Dear Father Ryan,

The past two years have been difficult for us. We have all felt worn down. Exactly in these circumstances, the Lord speaks to us. He tells us that He is making all things new, and He invites us to share in that renewal.

So, it is appropriate and timely that we take up this year's Annual Catholic Appeal with the theme: *making all things new... God's promise and our responsibility*. As we embrace God's promise of making all things new, we also hear the call to work with God's plan. But how do we do this?

We pray and live out our daily responsibilities with love and generosity. We serve in the Church and in the world. We also support the Annual Catholic Appeal. When we promote the Appeal, we are a part of *making all things new* in parishes and Catholic schools serving those in need, in programs of religious education and ministry formation to spread our faith, and in initiatives to address justice, peace, and respect for life.

Your leadership as pastor and your willingness to follow well-proven and effective procedures will make the Appeal successful. To date, this year's Appeal has raised over \$14.2 million, which is quite an accomplishment considering our current circumstances. Thank you for your support. It makes all the difference.

As I am sure you know, and may be experiencing yourself, the Covid-19 pandemic continues to have a challenging effect at many of our parishes. Most parishes have experienced a decline in offertory since the start of the pandemic. Each parish's goal for the Annual Catholic Appeal is based on the prior fiscal year's offertory. For the 2022 Annual Catholic Appeal, goals are therefore based on offertory (Sundays, Holy Days, Christmas, and Easter) from Fiscal Year 2021. That fiscal year includes twelve full months of Covid-19 impact. Following normal business practice for Annual Catholic Appeal goal setting that means that most—but not all—parishes will have a lower Annual Catholic Appeal goal this year than last year. Lower average Annual Catholic Appeal goals across the Archdiocese will make it more difficult to meet the needs of our most struggling parishes and schools, but the 2022 goals should reflect the reality of what you are experiencing at your parish.

As we build on our past collaboration, I ask you once again to follow the Appeal process, and whatever modifications may need to be introduced for this year. More specifically, your 2022 goal is 7% of the previous year's offertory income. **For Fiscal Year 2020-2021, your offertory income was \$1,453,132. Therefore, your target for the 2022 Appeal is \$101,719.** As you know, when contributions exceed the goal, St. Francis de Sales will receive a rebate from those donated funds.

Father Ryan, thank you again for your support of the Annual Catholic Appeal, a way for missionary disciples to bring the Lord's hope to the world.

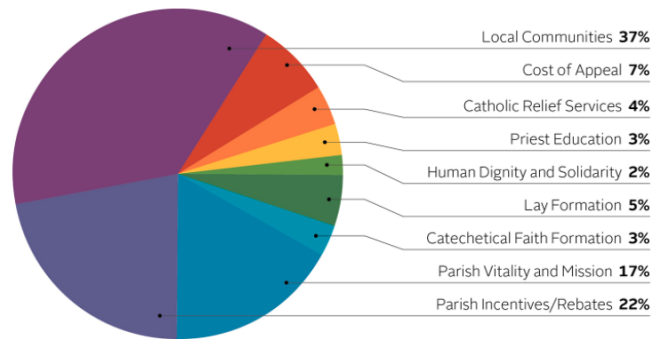

On February 6th, Sarah Richards from St Francis de Sales was awarded the Golden Rose award from the Vicariate One Archdiocese Council of Catholic Women (ACCW), for her service, spirituality and leadership.

Parishes across the vicariate were invited to recognize young women who have gone above and beyond in their service and leadership. Since they didn't hold this event last year, we are also able to recognize Madelyn & Katie Zolnierek and their parents accepted the award for them.

Sarah Richards is a natural leader and not only participates in youth group activities and retreats but encourages others to join too. She is welcoming to all and models the kindness and compassion that Jesus calls us all to share. She cares deeply about her faith and is open to initiating insightful conversations about her faith journey.

