



### WEEKLY MIRACLE

This week marks the beginning of a kind of "liturgical detour." We have been listening to Saint Mark's Gospel during this liturgical year (Year B). Today we begin to hear a long section from John's Gospel, starting with the miracle of the multiplication of the loaves and fishes. This miracle story is a prelude to the Lord's statements that we will begin hearing in a few weeks, in which Jesus refers to himself as the "bread of life." Each week we witness a miracle at Mass. We do not see a multiplication of loaves before us. What our eyes of faith allow us to see is the miracle of the transformation of common elements—bread and wine—into the Lord's Body and Blood. Once we have received the Lord, the multiplication begins, for in the Eucharist we are strengthened to multiply our efforts to feed the poor, shelter the homeless, and bring comfort to the despairing.

### TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

Last Wednesday, the greatest pilgrimage in our tradition ended with the feast of Saint James at his shrine in Compostela, Spain. Every year, as many as 100,000 persons walk a portion of the medieval way of the pilgrim, earning the right to wear the scallop shell symbol of this journey of faith. In legend, this city on the northern coast of Spain is the final resting place of the apostle, and the full name of the cathedral is "Saint James of the Field of Stars." There is a tradition that Saint James the Great preached there.

In the Roman Catholic tradition, the pilgrimage is a symbol, life's journey distilled, a powerful sign of our journey toward a certain goal. The perils of the road, the support of companions, the contemplative slower pace of life, have the potential to transform and renew the pilgrims in ways that last a lifetime. Along the way, the distinctions between rich and poor fall away, and everyone shares humble food and stops for the night in hostels or under the stars. After a long walk, the experience of entering through the great doors into the vast cathedral filled with incense, light, and song is a foretaste of heaven.

### CHARITABLE GIVING OPTIONS

As you discern whether or how much to contribute to the Fix-It Campaign, please consider the tax advantaged methods, under existing tax law, for making charitable contributions with appreciated property or through your Individual Retirement Account (IRA) highlighted below. ### **LONG-TERM CAPITAL GAIN PROPERTY**

You can usually deduct the full fair market value of appreciated long-term assets you've held for more than one year, such as stocks, bonds, real estate, or mutual funds. For example, the full fair market value of publicly traded securities is the average of the high-low price on the date of transfer. What's more, there's no capital gains tax.

A wrinkle here is that the deduction is limited to 30% of your adjusted gross income (AGI) instead of the usual 60% limit for donations of cash and short-term property made to public charities - though you can still carry forward unused deductions for five years.

If you choose to deduct your cost basis only, you can raise the limit to 60% of your AGI. But if you're holding securities with a loss, it's better to sell first, take the capital loss for tax purposes, and then donate the cash. Keep in mind, in most cases, donating appreciated securities can be a cost-effective way to benefit the Fix-It Campaign.

### **TAX BREAK FOR IRA OWNERS**

An IRA owner who is age 70.5 or over can directly transfer, tax-free, up to \$100,000 per year to an eligible charitable organization. Eligible IRA owners can take advantage of this provision regardless of whether they itemize their deductions. Distributions from employer-sponsored retirement plans, including SIMPLE IRAs and simplified employee pension (SEP) plans, are not eligible.

To qualify, the funds must be contributed directly by the IRA trustee to St. Francis de Sales Parish. These amounts are not taxable and no deduction is available for the amount given to the charity.

Transferred amounts are counted in determining whether the owner has met the IRA's required minimum distribution rules.

### 17TH PLEDGE UPDATE AND REPAIRS COMPLETED

Sunday, July 29, 2018 17th Sunday in Ordinary Time

Dear Parishioners.

As a reminder of what has been accomplished since May 2017, the parking lots, paved areas, curbs, and sidewalks of the St. Francis de Sales Campus—including our Church and School—have now been completed. The new siding on the Ministry Center roof has also been installed. Repairs have been made to the Chapel roof on the Church, which began to seriously leak along the south wall of the Chapel during the spring and summer rainstorms. In addition to the Chapel roof, the slanted roof above the back sacristy and Music Room has been fixed. It had been leaking for a number of years. The next initiative has begun. On May 15, the installation of the new heating and air conditioning system for the Ministry Center, now scheduled to be completed in July.

