ONE LORD, ONE FAITH

Do you suppose the authors of the four Gospels were aware of today's first reading from the second book of Kings? Of course they were. The prophet Elisha fed a hundred men with twenty barley loaves in order to prove God's power. This same miracle, now multiplied by more people fed by fewer loaves, is attributed to Jesus in all four Gospels. In today's passage from John we even have the detail that the loaves were barley, reminding every pious Jew of that miracle that Elisha worked. Yet Jesus went into hiding when they wanted to make him king. It is the passage from Paul's Letter to the Ephesians that gives us the reason for this. The power of Jesus comes from God. It is not meant merely to feed us, or to provide one group with a king. There is one Lord, one faith, one God and Father of all who works through Jesus Christ and through us all. *copyright (c) J. S. GOSPEL MEDITATION

ENCOURAGE DEEPER UNDERSTANDING OF SCRIPTURE

St. Oscar Romero said, "We cannot do everything, and there is a sense of liberation in realizing that. This enables us to do something and to do it very well. It may be incomplete, but it is the beginning, a step along the way, an opportunity for the Lord's grace to enter and do the rest."

There were a group of ladies many years ago who made quilts. They were beautiful creations reflecting inspirational designs artfully composed from the simple scraps of fabric each woman would bring to their individual pieces. There was no plan for the finished project as each finished work became the combined creation of what each woman contributed. They abounded in vibrant colors and dazzled the beholder with intricate patterns and their myriad textures. They were so beautiful that they became coveted family treasures passed from generation to generation. Those women never realized the power of their work. Countless babies rested in the comfort of those quilts warmly nestled in the legacy of tradition they were fortunate to inherit. They adorned countless homes with their beauty and brought joy and solace to many faces.

We cannot do everything. We are not meant to. Our work in life is



to contribute our individual piece, a piece that reflects the unique thumbprint I claim as my own. We only have to do small things well. Then, as St. Oscar Romero reminds us, the Lord's grace will enter and do the rest. We have to trust that this is true just as those women trusted in the eventual beauty of their final work.

Eucharistic blessings are blessings that start small and multiply. We all come to life with only a few loaves of bread and a few fish. Not any single one of us has all that it takes to transform our world. Who knows what God will do with the little we have and how many will benefit from our kindness, compassion,

wisdom, courage, conviction, love, warmth, zeal, faith, and hope? That young lad never dreamed that his few leftovers would do all that they did. God shows up in unexpected ways! Where would life's adventure and fun be if it were any other way? Being able to be part of bringing God's creative, transforming, healing to the world opens us up to wonder, awe, and excitement! We can all bring our little piece to the bigger work of God that can result in being a coveted jewel passed generation to generation. This is good news indeed!

Bread and wine transform into Christ's Body and Blood and we become what we eat. Trust that.

"There is a boy here who has five barley loaves and two fish; but what good are these for so many?" Then Jesus took the loaves, gave thanks, and distributed them to those who were reclining, and also as much of the fish as they wanted. - Jn 6:9, 11

IT'S ALL IN THE BASKET

St. Therese of Lisieux made a point of going the extra mile in kindness towards those people who really got under her skin. It was part of her own brand of Everyday Stewardship — thanking God for all His creation, even the parts with which, in her own humanness, she struggled to cope.

I think about this a lot when I challenge myself to give thanks for things that bother me and people who challenge me. When I do this, I envision Christ giving thanks over those insufficient loaves. How many of us would see that paltry little basket and kick a rock in frustration because we can't feed all our people? "You didn't give me enough, Lord! You didn't give me enough patience, enough

money, enough creativity, enough stamina to be a good steward. If you had given me more, I could also give more!"

In those moments of despair, we need to take a good look at the life God has given us. We need to look at the trials and the challenges and the shortcomings. The hopes that didn't pan out, the disappointments that keep cropping up. Somewhere therein lies what we need to be the steward God asks us to be, just as St. Therese's own stewardship was defined by the people she simply couldn't stand.

God does not give us all we want. He does not give us all we ask for. He does us one better: He gives us all we need. It's all in the basket.

WE ARE CONSIDERING HOMESCHOOLING OUR CHILDREN. DOES THIS PRESENT A PROBLEM WHEN IT IS TIME FOR THEM TO RECEIVE THE SACRAMENTS? WHAT MUST WE DO?

Homeschooling is legal in all fifty states and like other types of education, has its advantages and its drawbacks. There are many factors to consider, and each family has to decide what the best way to educate its children is. With religious education, many dioceses have a formal policy that outlines procedures and expectations, some of which include more than just academic information. Call the religious education office to find out what they are for your area.

