a couple of weeks. This was made possible by the contractor bringing in several machines versus two machines, which involved one staging rather than several.
- c. Additional projects were able to be completed that were not in the initial plan due to the cost savings thus far, which included replacing the roofs on the west side and chapel of the church, installing a new HVAC unit in the church, and the installation of new safety doors and related accessories at the school.
- d. Future projects were discussed which included the demolition and removal of the old church, creation of a Cross using bricks from the old church marking the location of the original church's altar, construction of a storage building, replacement of the church flooring, replacing light bulbs at the church, and re-paving the back school parking lot. A suggestion was also made to add fans to the church roof for efficiency in circulation.
- e. It was discussed and decided that an update will go out to parishioners regarding the improvements that have been completed. Marty Bush and Tom Purtell will work on this letter.
- **3. Fix-It Finances:** Laura Angelini passed out a sheet showing the finances as of September 26, 2017. The total pledges to date are \$922,180 with 600 donors, which equates to an average of about \$1,500 per donor. The sale of the bequeathed property has been finalized, and the parish is now awaiting the receipt of the funds.

#### 4. School Enrollment:

- a. Kyle Schmitt, parish school principal, provided the PPC with an updated on the school enrollment numbers and distributed a sheet giving a breakdown of students enrolled in each grade. He pointed out that enrollment has significantly increased at the preschool level, and this is important and positive for the school, hopefully leading to higher enrollment in upper grades. He also indicated that the school lost a portion of 5th graders from last year mainly due to many families transitioning to Lake Zurich D95 schools.
- b. Kyle Schmitt also discussed marketing plans to increase enrollment which include promoting growth numbers shown through ASPIRE test scores. SFDS ranks in the upper 50% metric as reflected in test scores. Also, during his recent visit to Carmel Catholic High School, students graduating from our school have an average 3.75 GPA.

#### **5. 2017-18 Marketing Plan:**

a. Tom Purtell and Marty Bush distributed a summary of the marketing plan and summarized the main points which included the Executive Summary, planned marketing strategies, and marketing tactics.

- b. The group brainstormed ideas such as using favorable student/teacher ratios and class sizes, ASPIRE scores, lower tuition costs relative to other private schools, alumni that have continued to attend colleges and universities and have obtained graduate and post-graduate degrees, to market the school to increase enrollment.
- c. Father Ryan indicated that he already provided marketing materials to the surrounding area daycare centers and realtors during the summer with the help of our college summer interns.
- d. Vouchers and scholarships can help enrollment for families in need.
- **6. Evangelization through Intentional Discipleship:** Pam Lynch gave a brief summary about the new Intentional Discipleship Initiative. This is based on adult formation, led by Deacon Keith Strohm, with weekly meetings and some half-day retreats. Meetings will be held Tuesday evenings from October 2017 through April of 2018. Further details and continued development of this PPC initiative will be submitted at the next meeting.
- 7. PPC concluded with The Lord's Prayer.


