

#### **BELIEVING IN JESUS CHRIST**

The First Letter of John calls Jesus Christ "expiation for our sins" (1 John 2:2). Finally, in the Gospel Jesus greets the disciples with "Peace" and urges them to preach "repentance, for the forgiveness of sins" (Luke 24:47).

#### TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

There are many ways in which religious communities are organized. Some have a central authority in a congregation, and others have a "rule" that is shared by all the members, but are a kind of federation of independent houses. Sometimes, congregations with distinct histories and ministries decide to merge. Several years ago, one of the largest mergers on record took place. Seven independent congregations of Dominican women religious, most in the Midwest, are now one new congregation enfolding more than seven hundred members spanning thirty-six states. The oldest of the founding groups, the so-called "Kentucky Dominicans," began as a frontier community in 1822. Other communities have European roots. To get to this historic moment, the sisters spent many years in conversation, and approved the new structure by a two-thirds majority vote. This was then ratified by the Holy See. The merger allows the sisters to pool their resources in order to be more effective in ministry. They are living the Paschal Mystery, experiencing Christ's dying and rising in an inspiring way.

# **DEACON'S CORNER**By Deacon John Sfire

Well, we have all just witnessed the great day of celebration of our faith for *Christ is Risen, He is truly Risen*. How many times do we mistakenly think about Christmas as being the most important celebration of our faith? Perhaps because our society has made such a secular holiday out of Christmas. And while I agree that the Birth of Our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ is important, it pales in comparison to His triumph over sin and the evil one by His suffering, death and Resurrection in order for us to be saved. That is what Easter, a couple days back, and all of Lent and Holy Week are all about. The Glorious Resurrection of Our Lord and Savior.

In writing this DC on Monday morning, just the day after the Resurrection of Our Lord, I found myself a bit hesitant about what to write about. Not because the Resurrection of Christ is hard to write about, but I kept trying to come up with something new and different to write about this wondrous day. And no matter how much thought I continued to give this, I kept coming back to the simple facts about what had taken place in our lives for the past 40 days as well as the past 2,000 years. It is the same story but because we are living in a world of constant <code>/change/</code>, perhaps we see and hear something different with each year that passes. Remember, that in many DCs and homilies during Lent, I have written/spoken about <code>/change/</code>. And we all know and should accept the fact that <code>/change/</code> is always inevitable in our lives if we wish to grow, especially in our spiritual journey. Just think for a moment about how our lives have changed just in the past 5-10 years! You may have lived in different places, driven different cars, dressed differently, and so on and so on. You might even say that we live in a time of accelerated <code>/change/</code> which has been brought on in our lives by globalization, technology and the internet, all of which has become an accepted part of our society.

So now let's stop for a moment and think about changes that took place 2,000 years ago during the 40 days preceding the Crucifixion, death and Resurrection of Our Lord. Jesus healed the sick, fed the multitudes, raised the dead and then, after being persecuted and nailed to the Cross, He rose triumphant from the dead in order for us to be saved, in order for our sins to be forgiven. Think of the confusion that all of these changes must have brought to the hearts and minds of His disciples, especially when they went to the tomb where Jesus had been buried only to find it empty. I truly believe that we can say that WHEN JESUS CHRIST BECOMES INVOLVED IN OUR LIVES, CHANGE IS INEVITABLE.

Think about it. On the Cross, the world did all it could to Jesus. At Easter, the day of His Resurrection, God, the Father, did all He could do to the world. And the earth shook. And how happy and thankful we all must be that this did take place for without the day of His Resurrection, the gates of Paradise would never be open to us. This is not something we can explain, it is something we witness. That is why the Risen Christ appeared first to His disciples, for they had already been witness to His teaching, seen Him heal the sick and raise the dead, seen Him love the poor and attack the rich and ultimately witnessed Him being arrested by the soldiers, tried by Pilate and then crucified. And while this has all the makings for a horrible, tragic and unfair story, Jesus took the Cross and made it a means of triumph for all to partake in. Because Jesus first appeared to His disciples, those who were closest to Him, but also had forsaken Him out of fear, this shows us that no matter where we are in life or what we have done to offend His laws, that God will always be at our side to protect us, to help us and most importantly, to forgive us.

So as we look back on this past Easter 2018 (day of His Resurrection), let us realize that the message of this day is simple. That Jesus Christ was triumphant over death giving us eternal life over sin. It is for this reason that this day is so important. Heed these words and let us be thankful for the greatest sacrifice ever given, that God would send His only Son to die on the Cross so we may have eternal life.

#### 11TH PLEDGE UPDATE AND REPAIRS COMPLETED

Dear Parishioners.

As a reminder of what has been accomplished since May, the parking lots, paved areas, curbs, and sidewalks of the St. Francis de Sales Campus—including our Church and School—have now been completed. The new siding on the Ministry Center roof has also been installed. Repairs have been made to the Chapel roof on the Church, which began to seriously leak along the south wall of the Chapel during the spring and summer rainstorms. In addition to the Chapel roof, the slanted roof above the back sacristy and Music Room has been fixed. It had been leaking for a number of years.

As pledges are made and paid, we will continue to address the remaining projects, which can be found on our parish website. See what this good parish has accomplished already in total pledges and number of donors! At this point in the Campaign, 780 donors helped us reach \$1,236,959 in total pledges. Total pledges paid are \$1,016,600. Balance due is \$220,358. It is not the intention of the Fix-It Campaign to place the parish in debt. As a parish, we spent 9 years paying off the \$3.8 million debt. We will only address the projects as we raise the funds to pay for them. As Thomas Jefferson advised, "Never spend your money before you have it!" My Grandmother Ryan said the same message in her own way!

Thank you to those who have already responded with a pledge toward the \$1.7 million goal. St. Francis de Sales has a long history of generous giving. I respectfully ask for the prayers, involvement, and sacrifice of many, if not all, in the parish in making a pledge towards the Fix-It Campaign in addition to the generosity you provide each Sunday offering. For example, if 1,000 parishioners pledge the suggested amount of \$850 per year for 2 years, we will reach our campaign goal immediately to conclude the projects. Please, everyone, participate through a prayer and a pledge. All the funds we raise in the Fix-It Campaign stay within the parish.

I want to express my gratitude to Deacon John Sfire, Jason Sfire, and Amie Paige of The Fidelity Group for doing an extensive study of our parish campus, as was presented in the Fix-It Campaign presentation. I have asked the Fidelity Group, under the leadership of Deacon John Sfire and Jason Sfire, to serve as Project Managers of the Fix-It Campaign. I also want to offer my appreciation for the guidance and involvement of Tom Purtell, Chair of the Parish Pastoral Council (PPC), Marty Bush, Member of the PPC; Mike Carlino, Chair of the Parish Finance Council; Doug Samz, Member of the Parish Finance Council; Christine DePrez, Cornerstone Bank Liaison; Laura Angelini, Business Manager; and Pam Lynch, Director of Youth and Young Adult Ministries.

**Connor Kramer:** Designed, built, and installed shelving units for the Lake Zurich Middle School South Band program so the instruments and equipment could be organized and stored safely.


**Joseph Martin:** Built a storage shelving unit for the Lake Zurich Police Department.
