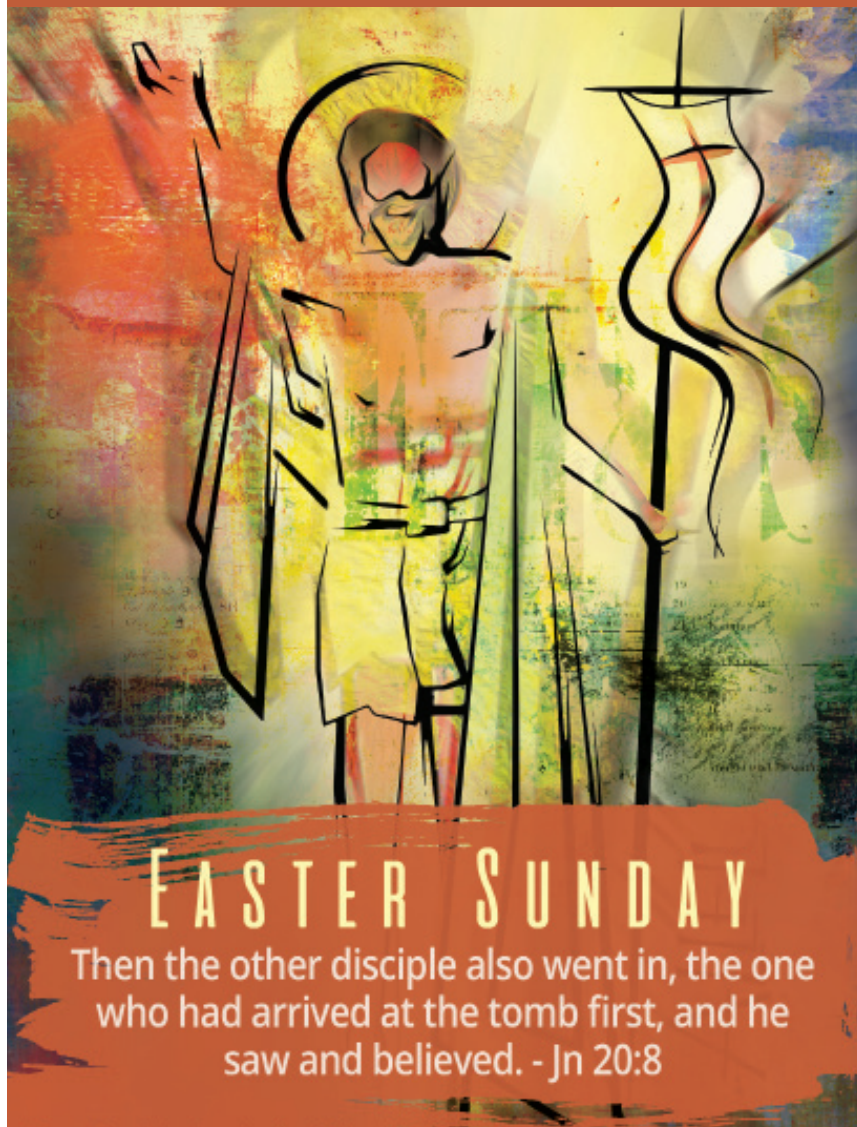

During the first three or four centuries of Christianity, if you asked a Christian to name the feast days of the church, your answer would have been a puzzled stare, for there was only one feast: the Resurrection of the Lord. Every Sunday was a feast celebrating the one great feast. Even though our calendar now has many beautiful and holy feasts, we must continually be called back to the fact that all these other feasts exist because of the feast of Christ's passover from death to life. The psalm today proclaims this message well: "This is the day." It is not one of many days, but it is the day of all days, the one that gives all the others their origin, purpose, meaning, and destiny. Listen carefully to Peter's speech in Acts with its recollection of the Passion, to the words of the apostle Paul, and to the account of Mary Magdalene, John, and Peter finding the empty tomb, and you will hear the many wonderful works that God has done for us through Christ. Rejoice and be glad!

## GOSPEL MEDITATION

### ENCOURAGE DEEPER UNDERSTANDING OF SCRIPTURE

Who are you? This question was most assuredly asked of Jesus on the day of resurrection and it is a question asked of each of us. Our identities can be described in so many ways. We can start with our gifts and our talents, expertise and unique personality expressions. We can describe things we like and things we prefer to set aside. As descriptive and captivating as these can be, none come close to our essence, our real and true self. While accurate in their own right, the self who lives and interacts with the world is the self we want others to see, the one we project. But there is much more to us just as there is much more to Jesus.

