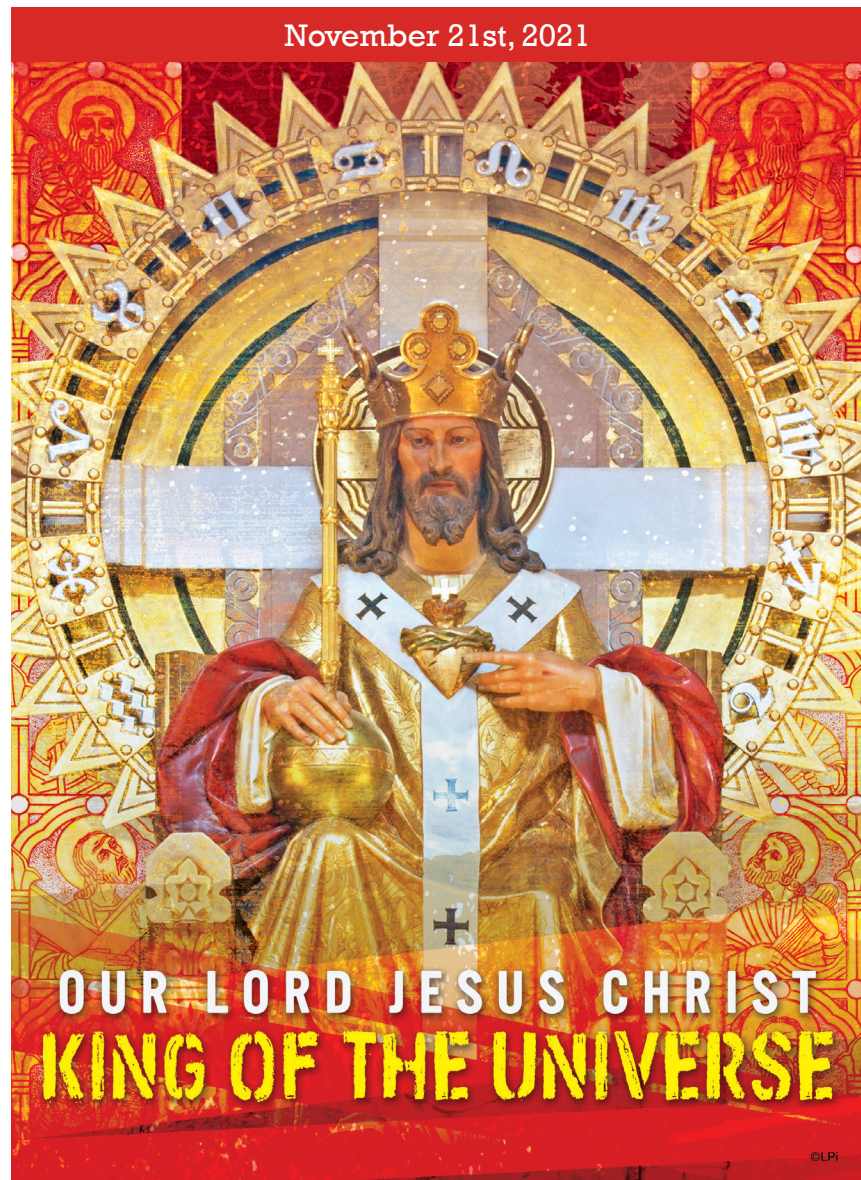

### CHRIST, THE KING

The selection from the book of Daniel presented in today's first reading was part of an attempt to weave a vision of ultimate success for the Jews under persecution. Exactly whom the author had in mind when he refers to "one like a Son of Man" is hotly disputed by scholars today. The fact is, we simply do not know if the author meant anyone in particular or if this is a collective, figurative image of Israel's triumph. What we do know is that the early Christian community seized upon this passage and recognized it as a messianic prophecy, a foretelling of the ultimate triumph of Jesus as the Christ of God. The Lectionary's juxtaposition of this text with today's Gospel narrative of Jesus before Pilate is a wonderful example of how the liturgy "layers" passages with new meaning by inserting them in a particular context.

