TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

Today we have a modern feast, less than a century old, and placed at the very end of the liturgical cycle of Sundays only in 1969. In 1925, the world was in a sorry state from the vantage point of Pope Pius XI. The winds of war had swept the map of Europe raw, and ancient Christian dynasties had fallen in Russia and Spain. Although the Great War had ended, wars were breaking out everywhere. Fascism was already in control in Italy, and Nazism was on the horizon for Germany. The disorder making its claim on the human race was, the pope felt, an insult to the Divine Order. Pius XI designated the last Sunday in October as a day of universal recognition of the kingship of Christ. Creating this feast was an act of bravery by the pope, who was standing up against idolatry of the state and the dehumanizing forces of the modern world, things that are not hard to detect in today's world as well. In 1969 it seemed fitting to move the feast to a place of honor at the end of the year, a way of summing up the whole movement of the liturgical year toward the perfection of the Kingdom of God. In recent decades, many Protestant churches have adopted this day from the new Roman calendar, so it is shared now with the Church of England, the Episcopal, Presbyterian, and Lutheran churches, and others.

The Commemoration of All the Faithful Departed (All Souls' Day)

Dear those who have lost a loved one,

On behalf of the parish, our continued prayers for you and your family. The death of a loved one leaves an empty place in our hearts for the rest of our time in this life. We are humbled to be present to you and to support you now, and in the years ahead.

Perhaps you have already made arrangements for interment of your loved one's cremated remains, or discussed with us your future plans that are in keeping with Catholic tradition. If you have not, we want you to know that we would be honored to be off assistance to you as you consider where the final resting place of your loved one will be, and how to make such arrangements.

It is important to understand that the Church does not oppose the cremation of the body, unless it is chosen for reasons which are contrary to the Catholic Christian faith. In our culture and time, options for the final disposition of cremated remains are many, and though various practices are common, many are not in keeping with the Catholic teaching. The National Conference of Catholic Bishops in the United States approved the decree in which is stated, "The cremated remains of a body should be treated with the same respect given to the human body from which they come." The Vatican also recently published a new *Order of Christian Funerals*. Since it is not yet published in English, late Cardinal George provides further explanation of Catholic teaching on cremation with the following quote from the new publication: "The Church continues to maintain that the burial of the dead is more appropriate, that it expresses faith in the resurrection of the flesh, nourishes the piety of the faithful and favors the recollection and prayer of relatives and friends." Both burial in the ground and entombment in a mausoleum are appropriate and treat the body with reverence and respect.

Again, we would be honored to assist you, to discuss concerns or questions, to provide guidance, and to arrange for offering prayers at the cemetery for the committal of your loved one's cremated remains. Committal prayers may be offered by a priest, deacon or bereavement minister. These prayers, along with the Vigil or Wake Service and the Funeral Mass or Service, remind us of the sacredness of the human body and that our human body is in Christ, and destined one day for the glory of the resurrection of the dead. Guidance for Groupings Until “Activation”

- When a grouping is “activated,” the process will help groupings discern new opportunities for parish vitality as well as new models that meet the demographics and mission needs in the area
- Groupings should wait to begin the 5-phase process until they are “activated” and provided with the resources and guidance to begin discernment and planning
- All groupings will be “activated” sometime over the course of the next 3-4 years
- We are beginning the process of gathering input on the best timing for each grouping to be activated and will be hearing input and sharing more information about timing as it unfolds
- In the meantime, groupings can begin building relationships among one another and beginning initial collaboration (see below)

Guidance for building relationships and beginning initial collaboration in groupings:

- Build relationships and get to know one another
- Identify ways to coordinate to help address current challenges

CHURCH BUS PILGRIMAGE

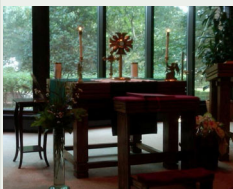