Jesus could describe himself based on all of the same criteria we use for ourselves. After all, Jesus is totally human. With all that people witnessed and all that Jesus knew about his physical human self, his divinity also shined forth. There was so much more to know about him. Whereas once Jesus was transfigured on top of a mountain before his disciples' eyes, so today he is transfigured before our eyes as he reveals his resurrected self as the Christ. Alleluia, Christ is risen! His glorified presence



stands before us showing us that we are all much more than we see ourselves to be and show to others. We have a depth, purpose, and essence that go way beyond the superficial treasures of our existence to the very core of who we are.

Within each one of us is a spark of Divine Love where creature and Creator meet, and we are known uniquely by the name God whispers to us. It is not the earthly name that was given to us but the one that flows from Divine Power and claims us as one who is special and chosen in God's eyes. This is

the self that will rise one day with the eternal Christ of God and live eternally as God provides. This is the self that when free from all superficial constraints layered upon it in this life can discover and know freedom in a way never possible before. This is love lifting us up and transforming us into who we really are, not who we want or need ourselves to be. Who are you? A special, unique child of God who has been fashioned in God's image, sustained by the power of God's love and kept eternally with the Blessed Trinity in heaven. Get to know this deeper, truer self as it is who you really are.

## A HAPPY ENDING ISN'T THE WHOLE STORY

"Is there a happy ending?"

When my kids were young, we never made it past the first whiff of any narrative tension before I got this question. As soon as whatever princess or furry woodland animal who was the hero of the story got into any small scrape, they wanted that reassurance, "Is there a happy ending?"

I can't say I blame them. Don't we all feel that way sometimes? We enter into a relationship with someone or some situation, and we just want to protect ourselves. We want to know it's not going to go badly — or, if it does, that we will be able to come back from it. It's a human instinct, a reflex. Our inclination to protect ourselves makes it so that we sometimes want

to press fast-forward on the bad stuff and skip straight ahead to the happily-ever-after.

Easter is the ultimate happy ending. It's the day of miracles. The day when all the stones roll away and all the sins are forgiven. It's the day that puts everything right.

But if we learned anything from this week — from the Passion and death of the Lord — it's that we can't press fast-forward on the hardships of life. That tension, that loss, that fear — it's crucial, isn't it? As Catholics, we are who we are because of Easter. But Easter doesn't happen without Good Friday.

So, does the story of salvation have a happy ending? We know it does. But we also remember that the ending isn't all that matters.

## DO WE NEED TO FAST FOR ONE HOUR BEFORE MASS, OR ONE HOUR BEFORE COMMUNION?

The practice of fasting before receiving the Eucharist is a centuries-old act of devotion that was once very different than it is today.

In the 1917 Code of Canon Law, for example, anyone who wanted to receive the Eucharist had to fast from midnight until the time of communion (even water and medications were forbidden). Over the following decades, the rules for the eucharistic fast were relaxed, first by Pope Pius XII and, later, by Pope Saint Paul VI.

The current Code of Canon Law (1983) states very clearly: "A person who is to receive the Most Holy Eucharist is to abstain for at least one hour before holy communion from any food and drink, except for only water and medicine" (Canon 919, 51). And, in the case of those who

are ill and the elderly, the rules are even more accommodating. "The elderly, the infirm, and those who care for them can receive the Most Holy Eucharist even if they have eaten something within the preceding hour" (Canon 919, 53).

So, if we strictly follow the "letter of the law," the fast is calculated from the time of Holy Communion and not the start of Mass. However, when we remember why we fast — it is a reminder of the deeper hungers of the spirit that our physical thirst or hunger symbolize — we see that the issue is much bigger than simply fulfilling what is called for by Church Law and tradition. Joining fasting to our prayers and reflection before Mass is an opportunity to really

center ourselves and to prepare our minds, hearts, and bodies to welcome the One we receive in the Eucharist.