Sarah is a leader in our peer ministry program and has volunteered to lead multiple Confirmation Castle retreats. She doesn't hesitate to share where she sees God working in her life and how she sees God working through others. In small group discussions, she is compassionate and creates an environment for sharing and no-judging which is essential for open communication and a meaningful retreat

Recently, Sarah encouraged her peers to join her at Eucharistic Adoration on the evening of her birthday. Seeing groups of teens enter the church to spend time with Jesus was inspiring and impressive.

Sarah has been serving our whole parish by streaming Masses every Sunday. She was invited and trained by our previous tech team members (Madelyn & Katie) before they left for college and since then, she has continued to stream 9am Sunday Mass. Her efforts allow us to stream Mass to those who can not come into the church, which is especially important during this time. She is also training new tech team members. Beside streaming to people at home she ensures that the prayers during Mass are also projected to the screen for

those sitting inside the church. This allows everyone in the church to feel confident in participating, especially those who may have been away from the Mass for a while.

Madelyn and Katie Zolnierek were also honored for their service, spirituality and leadership. Both Madelyn and Katie were invited to join the tech team by the previous team who were heading off to college. We began streaming Mass when the churches were instructed to close in March 2020. At that time our teen tech team helped stream daily noon Mass as well as 9am Mass on Sunday. When these teens left for college Katie & Madelyn jumped in to take over. They not only helped at the 9am Mass on Sunday, but they also volunteered for so many other Masses including Holy Thursday, Stations of the Cross, Good Friday and Easter. They streamed the many 1st Communion and Confirmation Masses held since there was a capacity limit in the church. Thankfully, the grandparents and others who were unable to join the Masses were able to watch through YouTube and Facebook. And then, before they left for college, they brought Sarah into the loft and trained her. During this winter break from college they rejoined Sarah in the loft and it was great seeing them all working together again.

Katie and Madelyn also helped fill the 1000 Lenten bags which included our own Lenten prayer book as well as a candle, Holy Water and other items that people could use to enhance their Lent experience at home. On Ash Wednesday, they helped run bags out to the parking lot to be shared with the hundreds of people who participated in the "covid safe" drive-up Ash distribution.

Madelyn and Katie led our first post-covid Confirmation Castle retreat in June. They shared their faith with high school teens with gentleness, love and compassion. This retreat involved taking our two night event and condensing it into a one (long) day. They were part of the team of peer ministers who were extremely flexible, understanding and willing to help make this important retreat a success. We couldn't have done it without them.

Hello my name is Libby and I am a student at St. Francis de Sales. I'm an 8th grader and this week is Catholic School's Week and I wanted to talk about how special St. Francis de Sales is and what St. Francis de Sales has made me.

When we have each other, we are everything. The people at St. Francis de Sales has made my 12 years of school everything I could have imagined. St Francis has made me the best version of myself. It has given me confidence and knowledge to share and to use. I grew in faith, I made a family, achieved excellence and soon, I'll have to move on

A Catholic School, you would expect to learn about face and of course, the Catholic religion. While at Saint Francis, only are we informed about our religion, we grow in it. And on the way we have grown as a family. I have practically lived with the same people since what, Pre-3? it's been awhile. We became family. Bus rides begin to feel like a family road trip. the picture on the bus, we joke, we laugh, we even sleep sometimes. We are so comfortable with one another but I consider these people I have grown up with more than just friends. We have grown over the years because of one another. Greta Roscoe, in particular, who is one of my closest classmates, helped me grow in my faith. She guided me towards Christ, she lifted me up And honestly is one of the best people I've ever met. this is what you get at Saint Francis. the most well-rounded and kind-hearted people you will ever meet. like words to my classmates was one of my teachers, Mrs. Jeske. My brother had her for homeroom in 7th grade. I was so excited to be in her class. and I'll tell you what, it did not disappoint. I learned about her, our class made jokes with her, We were comfortable with one another. We even threw her a birthday party once. Point being, even if we aren't all in the same "friends groups", we all know and love each other and care for one another even if we don't know it. The connection is greater than our minds can comprehend.