The celebration of Christ the King allows us to hear these passages with a new depth of meaning in light of our contemporary understanding of how, in Jesus and his resurrection and ascension, we have seen the fulfillment of Daniel's vision of ultimate deliverance. The veiled admission of Jesus before Pilate that he did indeed have a kingdom "not here" takes on new meaning against the cosmic vision of Daniel, who allows us to glimpse the "Ancient One" on his heavenly throne. ## GOSPEL MEDITATION

### ENCOURAGE DEEPER UNDERSTANDING OF SCRIPTURE

We often come to life expecting all of the pieces of the puzzle to nicely fit together. We want and expect harmony, order, and fairness, the achievement of rewards for good behavior, good health, and happiness. We can more easily accept death when it comes naturally after a good long life, but have a real difficulty comprehending the meaning of it all when it is cut short. Willing to put in a good measure of effort, we desire positive results. When things go wrong and life gets hurtful, unjust, and downright ugly, we become unsettled and can quickly fall into despair. This is especially true if we are people of faith who believe in a God who sees things on our terms and works in favor of our life agenda. What happens to our faith when we find ourselves sitting in a mess?

Does it help to know that God understands and that hardship, failure, disappointment, injustice, confusion, and all of life's ugliness do not make faith irrelevant or irrational? God is wonderfully and surprising creative! He turns the tables on not only our understanding of life, but of what it means to be a king. God sends us a king who is not exempt from life's ills but embraces them. The king that God gives to us knows what it means to be poor, suffer



insults, be ridiculed, face rejection, endure suffering, be betrayed, and face a most unjust and horrific death. This is our king. Jesus is not a king of prestige or grandeur but a king who brings light to darkness, hope to despair, sinners to mercy, and new life out of death. Christ dances before us pleading with us to hold on, cling to love, avoid being negative, stop feeling cheated, and be strong in faith! There may be hardship and disappointment now but there are more surprises to come.

Once we understand this truth, we will also understand that we are on a most incredible and awesome universal journey to Christ and becoming one in Christ. We all carry

within us the image of God, the image of our suffering king. The One who lives in us also lives in all of our brothers and sisters. Failing to see this universal Divine Presence in all is one of the greatest mistakes we can make, for we also fail to see God, our king, as well. There are many things that can bring hardship to life. If we keep our head about us and do not lose hope, we can persevere and strive for the greatest degree of justice possible. Even though there are ample things that can challenge our faith, we also know that our deepest joy comes from union with God and our brothers and sisters. One day, the fullness of that joy will be ours to have when we are all eternally one with Christ our King forever.

Did you know that you can become royalty, for the right price? Now, this lordship or ladyship doesn't come with the ability to boss anyone around, but maybe your friends will be impressed enough to bend the knee.

My point is, we've all got our own little fiefdoms — folks or communities for which we have a feeling of responsibility. Maybe we're not their "king," but most of us have those we think of as "our people."

Now, in this world, people lay themselves down for their kings. History is riddled with the bodies of men, young and old — and plenty of women and children, too — who were

casualties of wars waged by men in power, men who never had to shed their own blood. But in the next world, the King dies for his people. This is leadership par excellence — the leadership of someone whose love is greater than his ambition.

We are all leaders of a sort. On the parish level, you have the obvious roles — serving on pastoral council, spearheading the capital campaign, leading the Altar Guild. But you also have the quiet ones who lead from the wings — the janitor who can always be relied upon to do his job, or the volunteer librarian who puts in extra hours on the weekends.

There is a saying — find your people. I say, find your people, and find a way to lay yourself down for them, in imitation of the greatest King that ever was.

