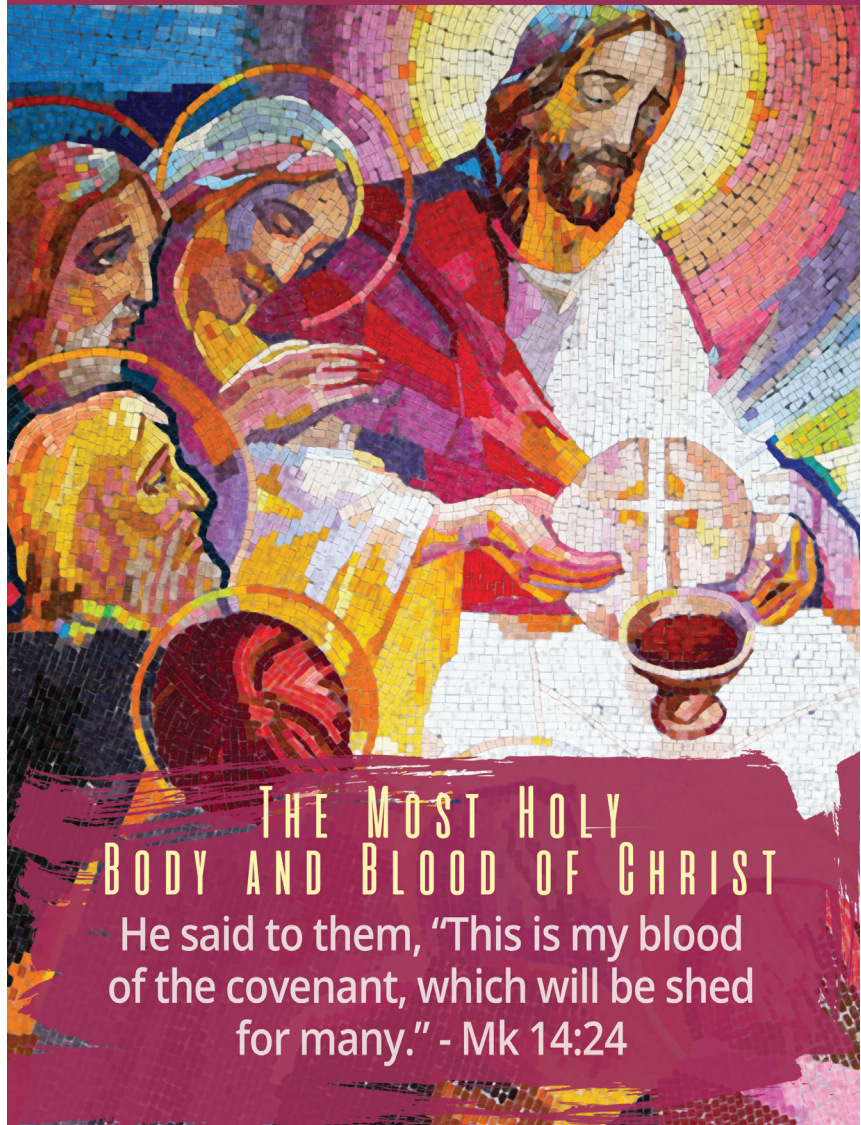

SACRIFICE

Today the Church focuses on the Eucharist. Today's readings remind us how connected to ancient blood sacrifices we are when offering our unbloody sacrifice. The reading from Exodus describes a solemn ritual designed so the Israelites would never forget their covenant with God.

The reading from the Letter to the Hebrews turns us from those ancient animal sacrifices, the first efforts to worship the living God. Our sacrifice is the body and blood of the Son of God. Because of Christ we have a new covenant.

The Gospel from Mark retells the establishment of that covenant, the familiar story of the Last Supper. Juxtaposed with the story of animal sacrifice as it is here, we are challenged to listen with new attention, to remember the great price paid for our salvation. Jesus gave his body and every drop of his blood for us.

GOSPEL MEDITATION

ENCOURAGE DEEPER UNDERSTANDING OF SCRIPTURE

As our world faces so much turmoil and change, it is now more important than ever to remember who God is, who we are and where we are going. It is easy to get distracted and lose focus, especially when we are being pulled in so many directions. We can not only lose sight of God but one another. Maintaining our well developed and mature relationships with God and one another is essential to continuing to live, healthy, happy, and focused lives. In a message to young people, Pope Benedict XVI said, "the happiness you are seeking, the happiness you have a right to enjoy has a name and a face: it is Jesus of Nazareth, hidden in the Eucharist." What is true for those who are younger is even truer for those who are older. Regardless of how the particulars of life change over time, human beings are still hard-wired to seek the fullness of life and happiness. How we embark on this journey and what we choose along the way will indicate whether we meet success.

