

#### TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

In 1794, a young Irishwoman befriended two widows aboard ship while emigrating to America. They bought a house in Philadelphia and began to live a community life under the direction of a priest. Soon they relocated to Washington. There, the "pious ladies," as the neighbors called them, were asked by their priest friend, by then the president of Georgetown University, to begin a religious community. In 1799 they established a branch of the Visitation Order founded by Saint Jane de Chantal and Saint Francis de Sales in the 1620s.

This order followed a sensible routine, less arduous and more flexible than most traditions, and also accepted widows and older women. This American outpost of the Visitation began without reference to the "rule" of the Order. Most of the European convents had been lost under the "reign of terror," and the rules and customs of the community could not be obtained. A copy of the rule was discovered in 1812, and in 1816 the pope officially established the monastery. From the beginning, the Georgetown nuns had an educational mission, even though they discovered in the "rule" that such work was officially off-limits for the contemplative life. In America, the nuns depended on a school for their livelihood, so the rule was adapted. Today, the Academy of the Visitation is a thriving example of excellence in Catholic education, and the adjacent monastery is the oldest monastic foundation in the original thirteen United States.

## THEOLOGY 101

# 'It's all the same God. Right, Father?'

There is an amazing assortment of religions and Christian denominations in the United States. Occasionally, when people are confronted by that pluralism, they say to me, "Well, Father, it's all the same God. Isn't it?" Usually, these are quick encounters in some social setting, for example, a wedding. I can't (and shouldn't) launch into a theology lecture. The best I can do is to say something to the effect, "In a general way, we are—as we believe—all heading home to the same God. But there are some really distinct and different ways that people understand God. In that sense, it's not all the same God." So much for my best efforts that probably don't register very clearly for my listeners.

When people use the word "God," they can mean very different realities. It stretches from a Deist understanding of God who, like a clockmaker, gets the world going and walks away to a highly involved God who turns out to be the many gods of Hinduism. The range is wide when it comes to naming and understanding God.

The Catholic Christian tradition knows God as revealed by Jesus Christ and as worshipped in the Church. In that tradition, we know and experience God in a distinct way. It's not possible to fully describe how we know and experience God, but perhaps we can identify a few important elements. As I do so, notice that I will name a series of contrasts. We know *something* about God, but we never fully *grasp* God. The best way to express that partial but important knowledge about God is through contrasts.

God, for example, is transcendent mystery. In other words, God is beyond us in every way. In the prophet Isaiah, God speaks, "For my thoughts are not your thoughts, nor your ways my ways..." (Isaiah 55:8) And yet, God, who is transcendent mystery, is also present to us in a relationship that surpasses the intimacy of a nursing mother and child. (See Isaiah 49:14-16) Saint Augustine addressing God, says, "You are closer to me than I am to myself." And because God is both transcendent and close at hand, we have prayer that reflects both aspects—a prayer that "lifts the mind and heart up to God" and a prayer that is a close and familiar "talking with God."

Here is another contrast. God is the all-powerful creator of heaven and earth. We know of that from the very beginning of the Book of Genesis at the head of the entire Bible. And yet, this creator-God does not intrude in creation but is a subtle, even elusive, presence. The prophet Elijah, for example, didn't find God in the wind, fire, or earthquake

but rather in "a sound of sheer silence." (See 1 Kings 19:11-13) In that contrast, we experience the providential care of God all-powerful who creates and, at the same time, we experience our freedom and the freedom of all creation before this "non-intrusive" God.

We have come to know God as personal, in fact, as tri-personal Father, Son and Holy Spirit. And yet, this personal God is not a person as we ordinarily describe persons with



specific traits and personalities. When Moses asked for God's name, God said to Moses, "I am who I am." (See Exodus 3:13-14) Some have translated this as "I am who I will be." There is no pinning down this personal God with the particulars of human personalities.

Finally, we hold and believe in the "great contrast" in Jesus Christ, who is fully God and fully human. "Whoever has seen me has seen the Father," Jesus says to Philip. (See John 14:9) In him and in the mystery of his death and resurrection, God is revealed as Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. Even more, in the death and resurrection of Jesus we come to know God ultimately as love. "God is love, and those who abide in love abide in God, and God abides in them." (1 John 4:16)

All these contrasts help us to talk about God. But our experience is much richer than stating things about God, we are already immersed in the very mystery of God that we profess. Here is a paraphrase of what we find in the Second Vatican Council's *Pastoral Constitution on the Church in the Modern World* (n. 24): "On the night before he died, when the Lord Jesus prayed 'That they may all be one, as we are one,' he opened up vistas closed to human reason and intimated that the union of God's sons and daughters in knowledge and love is already a sharing in the life of the Trinity."

These are some ways that we hold a distinctive understanding and experience of who God is for us. So, is it *all the same God?* For all of us, at the end of our earthly journey we will come before the same God. On that journey, however, we have come to know and experience our God in a distinct way through the grace and gift of revelation in Jesus Christ. And we hope and pray that all people would share that knowledge and experience with us.

With much understanding and love Ms. Cathy was able to help Natalia make a smooth transition from Mom/Home to Friend/SPRED on Wednesday nights. In time, Natalia was able to get used to her new Wednesday evening routine and to enjoy her time away from home with "SPRED friends" and other children her age. SPRED became a place where she could share not only things about her daily life but also things about our Catholic faith. The day of her First Communion having her SPRED friends there along with her family made the day even more special for her. To our surprise, the year after her First Communion, Natalia still wanted to go to SPRED. SPRED had become a special time of the week for her. She loves her time in the holy room and has come to respect what is said and what happens in it. She has mentioned how wonderful it feels to be silent and listen while in the Holy Room. At times while at home, she sings, sways, and holds hands just like they do in the Holy Room. Another highlight of SPRED for her is "agape" time, when they all sit together and share a meal, much like when we have a meal together at home. She prepares for it mentally and physically by doing things such as picking out what outfit to wear, looking for the pictures she needs to bring in, and reminding us that she won't be around for dinner because she will be at SPRED that week. She also likes to contribute by bringing things to share. She prays for SPRED friends and she tells others, family and friends, about the things that happen at SPRED. When Tuesday evening comes, she always asks "Mom, did Cathy call yet?", wondering whether or not her Catechist has called to confirm that there will be a session the next day.
