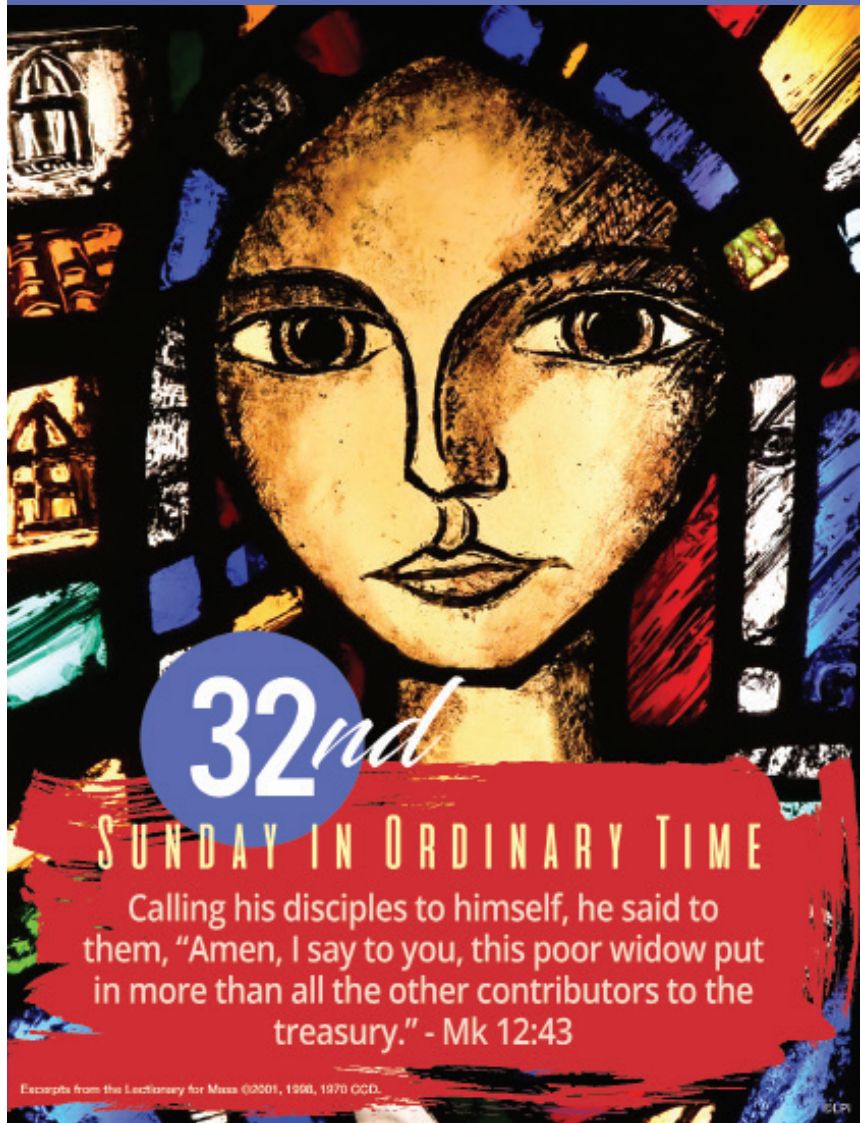

GOSPEL MEDITATION

ENCOURAGE DEEPER UNDERSTANDING OF SCRIPTURE

A well-choreographed dance can be truly inspirational. Each movement and step are interconnected, each contributing a piece of the unfolding artistic story. The beholder is caught up in the rhythms, music, and gestures, realizing that none are dispensable and all are necessary. The same is true of the Divine Dance of the Trinity. Each Person plays a part, using unique gestures and movements that are connected to the other Divine Partners. They tell a story of love. Every movement and step is born of love and flows on into eternity. The Divine Dance never ends.

God the Creator powerfully, yet with gentle love, leads. Creating and recreating, birthing and sustaining, He dances with the compassionate incarnate Son, guided by the breath of the Holy Spirit. They are three distinct Persons but move as One. On one hand, the cascading flow of their Presence appears motionless, yet on the other, flows and moves with effortless attention. They share one heart, one goal, and one purpose and invite all of creation to join in their dance, their joy.