There is so much brokenness and pain in our world. Many people are lost, feeling lonely, anxious, marginalized, victimized, isolated, oppressed, and abused. Every time we receive the Body of Christ, we have an opportunity to become what we eat. The power and presence of Christ in the Eucharist becomes present in us and effects change in ourselves and in the lives of those we meet. We are given the



grace to become temples of justice and peace, carrying God's sacred Presence within us wherever we go. Our faith community is ignited with the fire of God's love and stands out as a beacon of hope in a world that is lost. This is the only way we can discover peace-filled resolutions to violence and create innovative solutions to what is fueling its need in the first place. True happiness, for the young and old alike, becomes an obtainable goal.

St. John Maria Vianney says it so well. "There is nothing so great as the Eucharist. If God had something more precious, he would have given it to us." Only the Eucharist has the ability to connect, sustain, strengthen, and properly orient us,

not only on the road of this life but the road to life eternal. Knowing this, when life gets challenging, unsettling, and difficult, we can rely on and cling to this gift we have in the Real Presence of Christ. This actual encounter with God celebrates God's unconditional love for us and grounds us to the truth of who we are in a way nothing else is able to do. Because through the Eucharist we really do become the Body of Christ, we are also bonded together in a most perfect way to one another as that Body. Nourished, united, and strengthened by the Eucharist, let us individually and collectively, bring this wonderful gift to all we meet, especially the poor with whom we have a special connection.

WE CAN PREPARE THE UPPER ROOM

We all know that person, don't we? Hey, maybe we've even been that person.

"I have a great relationship with God, but I don't go to church regularly. God and I are on good terms. I can talk to Him just fine on my own."

There isn't anything false in these statements. It's important to have an intimate, even conversational prayer relationship with God. But the problem with this attitude is that it implies that churches don't matter. Community worship doesn't matter. Today, we are reminded exactly why that is so untrue. Why we need our parishes, our priests, and each other.

The Body and Blood of Christ — that's what

it's all about. If it's not about that, it's not about anything. If we don't have the Eucharist, we're just like the ancient priests, making sacrifices that don't have the power to redeem anybody.

Where do we receive the Body and Blood of Christ? For most of us, it's in our parishes. The altar of sacrifice is also the table we gather in front of, as a family, to become one with Christ in the truest and realest way possible, recreating the scene in the Upper Room over and over again every time Mass is celebrated.

The disciples were commissioned by Christ to prepare the Upper Room for the Last Supper. How can we take up that work ourselves? How can we strengthen the bonds in our spiritual family? How can we serve our parish, always remembering that the table is not meant to be set only for two?

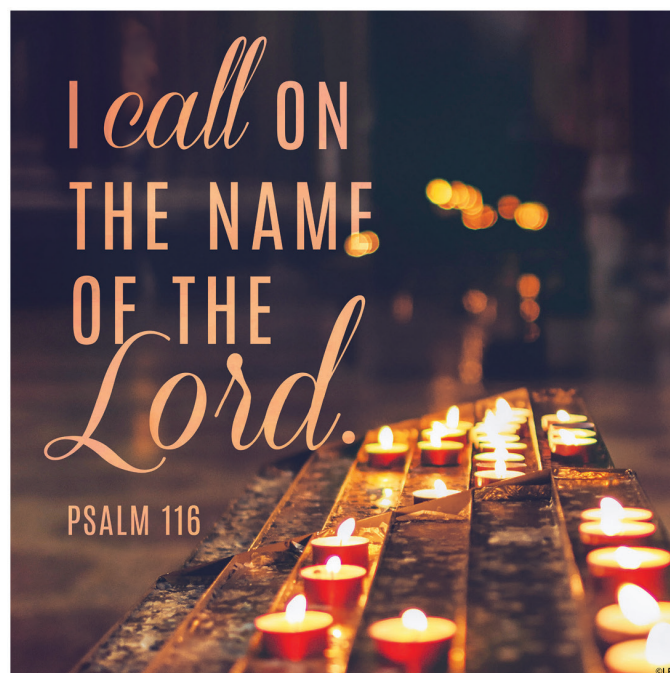

WHY ARE SOME SAINTS HONORED AS "PATRON SAINTS"?

Each person is unique and each of us has different gifts, interests, talents, and, yes, even struggles and areas where we need to grow. This is no less true of those holy women, men, and children who have been canonized or beatified.