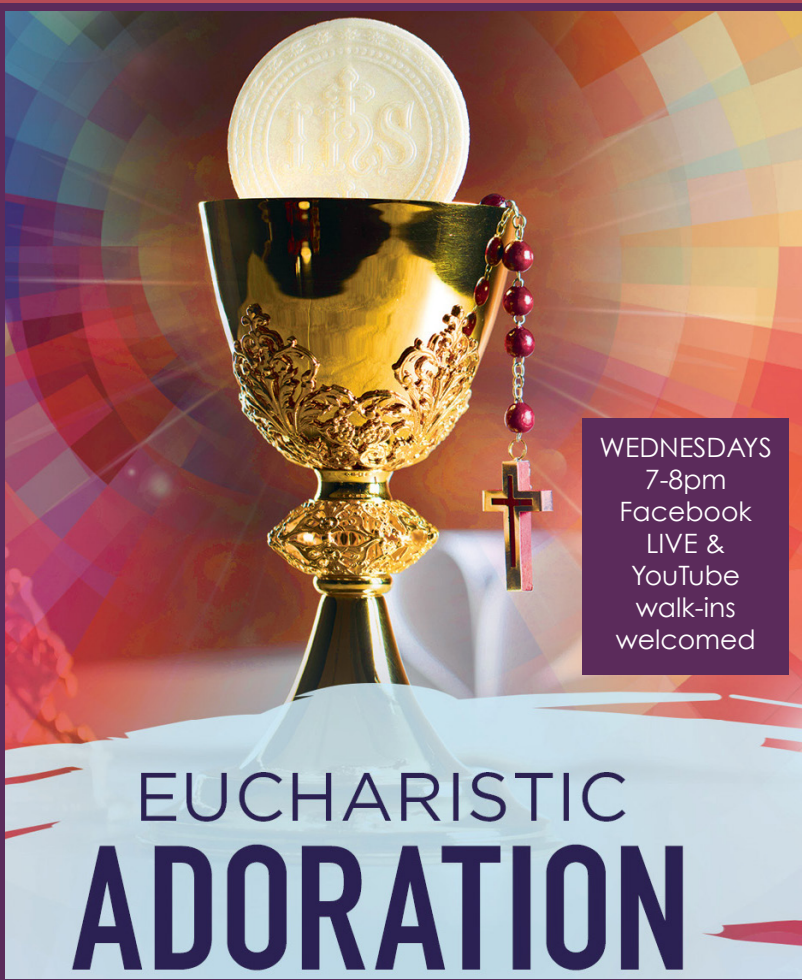

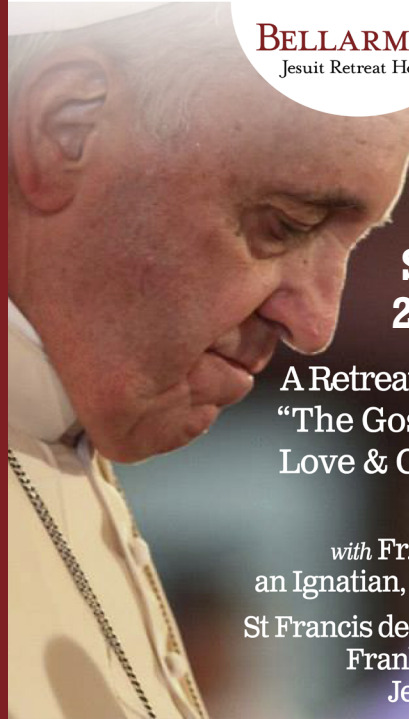

## Remembrance in the Year of the Pandemic

*a speech given by George Stewart*

March 2020 was full of harrowing firsts. The World Health Organization declared Covid 19 a pandemic and the outbreak became a national emergency. The Governor of the State of Illinois issued a Stay at Home order. The Archdiocese of Chicago closed schools and churches. The economy was in steep decline and unemployment numbers increased dramatically. Whether you experienced the virus or not our lives changed and for many it was extremely significant. There was real fear with all that we were facing. We pause to look back and think about what we have been through and to remember those that we have lost along the way no matter what the reason. We thank the Lord in helping us make it through this challenging year. There is hope in this time of fear with the delivery and administration of vaccines and with most people being socially responsible. Churches, schools and the economy have opened with modified social access. The crisis is not over and we have many challenges ahead of us. At St. Francis de Sales, many have come forward to help make the church and school accessible to the students, staff, and the faithful. Through all of this I am speaking today to honor those of the Society of St. Vincent de Paul at St. Francis de Sales Lake Zurich. I am humbled by their continued commitment and their courage during this crisis to feed the hungry, give guidance and financial assistance to those in need. 5000 families that included 7000 children received

231,000 pounds of food and over \$44,000.00 was provided in family assistance this past year. In order to help provide all this the harvesters collected food, volunteers unloaded deliveries from the Northern Illinois Food Bank and others filled 1000's of boxes. Pantry managers ordered food, worked to keep packing tables organized and provided a clean workspace. On Thursday evenings volunteers distributed food boxes, perishables and meat. We continued to provide food for Mt. St. Joseph and Little Sisters of the Poor along with two sharing parishes in Waukegan. Case workers have been meeting with families using the phones. Our Pastor, Father David Ryan provided his vision and he asked you to support us. None of our work could have been done without your overwhelming level of support and that of the larger Lake Zurich community with food, financial donations and prayers. Thank you and a special thanks to Father Ryan. Thanks go to Jerry Perez, Chris Tovar and the Ministry Center Staff for their support and help. The C.E.R.T. provided traffic control many Thursday evenings and we want to thank them. Our work continues, and as Father Ryan told us, it is not the numbers that we produce in service, but the person in front of us that matters the most! Father, please give those Vincentians present a blessing and bless the pins that are on the table for distribution after mass. God bless the good people of this Parish and to you Father. Thank You!