In general, though, an appointment with your parish priest to discuss your situation is the best first step. An opportunity to discuss what is available, what the expectations are for each sacrament, and how you can best prepare your child helps make your time of preparation more effective. The priest can direct you to good catechetical materials, parent information classes,

and other choices and possibilities for your child. All parents need to be part of their child's religious education, taking a lead in instilling the values and beliefs of their faith.

Communication and information helps us all to teach and preach the Gospel as Jesus did.

From the Finance Committee

SBA PPP LOAN APPROVAL

St. Francis de Sales qualified and applied for two federally funded SBA Payroll Protection Plan (PPP) Loans to help our parish navigate the impact from Covid-19. Bishop Robert Casey, Vicar General of the Archdiocese of Chicago, provided information on the PPP funds which we would like to share with our parishioners. Excerpts from his memorandum are included herein.

Parishes that received PPP funds did so because they met the criteria for the loans as outlined in the CARES Act. The Act required that the loans be used only for payroll and essential expenses such as utility bills. The funds helped to keep our staff in the Ministry Center and the teachers in our school employed during the pandemic and enabled the Church to provide much needed aid and services during this difficult time.

The loan submission process was handled by Cornerstone Bank which resulted in timely processing, approval and quick receipt of loans proceeds which we were grateful for.

1st PPP Loan received: Apr. 15, 2020 for \$513,600.00

2nd PPP Loan received: Feb. 25, 2021 for \$513,607.00

In short, our parish used the funds for which they qualified for the purposes the Act intended – payroll and essential expenses such as utilities.

In a year that has seen a sharp decline in parish revenues when our church building closed, the CARES Act PPP loans allowed our church and school to retain our staff, protected those employees from needing to seek unemployment and other benefits, ensuring that we could continue educating children and providing services and pastoral care to our congregation in this time of extraordinary need.

We are grateful for the support this program provided and also for the help from Cornerstone Bank in the processing of our loan applications.

PPP LOAN FORGIVENESS -- UPDATE JULY 2021

St. Francis de Sales received approval from the SBA (Small Business Administration) and our bank, Cornerstone National Bank, granting full forgiveness of our 1st draw PPP loan in the amount of \$513,600.00. St. Francis de Sales will seek forgiveness of our 2nd draw PPP loan in the same amount as our first submission as we near the end of August, 2021. We are very excited and grateful to be granted this initial forgiveness and remain hopeful that subsequent forgiveness will also be granted for our 2nd draw PPP loan.

Deacon's Corner

This morning when I got up and was reading my emails, I had a story from a friend with whom I exchange emails. The closing lines of the story struck me as something I wanted to share with all of you. It read:

*"the nicest place to be is in someone's thoughts,
the safest place to be is in someone's prayers,
and the very best place to be is...in the hands of God"*

I had told Bobbi as we laid down to sleep last night that I wasn't getting much inspiration for the subject of this week's Deacon's Corner. So before I fell asleep, I asked the Holy Spirit to give me some direction for subject matter and, lo and behold, this appeared in my email in the morning.

So let's break this down into three areas of discussion. First, "the nicest place to be is in someone's thoughts". Jesus told us to "love our neighbor as ourselves" as one of His primary commandments. That is why it is so important to always hold each other, our brothers and sisters, in the highest esteem. Always in a positive and loving place. After all, we should always "do unto others as you would have them do unto you". So when you think about your family, spouse, children, g'children and even strangers, always think GOOD THOUGHTS about them, for I truly believe that whatever we give out will return to us tenfold. For this reason alone, we should always have GOOD THOUGHTS about everyone.

So I urge each and every one of us to place ourselves in the "hands of God" for now and forever going forward and our lives will be happier, healthier and holier than we have ever been.

These three thoughts give us a "road map" for our lives. For I believe that living in today's society, we are always challenged by the evil one who dwells around us all, always trying to "knock us off of our Spiritual Journey" by not abiding in the Word of God. And I know for myself, that the evil one is sometimes successful in doing that simply due to our human nature which God, our Father, fully understands. That is why He has given us the ability to overcome and be forgiven for our transgressions. The important thing for us is to take advantage of the blessings and grace He has bestowed upon us.

So as you go on this day, think about the three thoughts I have put forth in this DC. They are not difficult to understand but might be a challenge to implement in our lives. We all have the ability to make our world a "better place" and with the help and support of Our Lord, we can do it. So let's take advantage of all that God has given us and do our part each day.