## WHY DO WE MAKE CHANGES IN THE MASS? SOME SEEM SO SMALL AND UNIMPORTANT. ARE THEY REALLY NECESSARY?

The celebration of the Eucharist is at the heart of our identity as Catholics. Our purpose as a Church community revolves around the Eucharist. Everything we are and everything we do is measured not only by how well we celebrate, but also by how well we live the sacrament. If that is so, then we as a community will always strive to celebrate the Mass as best we can. The reasons for some changes might seem more obvious than others, but there is a reason behind each one.

The General Instruction of

the Roman Missal is the introduction to the Missal that contains all the prayers for the celebration of the Mass. The Order of Mass we use now was issued in 1975 and, as often happens over the course of years, some questions have come up about the proper way of doing some things and whether or not other practices are acceptable. These changes clarify some things and make the celebration of the Mass more meaningful for everyone.



The opportunity is presented to us to better learn and understand each part of the Mass, which in turn should help us deepen our appreciation for its beauty and meaning. We will be a better Church if we have a clearer understanding and knowledge of Who and what we celebrate.

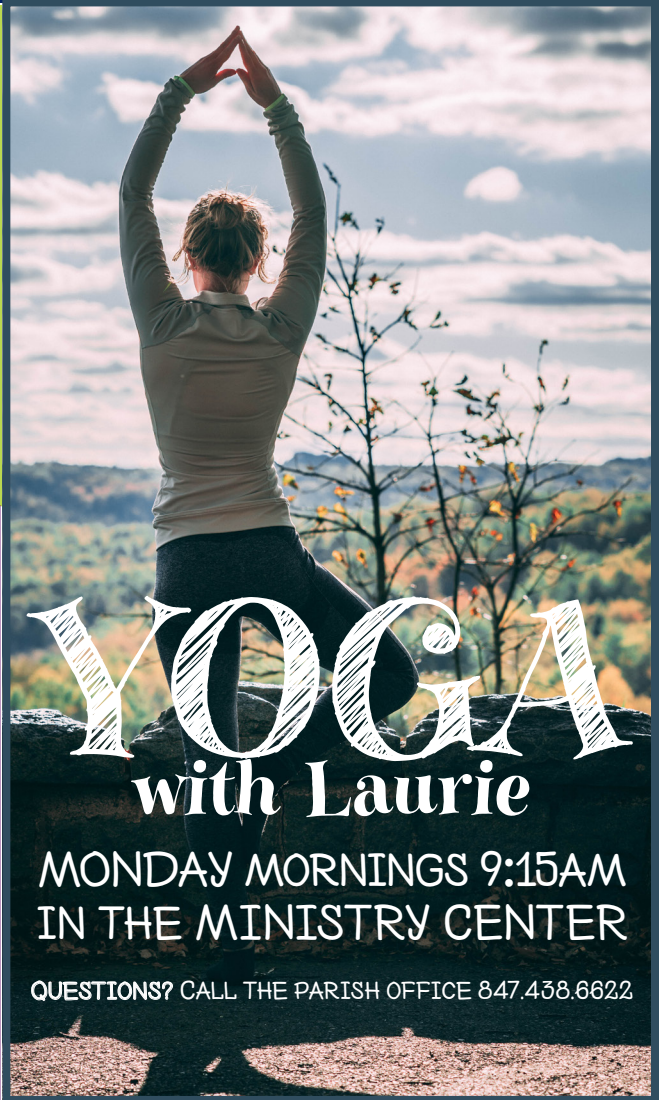

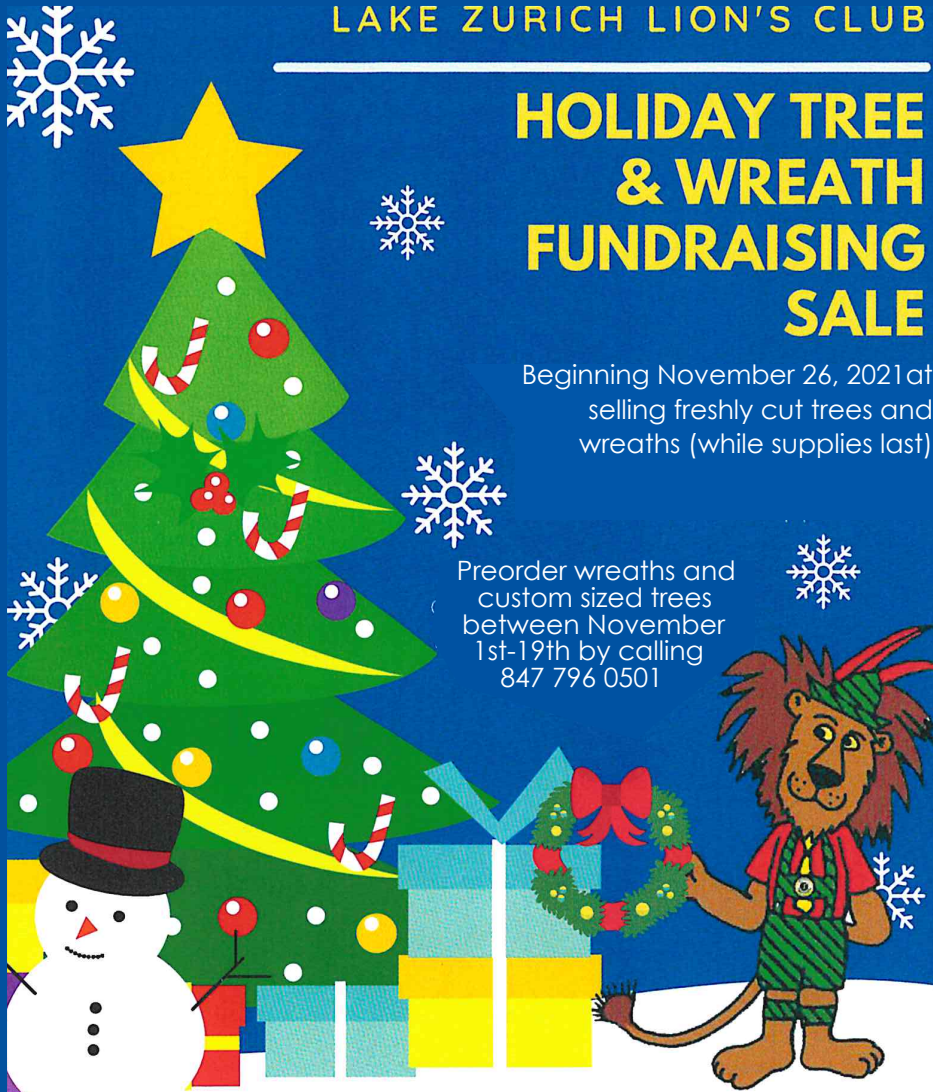

## SFS GRADUATE SPOTLIGHT

**Mary Kate Mooney**, daughter of Angela and the late Michael Mooney, ran into Fr Ryan and Deacon John at the Hungry Mule this past summer and Fr Ryan insisted that we share Mary Kate's update with the parish! Mary Kate and her family were so grateful to Fr. Ryan and Deacon John that they were able to pray together in the restaurant before she departed for Thailand. Mary Kate graduated from SFS class of 2013, Carmel Catholic High School Class of 2017, and most recently graduated from Hope College in 2021 to accept a Special Education Teaching Position at the International Community School in Bangkok, Thailand. "I am in my first year teaching at ICS, a private, non-profit Christian school. Majority of our students do not come from Christian homes, so each day our community has the opportunity to plant seeds about the truth of Christ and demonstrate the love of Christ.

I am the Elementary Special Education/Life Skills teacher at ICS. My focus is on inclusion. My students are given the opportunity to join their peers in the general education classroom as much as possible. My role is to support them in those classes, as well as providing direct instruction in my own classroom throughout the day.

