

### TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

Last week, we looked at a form of nativity scene called a *presipio*, characterized by framing the crèche of Jesus with a vast array of personalities and a rich geographical context. The tradition was carried to the New World, and finds rich expression in Latin America today. While in Europe the *presepio* was reserved to the homes of wealthy nobles and great churches, in Latin America it was claimed by the poor and expressed the skills of native artisans. In Mexico, you can still find clay figures in every village market. In a way, the native people took the religion of Spanish rule and baptized it with their Indian culture by surrounding the crib of Jesus with local geography and people. In Brazil, the figure of the baby Jesus is wrapped in gold and gems, and set on a hillside surrounded by flowers and animals of all kinds. Sometimes there is a double *presepio*, presenting both Nativity and Crucifixion.

In some places in Latin America, even non-religious people take care to have a *presepio* in the home, sometimes dedicating one whole room in the house or apartment to the scene. Some cities have markets where people from the countryside sell plants and figurines. In Cuzco, churches and families provide hot chocolate for the children of the poor who come down to help create the nativity scenes. In Paraguay, the baby Jesus grows—the small infant who arrives on Christmas Eve is replaced at New Year with a toddler Jesus who holds in one hand the globe and in the other a cross. Few Christmas traditions have the vitality and variety of *presepios* and crèches honoring the Nativity.

### NO 'TWO-FOR-ONE' MASS THIS CHRISTMAS December 5, 2017, Carol Zimmermann, Catholic News Service

WASHINGTON (CNS) -- Although Christmas this year is the day after the fourth Sunday of Advent, Catholics looking to count a Sunday evening Mass Dec. 24 for both that Sunday obligation and Monday's Christmas Mass obligation will have to think again.

The U.S. bishops already saw this coming at the beginning of the year and said Catholics should attend separate Masses for the two days.

A newsletter issued in February by the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops' Committee on Divine Worship noted that a "two-for-one" Mass cannot occur in the very rare circumstances when two of the



six holy days of obligation -- the feast of the Immaculate Conception or Christmas -- fall the day before or after Sunday.

"When consecutive obligations occur on Saturday-Sunday or Sunday-Monday, the faithful must attend Mass twice to fulfill two separate obligations," the committee said.

The reason Catholics might consider the idea of receiving dispensation from a Monday Mass likely stems from the U.S. bishops' vote in 1991 to lift the obligation to attend Mass on holy days of obligation that fall on Saturdays or Mondays. But that vote was only for three of the six holy days: the feast of Mary, Mother of God, Jan. 1; the feast of the Assumption, Aug. 15; and the feast of All Saints, Nov. 1.

This does not apply to Christmas and the feast of the Immaculate Conception, which is Dec. 8. Most dioceses have transferred observance of the feast of the Ascension from the Thursday 40 days after Easter to the following Sunday.

The committee's newsletter offers a nuanced explanation of the required Mass attendance on holy days falling before or after Sundays, noting that a "dubium," which is Latin for a request for clarification, about the possibility of "simultaneous fulfillment of obligations was answered in the negative by the Sacred Congregation for the Clergy and approved by Blessed Pope Paul VI in 1970." The committee notes that this clarification was not issued as a conclusive and authoritative interpretation, but it has weight since it was backed by the Vatican and the pope.

The newsletter also points out that in the absence of a "definitive interpretation by the Holy See, attendance at the evening Mass shared by the two holy days is indeed sufficient to fulfill both obligations," but the caveat here is that the church's intention in providing vigil Masses was "never envisioned as a legal loophole, and, hence, separate obligations remain."

The divine worship committee also holds out hope that Catholics would want to go to Mass two days in a row, saying: "It would be hoped, of course, that Catholics foster a love for the sacred liturgy and hold a desire to celebrate the holy days as fully as is reasonably possible."

There also is the tiniest amount of wiggle room. The committee acknowledges that situations arise where fulfilling Mass obligations on consecutive days is either impractical or impossible for an individual or a family and in these cases pastors can grant individual dispensations. Similarly, diocesan bishops "may examine their regional circumstances and grant general dispensations or commutations, while permitting their pastors to make judgments in individual cases," the committee said, but such judgment calls are exceptions to the general rule.

The bishops' committee also has looked ahead to when this will happen again. In the next 12 years, Christmas will fall either on a Saturday or a Monday four times and the feast of the Immaculate Conception will fall on either of those days three times.

Paulist Father Larry Rice, director of the University Catholic Center at the University of Texas at Austin, said he hasn't heard anyone ask about a dispensation for the Christmas liturgy, but he suspects some will try to combine the Sunday and Monday Masses. They also might go to the Saturday evening vigil for Sunday and the Sunday vigil for Christmas, which is OK.


He said the big challenge for parishes this year will be decorating for Christmas liturgies, especially parishes with afternoon Masses on Sunday that will only have a few hours to "turn the church over from Advent to Christmas." Another challenge will be getting volunteers to help set up churches for Christmas Eve.


Some parishes are moving up the time of their Sunday Masses on the fourth Sunday of Advent to accommodate the quick turnaround.