The energy of the Trinity flows through all created things. It is a dance of the heart, not of the mind. It has to be experienced, not dissected, and contemplated, not understood. We stand in awe of the Divine Dance and find ourselves watching in amazement all that God creates and sustains. The dance continues in the majesty of a mountain, the power and wonder of an ocean, and the vastness of the universe. It moves in the cry of a newborn infant and in the soul of one who has been forgiven. It flows in the cry for

justice and in the wounds of the oppressed. It circles through the changing of seasons, the cycles of birth and death, and the wisdom that one acquires when they love God.

The Dance never ends. Its movements and rhythms go on forever. The Trinitarian Dance sustains all things, endures all things, and brings hope. You are invited to dance. Don't just watch as if you were simply a spectator. Join in the dance and move as they move.

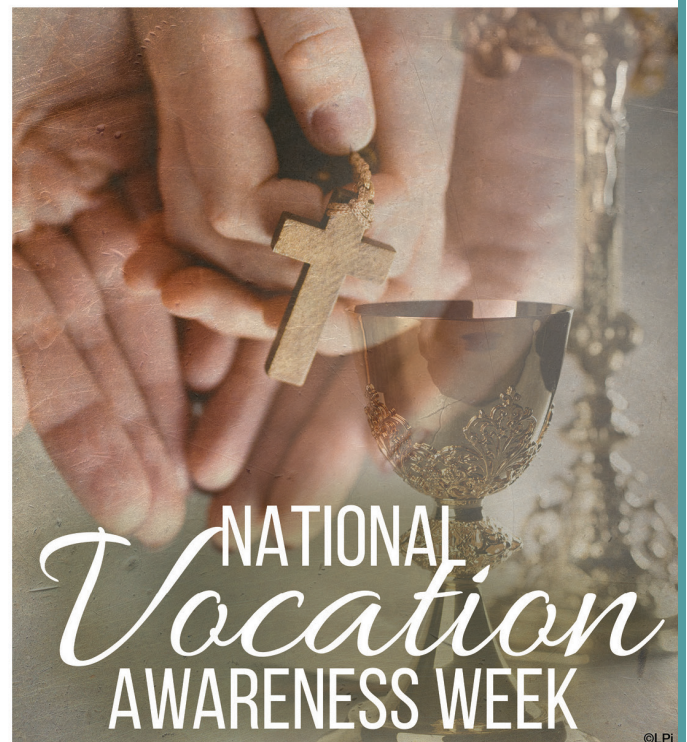

CAN YOU EXPLAIN WHAT WE MEAN BY A VOCATION OR CALLING? I HAVE HEARD THIS TERM USED IN MANY DIFFERENT CONTEXTS AND AM NOT SURE WHAT IT MEANS. DOES IT APPLY TO RELIGIOUS LIFE?

A vocation or calling refers to a spiritual experience whereby a person senses within oneself the closeness of God and what he is asking in one's life. It is a realization of what one's part in God's plan could be. Vocation comes in all kinds of ways. Some are as dramatic as St. Paul's, being knocked off his horse, blinded, and hearing God's voice. Others are less dramatic, often occurring over time through little events and personal interests. Others happen in a hurry, accompanied by great spiritual insight or conversion. We often think that this applies to religious vocation, but in fact, every Christian has a vocation, a calling to serve others in and through the church. Whether married or single, religious or lay, we are all called to live out our baptismal commitment to preach and teach the Gospel

message. Each of us has our role to play in God's plan, and we become coworkers with God in the work of redemption. With a little confidence, a willing spirit and God's grace, we can and will respond to his unique call.

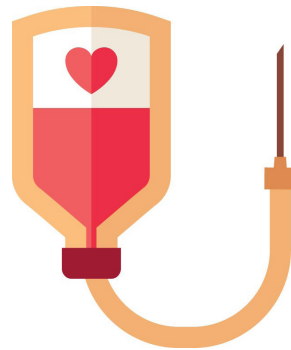
Who benefits from blood donation?