I'd say most students come from well-off families, but we do have a good amount of missionary families! Our missionary families receive quite a bit of financial support. Taken from the website, ICS continues the tradition of offering quality Christian education for the international English speaking community and now educates over 1000 students from over 22 nations.

Our Mission Statement: Based on the Bible, in partnership with parents, we teach the whole student to know and apply wisdom for the good of our world and the glory of God.

I think the coolest thing is that most of our students are not from Christian homes, but their parents still choose ICS knowing they will hear about Jesus each day."

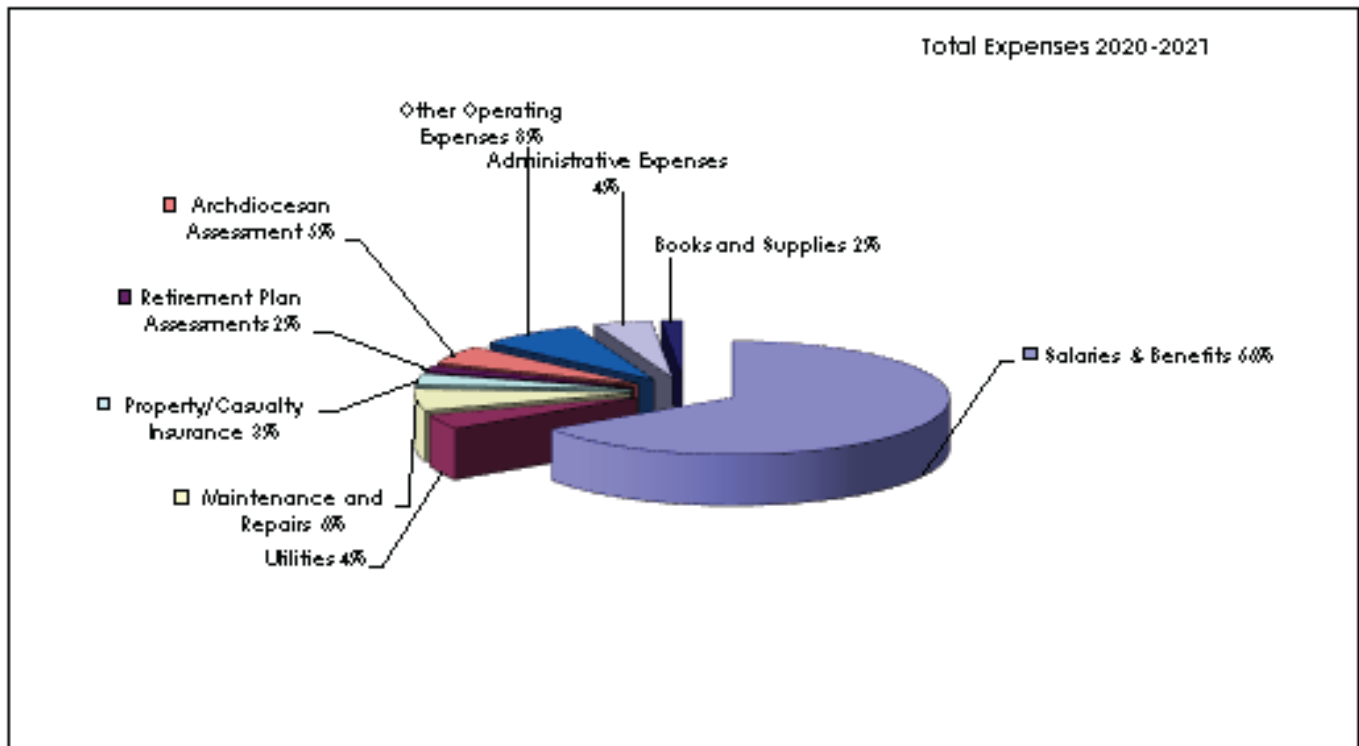
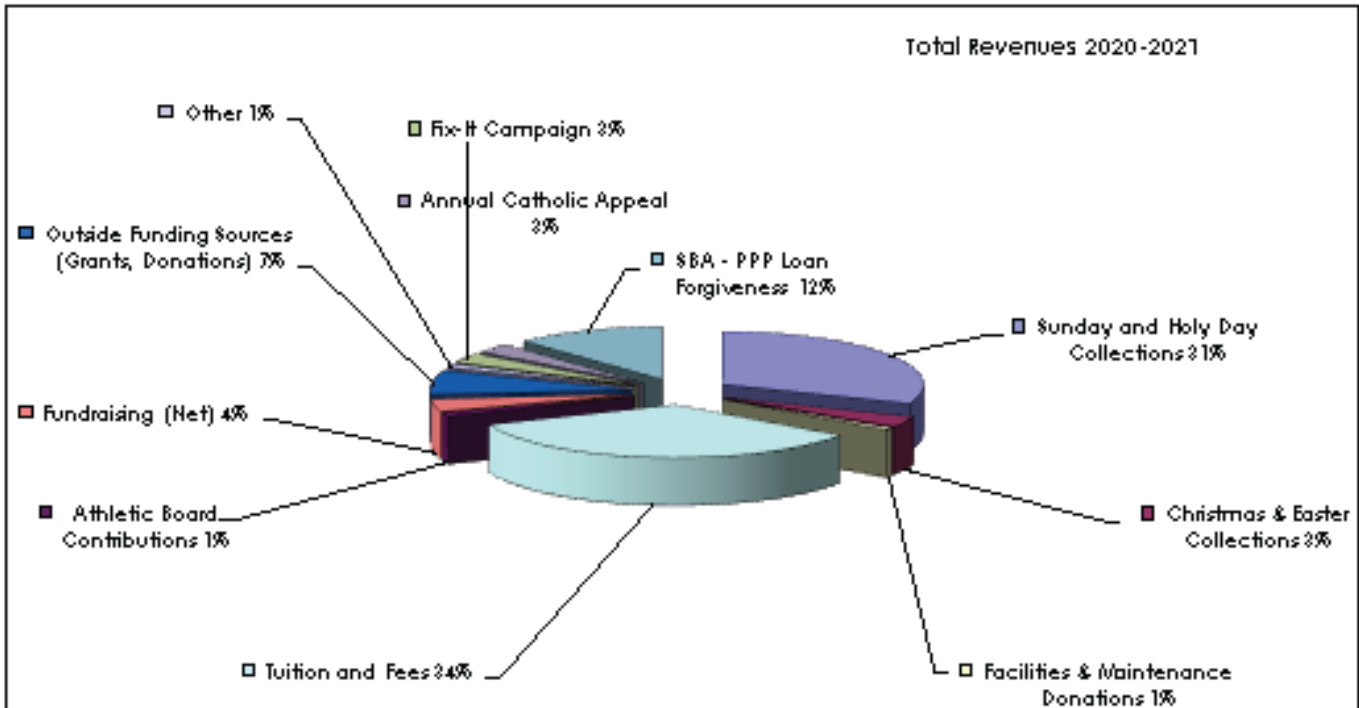

## Deacon's Corner

I don't know about you, but this time of the year is the beginning of my focus on the upcoming Holidays. As I was with a group of friends last night, I mentioned that after we pass Halloween, it seems that our lives get busier with planning parties, spending Holidays with loved ones and friends and just being busier than normal in anticipation of the coming of Our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ who is to be born on Christmas. And while we know that Easter Season is our most important Season in the liturgical year, we cannot get over the hustle and bustle of the Christmas Season.