Because we believe that the saints and blessed are both models of faith and intercessors, Christians have looked to certain holy people as role models and heavenly protectors for occupations, spiritual charisms, and even places. Although the Church sometimes names a person as a patron saint (e.g. Saint Philip Neri as the patron of Rome, Saint Clare of Assisi as the patroness of television, or Saint Aloysius Gonzaga as the patron of youth and young adults), more often it is popular devotion that inspires lay Christians to turn to a particular saint or blessed for heavenly help and support. This is how, for example, Saint Cecilia came to be honored as the patroness of musicians, Saint Toribio Romo as patron of migrants coming into the United States, and Saint Gertrude of Nivelles

as patroness of cat lovers. Although there are official and unofficial lists of patron saints, we should always feel free to ask any and all the saints to give us their patronage and protection in whatever it is that we need.

Dear Parishioners of Saint Francis de Sales,

It was the week of Thanksgiving last November when I received the unfortunate news that allegations had been made against your pastor, Fr. David Ryan. I was asked if I would accept the assignment as a temporary administrator and I said "Yes," with the hope that there would be a swift and just resolution to these allegations. It has now been 6 months and I have had to face the reality that a resolution is still going to take more time, possibly months. It is humbling for me to admit that I do not have the energy to continue serving as a temporary administrator while also serving as the Pastor of Saint Mary of the Annunciation and as the Dean of Vicariate 1-A.

My classmate, Bishop Jeffery Grob, recognized that this was beginning to take a toll on my health and he initiated a search for a full-time temporary administrator. I am grateful that Fr. Bob Heinz has agreed to accept the assignment as a temporary administrator of St. Francis de Sales Parish until allegations against Fr. Ryan are resolved.

I want to take this opportunity to thank Deacon Tom Purtell, Deacon Bob Arvidson, Deacon John Sfire, your pastoral team, especially Pam Lynch, Judy Reilly and Laura Angelini, and everyone who has been so welcoming and helpful to me these past 6 months. I am also most grateful for the support of Bishop Jeffery Grob and Bishop George Rassas, especially for administering the Sacrament of Confirmation. I am also very grateful for the many priests who have served during this time, including Fr. Paul Wachdorf, Fr. Bradley Zamora, Fr. Rodolfo Ramirez, Fr. Emery de Gall, Fr. Dennis Zalecki, and Fr. John Hoffman.

I have come to love the people of Saint Francis de Sales and I will continue to keep you and your pastor, Fr. David Ryan, in my prayers.

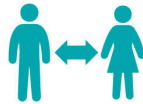

May Crowning 2021

This year, May Crowning was different than it was in past years. Normally, during May Crowning the whole school, their family members, and other parishioners gather in a packed church to participate in a ceremony dedicated to Mary. The eighth grade normally leads in scripture readings and the praying of the Rosary, and we all sing songs in praise of the Blessed Mother. With Covid this year, only second and eighth graders were able to attend in the church, and everyone else watched the livestream from their classrooms and homes. We weren't able to pray the Rosary, say special prayers, or sing songs to Mary. On a normal May Crowning, each class brings in flowers to give to Mary, and the flowers would stay by her side in the church for days after. Classes this year weren't able to bring in flowers. This year, May Crowning was incorporated into our weekly Mass, and the 8th graders gave flowers to Mary. Despite the differences brought on by Covid restrictions, this May Crowning felt special too.

This year, I was selected to crown Mary at our May Crowning Mass. It was an honor to have such a special and important role in a ceremony to revere and crown the Blessed Virgin. Walking up to crown Mary, I was a little nervous because I was scared to mess up with many people staring at me. That feeling changed when I finally approached the statue and laid the crown of flowers on her head. In that moment, I felt a special spiritual connection with her, like she was looking down at us proudly and smiling. After I went back to my seat, I was deep in prayer with her, quietly talking to her in my head. I had never felt so close to her before. It felt amazing. Now, I feel my relationship with her is very strong.

In the end, despite the challenges that Covid presented, everything went as it should have. It was even more special for me because I became closer to Mary than ever before. Overall, like so many experiences this year, it was a May Crowning that was different than other years, but we were able to make this important ritual happen and acknowledge the special role that Mary plays in our faith.