At Versiti Blood Center of Illinois, formerly Heartland Blood Centers, we never forget the patients who receive the blood we collect. Every unit of blood is collected from volunteer donors who meet specific criteria and have been screened according to strict guidelines. Every unit (pint) is collected, transported, tested and stored according to tightly-controlled procedures.

Examples of transfusion needs are:

- Cancer: up to 8 units/month
- Bone Marrow Transplant: up to 2 units/day
- Liver Transplant: up to 100 units
- Auto Accident: up to 50 units
- Cardiovascular Surgery: 2-25 unit

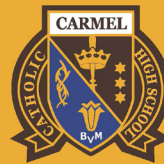

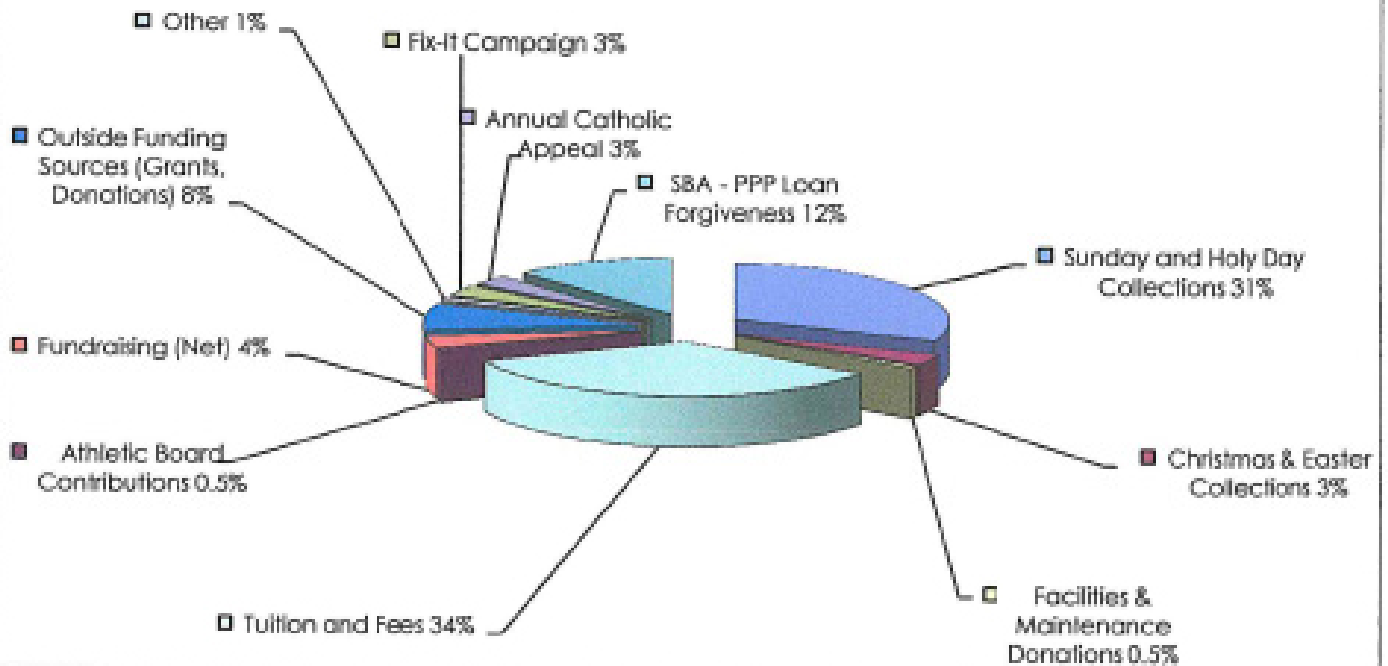

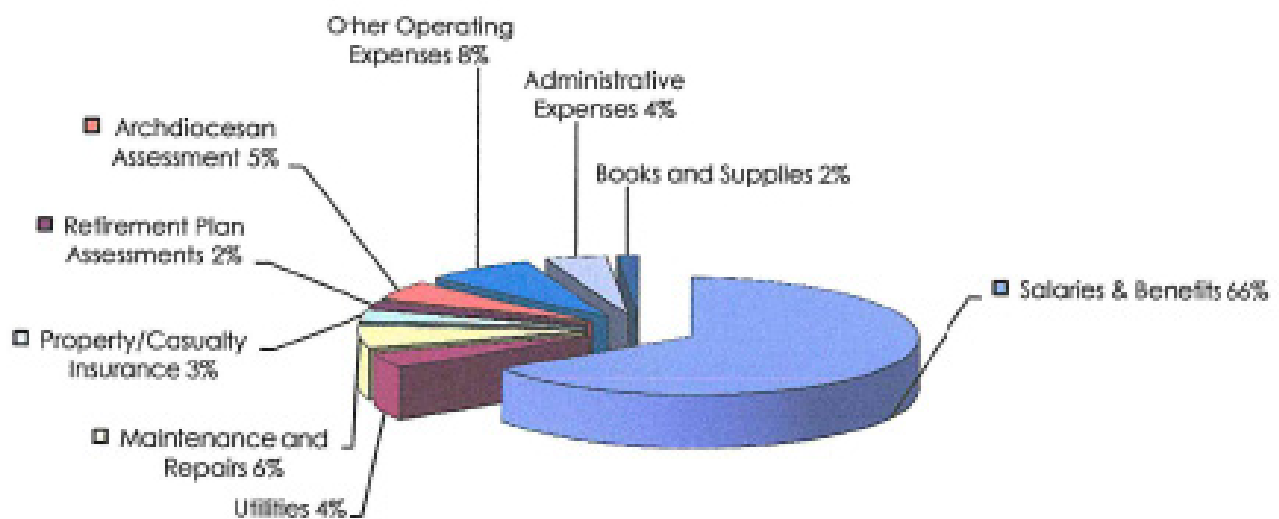

Deacon's Corner

First and foremost, I want to wish everyone a blessed All Souls Day. I am sure all reading this have someone, either family, friends or both, to remember this day and probably every day.

Today's DC is based on this past Sunday's gospel from Mk 12: 28-34. It is a gospel that I really like to preach and write about often. It's content has to do with the two most important Commandments; "love the Lord, thy God, with all your heart, mind and strength and love your neighbor as yourself". I know you might say; "Deacon John, you always refer to those two Commandments so often". And you are correct, I do. The reason is simple. First, Jesus says in the gospel; "there is no other Commandment greater than these". This was one time that Jesus was asked a question by a scribe who wasn't trying to trick Him into some condemning answer. For me, it was refreshing to see and hear someone who, at the time, recognized who and what Jesus really was and is.

The key word in this gospel is love. And Jesus is the epitome of love. His entire ministry and life are dedicated to love for us all. It is difficult to understand the depth that Jesus has put into His love for us. Think about it for a minute. Jesus knew even before He was born what His life would be like walking a human existence with us, yet He did it to fulfill the Will of His Father.