Perhaps the one thing that I find myself having to continue to remember is that our focus should not be on the hustle and bustle, but our focus should be on the Birth of Our Lord. I am as much at fault as anyone for not following that precept so this year I will begin directing my focus earlier and be more dedicated to its fulfillment. And how do I plan to do that? Well, my plan is to be more open about my relationship with Jesus Christ. Looking back over my life all the way to grade school, I was taught by the Dominican nuns for school years 1-8 and the Augustinian priests for grades 9-12. We attended Mass every day before lunch and it seems to me that the concept of loving Jesus Christ was always put in front of us by someone else, be it a nun or priest. So we didn't have to work too hard to have Christ in our lives.

So let's fast forward to today. The Vatican Council of 53 years ago brought about significant changes in the way we approached our relationship with Christ. New terms came into play like "evangelizing" for one that was kind of new to my way of thinking. Evangelism is derived from the Greek word euangelion, meaning "gospel" or "good news". The word "evangelism" never appears in the Bible, although it is referred to indirectly on many occasions through its definition.

So when we talk about evangelizing, it seems to me that we are referring to speaking or displaying our Christian beliefs in an outward manner. A good example is in Luke 8:2-56 which shows how Jesus brought the "good news", for He not only preached, but He also demonstrated His power over the forces of nature in saving His fearful disciples. And in doing so, Jesus called upon the Holy Spirit to dwell within the disciples to "go out and preach to all nations" thus evangelizing to all about Our Lord and Savior. Spreading the Word of the Lord to all and thus giving rise to the Holy Church as we know it today in precept and teaching.

For while our lives continue to experience change in our ever fast moving society, the basic teachings of Our Lord and Savior remain the same. Love the Lord, thy God, with your whole heart and love your neighbor as yourself. Sounds pretty simple in just reading the words but how challenging it is to live in our everyday lives. Because of this, I find it easier to keep Christ ever-present in my mind as much as possible. We are all human and suffer from the maladies of being human, but asking God for His help as much as we can remember to do that will, I assure you, bring more peace and understanding into our daily lives. Helping us to deal better with our family, friends, work associates and even strangers whom we see as much as every day or only passing by on the street.

Don't be afraid to "evangelize", to spread the Word of God. Don't keep Christ locked up inside for no one to see or hear. I believe that by sharing the Word of God with others we will come to find that we are not as alone in our beliefs as we think. In closing, I want to share something that St. Francis of Assisi said, "Preach the gospel at all times, and when necessary, use words".

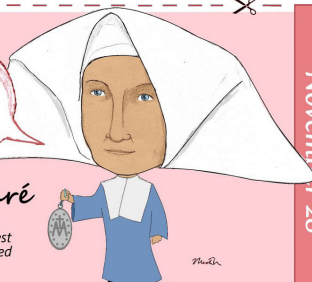

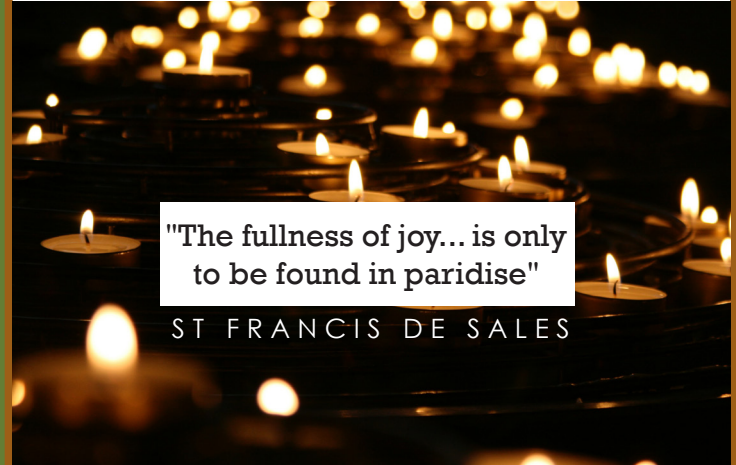