Faith and family is what takes Saint Francis the extra mile. But what all schools have is education. This school achieves excellence in that field too. We are a 2-time Blue Ribbon School! Since we are such a small school, I have had the same 8 people in my class for 6 years. We are one competitive class. But, instead of bringing us down, it lifts us up! And encourages us and it strengthens us. Now, one thing absolutely every kid is not a fan of at St. Francis is the grading scale. But this grading scale pushes us to be our most prepared selves.

The end of the quarter and throughout the whole quarter really, I would stress about my grades. still do. teachers like Mrs. Keller, our principal, Remind me that the exorbitant amount of pressure that I put on myself is it not worth it. These teachers truly care about their students, every single one.

Excellence is shown in another way. Since we are a small school, we are forced out of our comfort zone in different scenarios to meet new people. We are told to care for others that we don't know. We have service projects with Heifer International, and so much more. Students are constantly making fundraisers to help learn about others. Another extracurricular activity is the speech contest. At the moment, learning the speech, having it memorized, performing it, it can all be a bit (more than a bit) stressful. It can be dreaded. But as I head into the speech contest this year, I look back. It has helped me as a speaker, it has helped me with confidence and calmness. Even the things we don't love to do, it is all worth it. A matter of tough love.

I'm in 8th grade, it didn't really hit me until the second quarter ended that I have to move on. The school has made me who I am. I wouldn't be the same without it. I will leave Saint Francis. I will go into High School. it will be different. I am scared. add red leaving and being in the situation of having to make new friends. I realize that Saint Francis has prepared me for just that. I have served as a Catholic, learned as the student. I am ready, no matter how much I want to deny it, for my next step. Having somewhere to go home. Having something to love is family. Having both is a blessing. St Francis is a blessing. My happiness and memories and heart will stay at Saint Francis no matter how many miles I travel. At Carmel, there will be no Christmas Concert for each student to participate. There will be no religion class with Mrs. Nigro or office with Marion, I have to learn to take risks. It will be different. It is a pain to leave, but instead of worrying about leaving, I move into the new mindset of being glad it happened.

In a word, St. Francis has given me confidence, knowledge and people with great hearts and minds. They give me intelligence in guiding me as a Catholic and as a person. This school is so great. I wrote this essay to remind you to always keep that in mind and to appreciate where you are. Don't waste your time at St. Francis, don't complain about school, live it up, because I realize now that it is the best thing that ever happened to me.

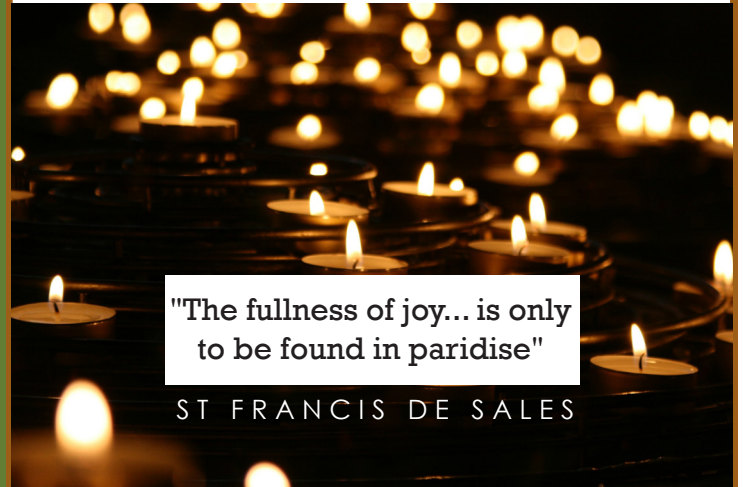

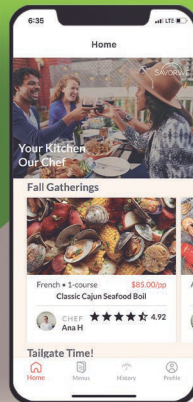
