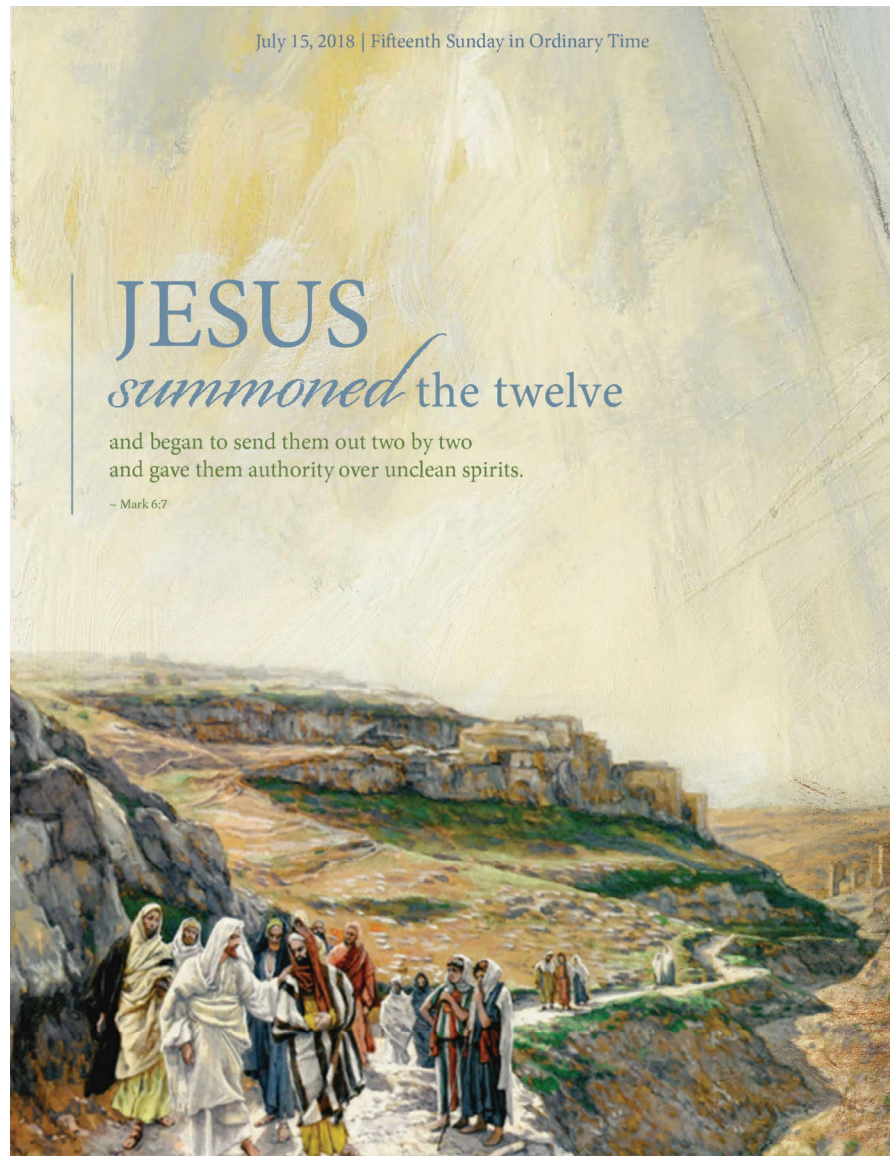

TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

At the time of the Reformation, although England broke away from papal authority under Henry VIII, a silent majority clung to the Catholic faith. Henry's eldest daughter, Mary, restored the "old religion" in a fierce persecution of Protestants (she is called "Bloody Mary" for good reason.) His youngest daughter, Elizabeth, rejected papal ties. Under her reign, beginning with legislation in 1593, Catholics were persecuted again, and only the very wealthy could afford the fines for not attending Anglican services on Sunday. They were called "recusants," from a Latin word meaning "refuse," since they refused to attend the liturgy of the Church of England. Many families maintained Catholic tradition in secret, and today their descendants claim "Recusancy" as a mark of family pride. For generations they sent their young people abroad to be educated in convents and monasteries. It is not surprising that the first monastery in colonial America springs from Holland with the daughters of patrician English recusant families. Port Tobacco, Maryland, proved fruitful soil for the Carmelite tradition.

POPE: SEEK CHRIST IN 'ABANDONED TABERNACLES' OF THE POOR, THE LONELY

ROME — As he did with his disciples at Passover, Jesus asks all Christians to prepare a place for him, not in “exclusive, selective places” but rather in uncomfortable places that are “untouched by love, untouched by hope,” Pope Francis said.

“How many persons lack dignified housing or food to eat! All of us know people who are lonely, troubled and in need: they are abandoned tabernacles. We, who receive from Jesus our own room and board, are here to prepare a place and a meal for these, our brothers and sisters in need,” the pope said in his homily during Mass June 3, the feast of the Body and Blood of Christ.

Pope Francis celebrated the feast day Mass not in Rome, as had been the tradition since 1979, but in the seaside town of Ostia, about 16 miles west. Ostia was where St. Monica, the mother of St. Augustine, died in 387 on a journey back to Africa after St. Augustine’s conversion to Christianity.

