

## THEOLOGY 101: WHAT IS FAITH?

Pope Benedict XVI has declared a Year of Faith. It began on October 11, 2012, and it will conclude on the feast of Christ the King at the end of November, 2013. The Year of Faith coincides with the fiftieth anniversary of the opening of the Second Vatican Council and the twentieth anniversary of the publication of the *Catechism of the Catholic Church*.

The Year of Faith opens up many good possibilities for all of us. We have an opportunity to revisit the renewal that the Second Vatican Council began. We can take stock of what has happened across these past fifty years and what still needs to happen, so that the Church can have a stronger, clearer, and more convincing voice in serving a world so much in need of its savior, Jesus Christ. We can reacquaint ourselves with the *Catechism*, a truly indispensable resource for all believers. Finally, the Year of Faith gives us a chance to grasp more deeply and securely the very reality of faith itself. And that, indeed, is a very real challenge. Let me explain.

A genuine understanding of faith eludes the grasp of many people. For example, many people consider faith to be just the acceptance of doctrines which are more or less comprehensible. Other people think of faith as just a set of external religious practices that may or may not correspond to something belonging to the heart. Finally, for many people faith really just amounts to a moral code, a series of do's and don'ts.

There is some truth in each of these takes on faith, but faith cannot be reduced to any one of these three dimensions. Doctrines or statements of faith are very important. The Creed which we profess at Mass, for example, summarizes *what we believe* and how we understand that God has acted in this world in his Son, Jesus Christ and continues to act in the power of the Holy Spirit. Religious practices are also important, because they give some *external expression* to the interior life of faith. Moral directions also belong to faith, because faith shapes life, *how we are to live*. There is, however, more to the story of faith.

I have been studying ways to refine and deepen our understanding of faith in light of the experience of three holy women of our tradition: Saint Teresa of Avila, Saint Therese of Lisieux, and Mother Teresa of Calcutta. They have enlightened me and drawn me to a fuller and true sense of faith. In a summary way, let me share with you what I have learned.

Saint Teresa of Avila would certainly have professed her faith and upheld the doctrines proposed by the Church. Still, for her, those doctrines led beyond themselves to the very realities that they described and, particularly, the mystery and person of Jesus Christ. For her, faith drew her into relationship with the Triune God. She was of one mind with Saint Thomas Aquinas who wrote: "The act of faith does not end in a proposition but in the very reality being proposed," in other words, faith leads us to relationship with God.

Saint Therese of Lisieux certainly dedicated herself to various religious practices. At the end of her life, however, the positive feelings attached to her devotions fell away. The devotions and feelings that had earlier mediated her faith gave way to a more direct relationship with Jesus in total surrender, an absolute and total act of trust. In fact, a dark cloud enveloped her life of faith at the end, but in the darkness and at the end she cried out, "Jesus I love you." Faith led her to a fully surrendered relationship with the Lord.

Mother Teresa of Calcutta captured and continues to capture the attention and admiration of many people today. Here is an extraordinary story of faith in action. She takes the two great commandments—love of God and love of neighbor, the sum and totality of the law—and in an integrated and simple way brings them together in a life of practical mercy and compassion. Beyond a kind of nit-picking moralizing, she distills the essence of a faith-filled moral life in a simple and direct way. It centers on her loving relationship with the Lord and with others, especially the poor.

Faith, in the end, is a matter of a simple and singular relationship with the Lord who summons us into new life. So, how then—practically speaking—do we embrace this vibrant and personal sense of faith? For me and for you, this is not something to be learned in a book or in theory. The men and women of genuine faith who have walked ahead of us, people like St. Teresa, St. Therese, and Mother Teresa, show us the way of faith and real possibilities for living it today. If we stay with them, listen to them, and watch them, we will learn the way of true faith. As Catholics we hold a great treasure for our spiritual formation in the saints God has given us in the Church. And so, we must be grateful and use this great gift to grow in faith.

