

### **OBSTACLES**

The prophet Ezekiel, Saint Paul, and the Lord Jesus share something in common in today's scripture readings. They all experience obstacles to their ministry. Ezekiel is summoned to prophesy to the Israelites, who are "[h]ard of face and obstinate of heart" (Ezekiel 2:4). Saint Paul recounts how he has been given a "thorn in the flesh" (2 Corinthians 12:7). The Lord Jesus is unable to perform many signs in his native place. The Gospel tells us that "[he] was amazed at their lack of faith" (Mark 6:6). We too sometimes encounter obstacles as we travel along the journey of faith. So often we experience weakness on this journey. Let the words of the Lord to Saint Paul encourage us today: "My grace is sufficient for you, for power is made perfect in weakness" (2 Corinthians 12:9).

#### TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

Last week's Treasure mentioned the "Nuns of the Battlefield," religious sisters from several communities who served as nurses in the Civil War. Florence Nightingale had only instituted female nurses a decade before in the Crimean War, so the idea of women tending to wounded soldiers was extraordinary. The medical and sanitary conditions on the battlefields were appalling, and the sisters were nearly all teachers. Few had any medical training beyond what they had learned as youngsters in the family. Anti-Catholic prejudice was so deeply entrenched in America that sisters could not wear their habits in public. These sisters were the first, and people on both the Union and Confederate sides soon began to marvel at their bravery, efficiency, and respect for Protestant soldiers. More than 600 sisters from twenty-one communities went to war, serving in wretched conditions. They were tough and single-minded, efficient and fearless.

After the war, sisters could appear in public everywhere in the reunited nation, and often received the praise and gratitude of grateful soldiers and family members on behalf of their sister nurses. An outdoor monument to the "Nuns of the Battlefield" stands in Washington at M Street and Rhode Island Avenue. The inscription reads: "They comforted the dying, nursed the wounded, carried hope to the imprisoned, gave in His name a drink of water to the thirsty."

### 16TH PLEDGE UPDATE AND REPAIRS COMPLETED

Sunday, July 1, 2018 13th Sunday in Ordinary Time

Dear Parishioners.

As a reminder of what has been accomplished since May 2017, the parking lots, paved areas, curbs, and sidewalks of the St. Francis de Sales Campus—including our Church and School—have now been completed. The new siding on the Ministry Center roof has also been installed. Repairs have been made to the Chapel roof on the Church, which began to seriously leak along the south wall of the Chapel during the spring and summer rainstorms. In addition to the Chapel roof, the slanted roof above the back sacristy and Music Room has been fixed. It had been leaking for a number of years. The next initiative has begun. On May 15, the installation of the new heating and air conditioning system for the Ministry Center, now scheduled to be completed in July.

As pledges are made and paid, we will continue to address the remaining projects, which can be found on our parish website. See what this good parish has accomplished already in total pledges and number of donors! At this point in the Campaign, 804 donors helped us reach \$1,261,678 in total pledges. Total pledges paid are \$1,136,412. Balance due is \$125,265. It is not the intention of the Fix-It Campaign to place the parish in debt. As a parish, we spent 9 years paying off the \$3.8 million debt. We will only address the projects as we raise the funds to pay for them. As Thomas Jefferson advised, "Never spend your money before you have it!" My Grandmother Ryan said the same message in her own way!

Thank you to those who have already responded with a pledge toward the \$1.7 million goal. St. Francis de Sales has a long history of generous giving. I respectfully ask for the prayers, involvement, and sacrifice of many, if not all, in the parish in making a pledge towards the Fix-It Campaign in addition to the generosity you provide each Sunday offering. For example, if 1,000 parishioners pledge the suggested amount of \$850 per year for 2 years, we will reach our campaign goal immediately to conclude the projects. Please, everyone, participate through a prayer and a pledge. All the funds we raise in the Fix-It Campaign stay within the parish.