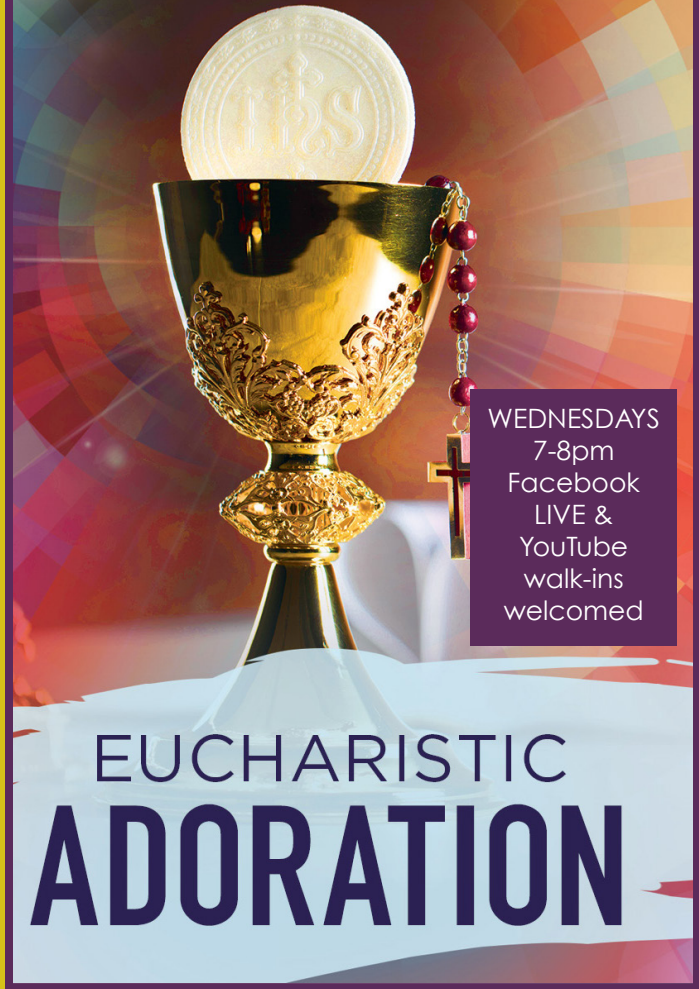

Deacon's Corner

Following the goings on around the world we live in, it has come to my attention and possibly yours, that many events that take place which we might think are isolated in themselves, tend to take place elsewhere shortly thereafter. Perhaps you can figure out where I am going with this. You are correct, I am referring to "copy-cat" events. Now Webster defines "copy-cat" as "imitator or mimic". And I have asked myself for a long time; "why do copy-cat events take place in different places at nearly the same time". The answer I have come up with is the media. All types of media such as TV, the internet, facebook, youtube, twitter, etc., etc. Most of the events I am referring to are not good ones. They are usually borne out of anger, hatred, malicious intent and so on. Yet the media (all types) publicizes these events, some to the point of glamorizing them. So it is no surprise that we have "copy-cats" all over the world that want some of that glamor, some of that attention.

How sad it is to even have to think this way, but I am sure most of you reading this today may of had the same thought at some point in time. The fact that "copy-cats" do what they do in order to get some of that attention that someone else may have gotten before them. And I will say that most "copy-cats" do what they do because someone else did it first and got attention for doing it.

So I have taken the "copy-cat" concept and tried to determine how to apply it to my own spiritual growth. How or what can I copy in order to be a better Christian, a better Catholic, a better Deacon in order to serve both Our Lord and my brothers and sisters here on earth. Of course the first and most important answer I came up with is to "imitate and/or mimic" Jesus Christ. And I know, at least for me, that is a "hard act to follow". No excuses, but we are human and subject to failure. That is exactly why Jesus Christ came to walk among us, to live in a human body, to experience around Him the human frailties that

we all possess. But He did all of this for one very important reason. Yes, you are correct. He did this human walk only to die on the Cross so that our sins may be forgiven. So that by living in His Word, by living in the State of Grace, we can all obtain Eternal Salvation.

Therefore, I ask all of you as I do myself; "why would we not be a copy-cat of Jesus Christ?" To me, it makes perfect sense, yet I know I fall into sin and temptation more than I care to admit. But I thank Our Lord each and every day for His forgiveness. Remember, there is nothing more pleasing to Satan than to know that we have sinned, to know that we could not overcome his tempting ways. But remember also as I've said in homilies many times, the evil one sits on our left shoulder telling us not to listen to Our Lord, to do whatever we want and not worry about the consequences of our actions. And our guardian angel sits on our right shoulder telling us not to listen to the evil one, but to abide in Our Lord, to do the right thing as prescribed by God, our Father and everything will be OK.

I know sometimes it is hard to listen to your right shoulder, to do the right thing. And each time you do, each time you overcome the evil one, perhaps you are being a "copy-cat" following the ways of Our Lord. What a great feeling that is, for I know all of us have experienced being a "copy-cat" of Our Lord many times in our lives. So let's keep it up, let's keep going in that same direction, following our Road to Salvation in the Way of Our Lord and I know that being that type of "copy-cat" will bring us much happiness and success. And I guess for the other type of "copy-cat" that lives in anger and hatred, we should continue to pray for them that their lives can be changed and they start listening to their guardian angel who will whisper in their right ear.