Father Rice told Catholic News Service the rare event of a Monday Christmas "sounds to me like an opportunity to simplify, although Christmas isn't generally a time people are looking for that."

### TAX CREDIT SCHOLARSHIPS COMMUNICATION

You may have read or heard that the governor signed into law a comprehensive education funding bill passed by the House and Senate in August. The law includes a new five-year program to fund "tax credit scholarships" (TCS) to enable lower-income students to attend private schools in Illinois.

Our Parish and School leaders have been tracking the progress of this initiative as we build our overall financial assistance program for the Parish School. While TCS's will be available for the next school year, state officials are still working out many of the details. This includes how individuals can designate their donation to a Scholarship Granting Organization (SGO) to an individual school or subset of schools.

What we do know is that the SGO's will give initial priority for these scholarships to students from a household with an income below \$45,510 and students in "focus districts." <u>Lake Zurich and neighboring communities</u> are not on the list of these "focus districts."

Some Parish families have already received a letter from the Archdiocese of Chicago inviting them to learn more about this program and how they may participate through donations. For those, and others who are interested in learning more, the Archdiocese provides a series of questions and answers on their website at <a href="https://schools.archchicago.org//tax-credit-scholarships">https://schools.archchicago.org//tax-credit-scholarships</a>.

We will let you know as more details emerge on this initiative. ### TOTUS TUUS SUMMER MISSION PROGRAM FOR COLLEGE-AGED YOUTH

College-aged young adults are invited to explore the opportunity to work for the Archdiocese of Chicago as Totus Tuus Missionaries during the summer. They will spend 6 weeks during the summer evangelizing youth, and best of all, they get paid as an internship. Missionaries receive \$2,250, plus food and lodging.



Totus Tuus is accepting applications for its summer mission program and looking for outstanding college students who are searching for a summer job that will change their lives.

Totus Tuus is a summer mission program that offers college students the opportunity to put their faith into action. Our Totus Tuus Missionaries will spend two weeks being trained and formed in the faith in order to be sent out to parishes across the Archdiocese of Chicago putting on faith-based missions for grade school and high school youth. While teaching and forming young people in the faith, our college missionaries will be living in community with their teammates, praying as a group and discerning where Jesus is calling them in life.

**Applications are due by the middle of March, but we are accepting them now!** The Totus Tuus program begins May 27, 2018 with two weeks of training. The Missionaries are then grouped into teams of four, two men and two women, and are sent out into parishes around the Archdiocese of Chicago. They will be sent to a new parish each week until the program ends July 28th. And they will get a one-week break from June 30th to July 7th to enjoy the 4th of July with family and friends.

During the day, Missionaries will be working with the grade school participants teaching them the faith, playing games, performing skits, and taking them to Mass. And in the evening they will lead junior high and high school participants in faith formation through witness talks and small group discussions.

As you can see, being a Totus Tuus Missionary is a wonderful opportunity for college-aged youth to grow in their faith, make an impact on the lives of hundreds of teens and youth this summer and, earn money for college.

# ARCHDIOCESE OF CHICAGO CATHOLIC SCHOOLS 2017/18 SCHOOL YEAR "INVEST IN KIDS" TAX CREDIT SCHOLARSHIPS

### What You Need to Know About the "Invest in Kids" Tax Credit Scholarships

Through the "Invest in Kids Act," Illinois children from low-income households who want to attend private schools will have access to new scholarships. The scholarships offered through this program could cover up to 100 percent of tuition and eligible fees for next school year. Below is more information about how to apply and details on eligibility requirements.

### Tax Credit Scholarships

Students from low-income households in grades K-12 have the opportunity to receive tax credit scholarships for the 2018/19 school year. These scholarships are funded by donors who receive a credit on their Illinois state income tax as a result of their donation.

### **Application Process**

Since this is a new program, application details are being finalized, and the Archdiocese will share them as soon as they are available. When the time comes, the Archdiocese will provide assistance by answering your questions and helping families complete the application.

### Help Applying

You will be able to get help applying for the scholarship in-person at a variety of events in your community in the coming months. The Archdiocese will share the dates and locations of these events as these details are finalized. For families whose first language is not English, we will have in-person resources available to help you through the application process.

### **Application Deadline**

You will need to apply for tax credit scholarships through a scholarship granting organization (SGO), which will manage this process, instead of the Archdiocese or your school directly. It is still being determined when the SGO may begin accepting applications and the deadline for submitting applications. The Archdiocese will provide more information as soon as it is available. Scholarships will be awarded on a first come, first serve basis, so it is very important that when the application process begins, you apply early.

### How to Qualify

Eligibility to receive a scholarship is based on your family's household income. For example, a student could receive a scholarship if his/her family income is less than \$73,800 a year for a family of four. See chart below for more information on eligibility for tax credit scholarships.

### Scholarship Amount

Your family could receive a scholarship that covers up to 100 percent of tuition and eligible fees for next school year. See the chart below that shows how much you could receive to cover tuition based on your income for a family of four.
