ALL ARE SENT

Fifty days after Easter Sunday we celebrate the fulfillment of all God's promises in the feast of Pentecost, a feast that has sometimes been called the birthday of the church. One last time we are reminded that we Christians have received the Holy Spirit, not for our own benefit, but to enable us to follow our Christian vocation.

The centerpiece of the scriptures for Pentecost is the account in Acts of the Apostles of the sending of the Holy Spirit to the disciples. The other readings for this Sunday help us to understand what it means to live out our Christian vocation. Paul's letter shows us the gifts and fruits that the Holy Spirit gives to us. John's Gospel reminds us that Jesus has sent all his disciples to share his forgiveness and peace, through the power of the Holy Spirit.

TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

The disciples gathered on the fiftieth day after the Resurrection were not keeping their first Pentecost. For them, Pentecost was the fiftieth day after Passover, a feast of the first fruits of the harvest. It was the second most important feast of the year. Today, Jews gather on the eve of the feast to study scripture and the law, and after the feast begins at sundown, spend the day in joyful social gatherings. The meaning of the celebration is the giving of the law on Mount Sinai, so for Christians the connection to the gifts of the Holy Spirit is obvious. In Sicily and in the Pantheon in Rome, today the descent of the Holy Spirit is enacted with a stunning ritual. Some churches there have an "eye" in the roof open to the sky, called an *oculus*. After the Gospel today, thousands of rose petals fall from the oculus onto the assembly. Churches and homes are decked in greenery and flowers to express the new life the Holy Spirit brings on this, the "birthday of the church."

Hello, my name is Kelly Smith. I am, and have been, a SPRED Catechist at St. Francis de Sales Parish since our beginnings in 2001. I want to tell you that good things are happening in SPRED! I want to tell you my SPRED story. I want to tell you why I said YES to SPRED, why I am still here 17 years later, and to invite you to join me.

My road to SPRED began back in the 1980's when I was teaching at a school for the developmentally disabled. It was then, that I heard the first whisperings of the SPRED Ministry, which was by then already 30 years old. I learned that several of my students were participants in SPRED and I was asked to join them. Although I was quite interested, I was newly married and expecting my first child, so I said maybe next year. The next year we moved to Lake Zurich and St. Francis became our new parish. It did not have a SPRED Ministry. Soon after, I was expecting my second child and so it went through the 90's with the addition of a third child to our family. However, by the late 90's I was compelled to volunteer as a catechist for a group of developmentally disabled preschoolers. We were using a modified preschool curriculum which was not working out very well. It was also at this same time, that I was struggling. I felt that something was missing in my life. I was, and am very blessed with a wonderful husband, three children, great friends, and a supportive extended family. So, what could be missing? I realized that although I attended church regularly, my spiritual growth had stagnated. Then, I heard that a neighboring parish was to host an informational meeting on SPRED. There it was, that ministry I had heard about so long ago. I attended that meeting and finally I heard God's call loud and clear. I knew instantly that this was the ministry for me and a much better fit for our friends with special needs. SPRED is a ministry that happens to serve our special population, but also those that come forward and call themselves their friends. SPRED is a small community of individuals who gather to share God's word and their faith with others. After each SPRED session I am rejuvenated and feel closer to God. My faith has continued to grow, because SPRED feeds the hearts and souls of all involved. That is why I said yes to SPRED and continue to be passionate about this ministry. Consider joining me and our SPRED community. No special requirements are needed to participate in this program, just a desire to share your love and faith with another. Perhaps you have heard God's whispers calling you, or you too have been searching for that missing element in your life. Perhaps SPRED is the answer for you or someone you know. Say YES to SPRED! ST. FRANCIS DE SALES: THE BEST SCHOOL EVER, By Daniel Barker

I used to wonder why my parents sent me to St. Francis instead of a public school, but after being here for nine years, I know why. I have had many unforgettable experiences and am extremely lucky to have attended this school for nine whole years.

Around Christmas time we have a tree that is decorated with mittens. The mittens have items that less fortunate people need. People take the mittens, buy the item that is listed on the mitten, and then return it to the church as a wrapped present. The presents then go to the people who are in need. Finally, we have the St. Vincent de Paul food pantry. Every Thursday people who need food can come and get food from our food pantry. The ways that we try to help all people and accept everyone show that St. Francis not only a school, it is a community.

Some people may think that the cost is too high to attend St. Francis. Although this is a big deal to some people, we will help you throughout your journey. We provide you with help if you are in need of the money. If you think that it is just not worth it, it most definitely is. There are experiences here that can't be matched at any other school and we want you to experience them with us.