I believe that Jesus was saddened quite often by the challenges put before Him on a daily basis as He professed His ministry. Even up to the time of His persecution and death on the Cross, Jesus exuded His love for us when He said; "Father forgive them, for they know not what they do".

St. John tells us that God is love in 1 Jn 4:16, a love that is creative and self-giving, that desires the best for each of us as creatures of God. And because of this, we are each called to love God, to love each other and to love ourselves. The important thing about love is that we should pray for a deeper appreciation of love, for the freedom to accept it more fully in our lives and to live it as Jesus did in a self-giving way. As I always say, "easier to say, harder to do".

In many of my homilies and writings, I talk about how we can live the Word of God. And I truly believe that the most effective way to do that is by example, by our everyday actions. Words can sometimes be hollow unless they are followed up with example. And that can be best accomplished by asking God in the form of the Holy Spirit dwelling within us, to help us reach out to others bringing them closer to God.

John Wesley provided a good description of how we might obey these great Commandments; "do all the good you can, by all the means you can, in all the ways you can, in all the places you can, at all the times you can, to all the people you can, as long as ever you can". I found this to be very profound and have adopted it as a lifestyle to follow. Again, "easy to say, harder to do".

I know it is not always easy to love God emotionally, especially when life is challenging, but I have found that by not being afraid to say that to God, life is easier to accept knowing and believing that God "has my back".
