

TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

As Independence Day draws near, we think of the men and women of the military who serve with courage and competence, some far from home. How does the Church accompany them? In 1939, Pope Pius XII created an independent jurisdiction of the Catholic Church called the "Military Vicariate." In 1985 Pope John Paul II created the "Archdiocese for Military Services, USA." Spanning the globe and serving nearly one and a half million Roman Catholics, more than 1,000 priests minister in hospitals, on military bases of all the armed forces, on ships at sea, and on the battlefield. The AMS does not ordain priests, but accepts priests from religious orders and dioceses.

In 1824 a Jesuit priest named Adam Marshall enlisted in the Navy and died at sea in 1825. He assigned as a "schoolmaster," but he sought out and ministered to Catholic sailors. Twenty years later, President Polk was worried that the war with Mexico was seen as anti-Catholic, so he recruited two Jesuit priests to serve in the army as chaplains. At the time of the Civil War, only about ten percent of Americans were Catholic. Military policies forced Catholic soldiers to attend Protestant services. The Church protested this rule, and many priests volunteered to become chaplains. Their witness and the courage of the "Nuns of the Battlefield" (several orders of sisters who assisted Civil War victims) helped temper prejudice against Catholics and pave the way for the life and ministry of this vigorous and unique archdiocese.

The Edward Hines VA, 5000 S. Hines Ave., Hines, IL 60141 (Directly behind Loyola Medical Center in Maywood)

Jesse Brown VA, 820 S. Damen, Chicago, IL 60612 (Just south of 290, next to Rush Medical Center on Damen)

My suggestion is always to go visit. You don't need to bring anything. You don't need to call ahead. You don't need cookies, cards, or anything else. You don't need a badge to get in. You just need to show up. What you will find is many Veterans of all stripes just sitting around looking for companionship and someone to talk to. All you need to do is smile and say hello. You will be surprised how easy they are to talk to. I guarantee anyone who does this will make at lease one friend and will hear a few really interesting stories. So many are just looking for someone to care. You will make more of a difference thank you think in a very simple way. I have had the pleasure and honor to have many of these conversations. I am better for it.



And as students at St. Francis, we are all taught how to use these gifts to our fullest potential. My final plea to all of you is that you use your advantages to help others and continue to demonstrate why St. Francis de Sales is a blue ribbon school inside and outside of the classroom.