### 19TH PLEDGE UPDATE AND REPAIRS COMPLETED

Sunday, September 16, 2018

Dear Parishioners,

As a reminder of what has been accomplished since May 2017, the parking lots, paved areas, curbs, and sidewalks of the St. Francis de Sales Campus—including our Church and School—have now been completed. The new siding on the Ministry Center roof has also been installed. Repairs have been made to the Chapel roof on the Church, which began to seriously leak along the south wall of the Chapel during the spring and summer rainstorms. In addition to the Chapel roof, the slanted roof above the back sacristy and Music Room has been fixed. It had been leaking for a number of years. **The installation of the new heating and air conditioning system for the Ministry Center is almost completed, and the next initiative has begun. On Tuesday, August 21, workers began the demolition of the building that housed the original St. Francis de Sales Church. Not only was this building the first St. Francis de Sales church, but it also housed the first Ela Township Library in the basement. When the church was decommissioned, it became a lunchroom for the parish school and then a storage facility.**

**As pledges are made and paid, we will continue to address the remaining projects, which can be found on our parish website. See what this good parish has accomplished already in total pledges and number of donors! At this point in the Campaign, 818 donors helped us reach \$1,286,835 in total pledges. Total pledges paid are \$1,209,175. Balance due is \$77,662. It is not the intention of the Fix-It Campaign to place the parish in debt. As a parish, we spent 9 years paying off the \$3.8 million debt. We will only address the projects as we raise the funds to pay for them.** As Thomas Jefferson advised, "Never spend your money before you have it!" My Grandmother Ryan said the same message in her own way!

Thank you to those who have already responded with a pledge toward the \$1.7 million goal. St. Francis de Sales has a long history of generous giving. I respectfully ask for the prayers, involvement, and sacrifice of many, if not all, in the parish in making a pledge towards the Fix-It Campaign in addition to the generosity you provide each Sunday offering. **For example, if 1,000 parishioners pledge the suggested amount of \$850 per year for 2 years, we will reach our campaign goal immediately to conclude the projects.** Please, everyone, participate through a prayer and a pledge. All the funds we raise in the Fix-It Campaign stay within the parish.

I want to express my gratitude to Deacon John Sfire, Jason Sfire, and Amie Paige of The Fidelity Group for doing an extensive study of our parish campus, as was presented in the Fix-It Campaign presentation. I have asked the Fidelity Group, under the leadership of Deacon John Sfire and Jason Sfire, to serve as Project Managers of the Fix-It Campaign. I also want to offer my appreciation for the guidance and involvement of Tom Purtell, Chair of the Parish Pastoral Council (PPC), Marty Bush, Member of the PPC; Mike Carlino, Chair of the Parish Finance Council; Doug Samz, Member of the Parish Finance Council; Christine DePrez, Cornerstone Bank Liaison; Laura Angelini, Business Manager; and Pam Lynch, Director of Youth and Young Adult Ministries.

### CHARITABLE GIVING OPTIONS

As you discern whether or how much to contribute to the Fix-It Campaign, please consider the tax advantaged methods, under existing tax law, for making charitable contributions with appreciated property or through your Individual Retirement Account (IRA) highlighted below. #### **LONG-TERM CAPITAL GAIN PROPERTY**

You can usually deduct the full fair market value of appreciated long-term assets you've held for more than one year, such as stocks, bonds, real estate, or mutual funds. For example, the full fair market value of publicly traded securities is the average of the high-low price on the date of transfer. What's more, there's no capital gains tax.

A wrinkle here is that the deduction is limited to 30% of your adjusted gross income (AGI) instead of the usual 60% limit for donations of cash and short-term property made to public charities - though you can still carry forward unused deductions for five years.

If you choose to deduct your cost basis only, you can raise the limit to 60% of your AGI. But if you're holding securities with a loss, it's better to sell first, take the capital loss for tax purposes, and then donate the cash. Keep in mind, in most cases, donating appreciated securities can be a cost-effective way to benefit the Fix-It Campaign.

#### **TAX BREAK FOR IRA OWNERS**

An IRA owner who is age 70.5 or over can directly transfer, tax-free, up to \$100,000 per year to an eligible charitable organization. Eligible IRA owners can take advantage of this provision regardless of whether they itemize their deductions. Distributions from employer-sponsored retirement plans, including SIMPLE IRAs and simplified employee pension (SEP) plans, are not eligible.

To qualify, the funds must be contributed directly by the IRA trustee to St. Francis de Sales Parish. These amounts are not taxable and no deduction is available for the amount given to the charity.

Transferred amounts are counted in determining whether the owner has met the IRA's required minimum distribution rules.

## INTENTIONAL DISCIPLESHIP WORKSHOP

Disciple: Those who accept Jesus' message to follow Him.