As pledges are made and paid, we will continue to address the remaining projects, which can be found on our parish website. See what this good parish has accomplished already in total pledges and number of donors! At this point in the Campaign, 812 donors helped us reach \$1,272,899 in total pledges. Total pledges paid are \$1,174,967. Balance due is \$97,937. It is not the intention of the Fix-It Campaign to place the parish in debt. As a parish, we spent 9 years paying off the \$3.8 million debt. We will only address the projects as we raise the funds to pay for them. As Thomas Jefferson advised, "Never spend your money before you have it!" My Grandmother Ryan said the same message in her own way!

Thank you to those who have already responded with a pledge toward the \$1.7 million goal. St. Francis de Sales has a long history of generous giving. I respectfully ask for the prayers, involvement, and sacrifice of many, if not all, in the parish in making a pledge towards the Fix-It Campaign in addition to the generosity you provide each Sunday offering. For example, if 1,000 parishioners pledge the suggested amount of \$850 per year for 2 years, we will reach our campaign goal immediately to conclude the projects. Please, everyone, participate through a prayer and a pledge. All the funds we raise in the Fix-It Campaign stay within the parish.

I want to express my gratitude to Deacon John Sfire, Jason Sfire, and Amie Paige of The Fidelity Group for doing an extensive study of our parish campus, as was presented in the Fix-It Campaign presentation. I have asked the Fidelity Group, under the leadership of Deacon John Sfire and Jason Sfire, to serve as Project Managers of the Fix-It Campaign. I also want to offer my appreciation for the guidance and involvement of Tom Purtell, Chair of the Parish Pastoral Council (PPC), Marty Bush, Member of the PPC; Mike Carlino, Chair of the Parish Finance Council; Doug Samz, Member of the Parish Finance Council; Christine DePrez, Cornerstone Bank Liaison; Laura Angelini, Business Manager; and Pam Lynch, Director of Youth and Young Adult Ministries.

### BECOME A PART OF THE MUSIC MINISTRY!



As the parish choir is taking a well-deserved break and enjoying their summer off, it gives me great pleasure to listen to our "choir in the pews." Singing the hymns, psalms, and acclamations is our way of actively participating in the Liturgy. The Church calls us to "full, conscious, and active

participation." As we sing and pray together, it strengthens our faith. I encourage you to sing out "loud and clear" so that we all praise and give glory to God as a community.



Ryan, attended the Archdiocesan Pastoral Youth Council dinner and Mass at Our Lady of Mother of the Church Polish Mission in

Willow Springs with Bishop John Manz.

These families are also involved and engaged in our parish in various ministries. They are Lectors, Eucharistic Ministers, Catechists, PTO members, Great Bible Adventure participants, Intentional Discipleship Series participants, Parish School Board members, Parish Council members, and Life Teen Youth Ministry members.

Three years ago, we signed up our daughter, Natalia, to attend the SPRED Ministry in our parish in preparation for her First Communion. She was 8 years old. At SPRED, Natalia found a welcoming place. A place where she was always received with a smile, even on those days when she was tired, upset or just plain "I rather stay home." Slowly and patiently, Natalia's catechist became her friend.

With much understanding and love Ms. Cathy was able to help Natalia make a smooth transition from Mom/Home to Friend/SPRED on Wednesday nights. In time, Natalia was able to get used to her new Wednesday evening routine and to enjoy her time away from home with "SPRED friends" and other children her age. SPRED became a place where she could share not only things about her daily life but also things about our Catholic faith. The day of her First Communion having her SPRED friends there along with her family made the day even more special for her. To our surprise, the year after her First Communion, Natalia still wanted to go to SPRED. SPRED had become a special time of the week for her. She loves her time in the holy room and has come to respect what is said and what happens in it. She has mentioned how wonderful it feels to be silent and listen while in the Holy Room. At times while at home, she sings, sways, and holds hands just like they do in the Holy Room. Another highlight of SPRED for her is "agape" time, when they all sit together and share a meal, much like when we have a meal together at home. She prepares for it mentally and physically by doing things such as picking out what outfit to wear, looking for the pictures she needs to bring in, and reminding us that she won't be around for dinner because she will be at SPRED that week. She also likes to contribute by bringing things to share. She prays for SPRED friends and she tells others, family and friends, about the things that happen at SPRED. When Tuesday evening comes, she always asks "Mom, did Cathy call yet?", wondering whether or not her Catechist has called to confirm that there will be a session the next day.