During his pontificate, Blessed Paul VI celebrated the feast day in different neighborhoods in and around Rome, including in Ostia in 1968. Pope Francis’ evening Mass outside St. Monica Church was followed by a Corpus Christi procession through the streets of Ostia.

A local priest carried the monstrance containing the Blessed Sacrament, surrounded by four men carrying tall poles holding a canopy. Thousands of men, women and children lined the streets, taking photos and reverently making the sign of the cross as the Blessed Sacrament passed them.

Owing to his difficulty walking long distances, Pope Francis met the procession at the Church of Our Lady of Bonaria instead of participating in it. Before the benediction, the pope stood before the Blessed Sacrament, head bowed in silent prayer, while the choir sang “Tantum Ergo,” the medieval eucharistic hymn composed by St. Thomas Aquinas.

In his homily, the pope reflected on the Gospel reading in which Jesus instructs his disciples to find a place to celebrate the Passover. Although the disciples were supposed to prepare the place, the pope noted, they discover a large room that is “furnished and ready.”

“Jesus prepares for us and asks us to be prepared,” the pope said. “What does he prepare for us? A place and a meal. A place much more worthy than the ‘large furnished room’ of the Gospel.”

That place here on earth, the pope said, is the church “where there is, and must be, room for everyone.”

The Eucharist, he added, “is the beating heart of the church” and strengthens all men and women who partake in it.

When receiving Jesus’ body and blood, Christians are not only given their “reservation” to the heavenly banquet, but also nourished with the “bread of heaven,” which is “the only matter on earth that tastes of eternity,” he said.

All men and women, he continued, have a hunger to be loved and are never fully satisfied, even when receiving “the most pleasing compliments, the finest gifts and the most advanced technologies.”

Instead, by receiving Communion and worshiping Christ in the tabernacle, Christians “encounter Jesus” and feel his love.

“Dear brothers and sisters, let us choose this food of life! Let us make Mass our priority!” he exclaimed. “Let us rediscover eucharistic adoration in our communities! Let us implore the grace to hunger for God, with an insatiable desire to receive what he has prepared for us.”

Pope Francis said that by giving themselves in service to others, Christians live “eucharistically” and imitate Jesus who “became bread broken for our sake.”

Like the disciples, who were instructed by Jesus to go out to the city to make preparations, Christians also are called to prepare for Jesus’ coming “not by keeping our distance but by entering our cities” and tearing down “the walls of indifference and silent collusion.”

“The Eucharist invites us to let ourselves be carried along by the wave of Jesus, to not remain grounded on the beach in the hope that something may come along, but to cast into the deep, free, courageous and united,” the pope said.

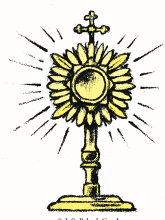

Three years ago, we signed up our daughter, Natalia, to attend the SPRED Ministry in our parish in preparation for her First Communion. She was 8 years old. At SPRED, Natalia found a welcoming place. A place where she was always received with a smile, even on those days when she was tired, upset or just plain "I rather stay home." Slowly and patiently, Natalia's catechist became her friend. With much understanding and love Ms. Cathy was able to help Natalia make a smooth transition from Mom/Home to Friend/SPRED on Wednesday nights. In time, Natalia was able to get used to her new Wednesday evening routine and to enjoy her time away from home with "SPRED friends" and other children her age. SPRED became a place where she could share not only things about her daily life but also things about our Catholic faith. The day of her First Communion having her SPRED friends there along with her family made the day even more special for her. To our surprise, the year after her First Communion, Natalia still wanted to go to SPRED. SPRED had become a special time of the week for her. She loves her time in the holy room and has come to respect what is said and what happens in it. She has mentioned how wonderful it feels to be silent and listen while in the Holy Room. At times while at home, she sings, sways, and holds hands just like they do in the Holy Room. Another highlight of SPRED for her is "agape" time, when they all sit together and share a meal, much like when we have a meal together at home. She prepares for it mentally and physically by doing things such as picking out what outfit to wear, looking for the pictures she needs to bring in, and reminding us that she won't be around for dinner because she will be at SPRED that week. She also likes to contribute by bringing things to share. She prays for SPRED friends and she tells others, family and friends, about the things that happen at SPRED. When Tuesday evening comes, she always asks "Mom, did Cathy call yet?", wondering whether or not her Catechist has called to confirm that there will be a session the next day.

In SPRED Natalia has found her own faith journey. It may look and feel different from ours, but we truly believe it is still sacred and beautiful. We would like to express our deep gratitude to Fr. Ryan for making this Ministry available at our Church and most importantly to all the SPRED volunteers and donors who so lovingly continue to make this so much needed ministry possible for our Special Needs children. We are blessed to have you in our Church! May God continue to bless your efforts abundantly!

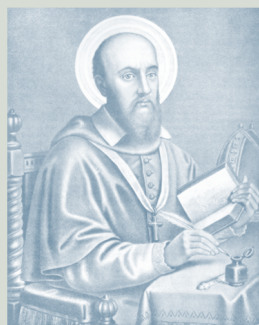

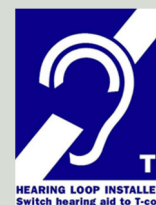