Intentional Disciples: Following Jesus (purposeful and deliberate)

### **Sherry Weddell's Forming Intentional Disciples**

Statistics from the PEW Research Center ([www.siena.org](http://www.siena.org), pg. 4):

For every 100 people who identify as Catholic:

- 51 never show up
- 45 go to Mass once a month
- 4 are the core, committed people who make church activities happen

Other Statistics:

- Only 30% of people who were raised Catholic are still practicing (p. 24).
- The fastest growing demographic is currently the un-affiliated/"NONE" (p. 19).
- Of the people who left to go to another church—the majority said their spiritual needs were not being met and they found a religion they liked more (p. 28).
- Of the people who left to become a NONE—the majority said they "just drifted away" and "stopped believing in the religion's teachings" (p. 32).

### **The key—and it's all about Relationship with Jesus**

The thresholds of Conversion:

- Trust—A person is able to trust or has a positive association with Jesus, the Church, or a Christian believer.
- Curiosity—A person is intrigued by or desires to know more about Jesus, His life, His teachings, or some aspect of the Christian faith.
- Openness—A person acknowledges to himself or herself and to God that they are open to the possibility of a personal and spiritual change.
- Seeking—The person moves from being passive to an active seeking to know God.
- Intentional Discipleship (following Jesus)—This is the decision to "drop your nets" to commit to follow Jesus as an obedient disciple.

As the Catechism and Matthew 28:19-20 states: "The Church by her very nature is missionary, sent by Christ to all the nations to make disciples of them." (CCC 767, Mt 28:19-20)

Our goal/the Church's goal is to follow Jesus' call and help others follow Jesus' call.

### **Keith Strohm**

Keith also facilitated the Archdiocese Intentional Discipleship day with Sherry. He is the former Director of the Office for the New Evangelization and a deacon for the Archdiocese of Chicago.

He has identified 3 steps in this process:

- Making—make disciples—help people encounter Jesus and say yes.
- Maturing—grow and deepen their relationship—once you get it, you long to know Jesus more.
  - Sacraments are seen in a new way.
  - Living a moral life is not imposed, is a choice, a response.
- Missioning—go out and share with others.

When you are a disciple, when you choose to follow Jesus—You long to know Jesus more...

Keith has observed that somewhere along the way Catholic people seem to hesitate to talk about Jesus. Keith reminded us that when a parish embraces this new intention and new focus there usually needs to be a change in the way we lead and run our ministries. A paradigm change is needed...

- From institutional faith to an intentional faith
- From a culture of engagement to a culture of encounter
- From mainstream to missionary mindset
- From programs to people
- From avoidance to accountability

Keith reminded us that focusing on Intentional Discipleship and focusing on helping guide people to develop their own personal relationship with Jesus is in line with Cardinal Blase Cupich's vision for **Renew My Church**:

- We bring people to Christ.
- We support each other in knowing Christ more deeply.
- We encounter Christ and receive nourishment through prayer and worship.
- We build bonds among each other to sustain our life in Christ.
- We transform the lives of others through service as Christ's missionary disciples.
- We respond to the call to holiness by journeying together with Christ.
- We take responsibility for administration and leadership of the parish as good stewards of the gifts Christ has entrusted to us.

Having a relationship with Jesus is Catholic! Jesus is the head of the Church and we are the body. The laity, makes up 98% of the Body of Christ and it is through us that Jesus does His work in the world.

**Our next steps:** Create a strategy for the parish. Help guide everyone to deepen their relationship with Jesus.

1. Keep those people that we have and engage them.
2. Go out and draw back those who have left.
3. Go out and find the people who have never had a faith.

Digital Church presentation described ways we can use **social media** with our parishes and ministries, but we need to have a plan.

- Who are we speaking to—people
- What do you want to accomplish—objectives
- What is your strategy—
- What tools or technology will help you accomplish this

The Workshop offered many ways to guide our parish:

- Creating a pastoral strategy that concretely creates a path for people to follow Jesus, become mature disciples, and then be quipped as missionary disciples.
- Train and form ministry leaders
- Help people discern their own charisms

The Forming Intentional Disciples Workshop offered participants a reminder that we can't sit back and let more people leave our Church and miss out on having a personal relationship with Jesus, guiding their life.

A relationship with Jesus is not created by osmosis—it is a choice. It's not complicated.