I want to express my gratitude to Deacon John Sfire, Jason Sfire, and Amie Paige of The Fidelity Group for doing an extensive study of our parish campus, as was presented in the Fix-It Campaign presentation. I have asked the Fidelity Group, under the leadership of Deacon John Sfire and Jason Sfire, to serve as Project Managers of the Fix-It Campaign. I also want to offer my appreciation for the guidance and involvement of Tom Purtell, Chair of the Parish Pastoral Council (PPC), Marty Bush, Member of the PPC; Mike Carlino, Chair of the Parish Finance Council; Doug Samz, Member of the Parish Finance Council; Christine DePrez, Cornerstone Bank Liaison; Laura Angelini, Business Manager; and Pam Lynch, Director of Youth and Young Adult Ministries.

### **THEOLOGY 101**

## HOW TO LEARN ABOUT SPIRITUALITY AND THE LIFE OF FAITH

All of us learned the most important truths and skills for life from other people, above all, our parents and siblings and trusted mentors and teachers. And they didn't so much teach us as embody in their very lives the right ways of communicating, working, loving, and caring. We saw them in action, and that forever changed us.

The same is true for the way we journey to God as Jesus' disciples in the Holy Spirit, in other words, for our spirituality or life of faith. As helpful as catechetical and theological books are for giving us clear ideas about God and faith, we can only embrace what those books talk about by coming in contact with genuine people of faith. They offer us witness. They support us and enable us on our own journey of faith and spirituality.

Besides those living witnesses—for example, parents, grandparents, the Church's ministers, religious women and men—we also have an extraordinary resource in our tradition. We belong to the Communion of Saints. Outstanding men and women have gone before us and continue to lead, guide, and direct others who are still on their pilgrim way. You may want to consider how these holy ones can help you learn more about your own journey to God.

When I taught spirituality at Mundelein Seminary, I wanted my students to have some sense of the breadth and depth of the Christian experience as it has been lived out over two thousand years. To enable them to have that sense, I taught a course entitled *Spirituality by way of Autobiography*. Together, we read and reflected on five classic spiritual autobiographies of our Catholic Christian tradition. The autobiographies spanned two millennia, different historical and cultural settings, and the experiences of both men and women. These were very different people in very different settings, yet all of them shared a common journey of discipleship and spiritual growth.

We read the autobiographies in reverse historical order. It's easier to begin with a more familiar time and place. So, the first autobiography was *The Seven Storey Mountain* by Thomas Merton, a twentieth-century convert to Catholicism and a Trappist monk, who captures contemporary spiritual struggles and yearnings so well. That was followed by *The Story of a Soul* by Saint Thérèse of Lisieux, a nineteenth-century French Carmelite nun, who opened entirely

new spiritual horizons for ordinary people with her spirituality of the Little Way. Then, we studied Saint Teresa of Avila and *The Book of Her Life* that chronicled the extraordinary mystical and practical experiences of this sixteenth-century Carmelite nun and reformer. The next writer was the fourteenth-century English anchoress or



hermit, Julian of Norwich, a woman of great hope in the face of the Black Plague that destroyed so much of Europe. She wrote *The Revelations of Divine Love*. Finally, Saint Augustine's *Confessions* rounded out our study of spiritual autobiographies. This fourth and fifth century Father of the Church commands special

attention for his story of searching for God and his dramatic conversion. "Our hearts are restless, until they rest in you," he wrote with a wisdom that captures a basic direction in all the autobiographies and our own lives.

These autobiographies are classics of the Catholic spiritual tradition. Precisely as classics, they

demonstrate an enduring reliability. If you want to know better or more deeply what it is like to live the mystery of Jesus Christ, they can point the way. There are many inspirational books published every year. Some of them are quite good, others perhaps less so. Proven resources from our tradition ought to be a first choice for those who want to learn more and deepen their sense of what it means to live out our faith.

I remember students telling me that with the exception of Thomas Merton who was American and twentieth-century, the other writers seemed "different" and sometimes difficult to follow. Exactly so, I told them, and that was a good thing. These witnesses to faith draw us beyond ourselves and our often narrow experiences and help us to see the myriad ways that the Mystery of God draws all of us forward, each uniquely in our own circumstances, culture and historical moment. We can truly learn the ways of God from them.

Father Louis J. Cameli, S.T.D., received his doctorate in theology in 1975 from the Gregorian University in Rome. He is the author of numerous books and articles. Father Cameli is the Cardinal's Delegate for Christian Formation and Mission in the Archdiocese of Chicago.
