

THE HUMANITY OF JESUS CHRIST

All three readings today support—each in its own way, of course—a reflection on the humanity of Jesus Christ and how that humanity played a key role in the drama of our salvation. Although not chosen specifically to coordinate with the other two readings, today's second reading does in fact carry forward the theme of Christ's humanity in a remarkable way. The author of the Letter to the Hebrews highlights the solidarity that exists between Jesus and us, precisely because in his human nature Jesus has known the same sufferings and testing that are our own experience. Because he can "sympathize with our weaknesses," we can "approach the throne of grace to receive mercy." For the author of Hebrews, the humanity of Jesus was an essential requirement for his redemptive death, as well as an invitation to us to find in Jesus someone with whom we can identify in our daily struggles. copyright (c) J. GOSPEL MEDITATION

ENCOURAGE DEEPER UNDERSTANDING OF SCRIPTURE

"What do you wish me to do for you?" Whether we realize it, this is a question God is always asking. It's an important question because the answer we provide will reveal a great deal about where our hearts lie. Our requests of God can often appear very noble and altruistic. They consist of requests for healing for someone in need of prayers, successful resolution of a personal conflict, assistance in overcoming a disease and myriad other desires for both ourselves and others. We are especially concerned about those we love and can easily find ourselves bringing their struggles to God for a hearing in our prayer.

Is that really all that prayer is about? The woman in today's Gospel, having been put in her place by Jesus, was only looking out for the wellbeing of her sons. She was doing what mothers do, protecting and securing the livelihood of her children. But she was sadly mistaken, her request was not granted. We all make this same misguided mistake from time to time. The goal of prayer is not to convince God of the worthiness of our agenda or to gain a hearing. Sometimes we believe that the more we multiply our prayers or discover the right combination of supplications that we will receive



more of God's attention. That's not how it works. Even though God desires to hear, know, and be an intimate part of what is on our minds, it goes much deeper.

What we need from God is a relationship. It's a relationship that guides and immerses us in the very stuff of life and in the direction of the Gospel. This relationship sees God's kingdom and agenda, not our own, as what is most important. It builds the strength of character necessary to bring God's Gospel into a world that may not receive it with open arms. It may cause us discomfort and suffering. We are asked to heroically journey

with God through suffering, hardship, ridicule, and even death! Ultimately, our desire from God must become our desire for God. It is only when this happens that the powerful words "thy will be done" will be found with sincerity and humility on our lips. Whatever God wishes becomes what we wish as we see this glorious union of wills. Our humble lives will then become powerful witnesses, and what happens to us in God's eternal kingdom the result of his mercy. We become true servants and find ourselves discovering God's definition of success. That definition has nothing at all to do with status, income, or privilege.

"But it shall not be so among you. Rather, whoever wishes to be great among you will be your servant; whoever wishes to be first among you will be the slave of all. For the Son of Man did not come to be served but to serve and to give his life as a ransom for many." - Mk 10:43-45

WHAT'S IN IT FOR ME?

I think we've all been guilty of looking at a situation and wondering what's in it for us. It doesn't matter if it's a particular work assignment, someone at the parish asking for help with the mission trip bake sale, or your spouse asking if you'll take over the grocery shopping this week. Often, our first reaction to one of these requests is a heavy sigh and the thought: "If I do this, what will I get?"

Sometimes it surprises us to realize that the Apostles were no different. We tend to idolize these contemporaries of Christ as giants who walked with the Savior. But in reality, these individuals were merely human beings struggling to commit to the task of everyday stewardship.

In the Gospels, we see glimpses of them longing for praise and affirmation. We see them jockeying for positions of power within the group of twelve. We see them expect earthly rewards like honor and admiration. We see them acting a lot like us.

But in the end, we see them transformed by the grace of God. Like all the saints, their holiness stems from their commitment to their call. They stumble through, and as they stumble, they keep trusting God. They keep turning to Him. They keep asking for help. They don't give up just because they keep failing at it.

We are defined by what we give when we have no hope of being reimbursed, rewarded, or recognized. The Apostles understood this, eventually, and they gave accordingly. Most of them gave their very lives.


Remember, they're just like us. If they can do it, we can too.

ARE CATHOLICS ALLOWED TO VISIT PSYCHICS? WHY OR WHY NOT?

It's part of human nature to experience some sense of unease and fear about the future. This can lead some people to seek out the services of psychics or consult horoscopes or turn to other occult practices or resources (e.g. Ouija boards or tarot cards). The Catechism of the Catholic Church is very clear that Catholics should avoid such practices: "Consulting horoscopes, astrology, palm reading, interpretation of omens and lots, the phenomena of clairvoyance, and recourse to mediums all conceal a desire for power over time, history, and, in the last analysis, other human beings, as well as a wish to conciliate hidden powers. They contradict the honor, respect, and loving fear that we owe to God alone" (no. 2116).

Despite the uncertainties we might feel, we are called to have faith and trust in God, confident of God's desire for what is best for us. This means that we are called to surrender, to pray and to reflect on how we can best move into the future in hope, knowing that God is with us.

- Cancer: up to 8 units/month
- Bone Marrow Transplant: up to 2 units/day
- Liver Transplant: up to 100 units
- Auto Accident: up to 50 units
- Cardiovascular Surgery: 2-25 unit





none of the past week's Deacon's Corner, I wrote through generations? Perhaps it reminds you of about "thanking God for the blessings He has someone you loved whose journey was completed I carry with me each and every day, I wanted to own life experiences. In no way am I ever judging anyone else but hope to ignite some thoughts and ideas that may help someone make changes in their lives.

As I was growing up, which seems like a million years ago but also like yesterday, I predicated the riches in my life mostly on how much money I had. I remember going to work every day that I didn't have school with my father. In those days, the minimum wage was \$1.65 per hour and that was what I was paid. And since my father owned a grocery store, I packed and carried out groceries for our customers and most of time was given a "tip". Sometimes as much as \$1.00 but mostly they averaged around \$.25. By the end of the day I might have collected \$5.00 to \$6.00 which I took home and saved by putting it in the bank. This all began about the age of thirteen and by the time I graduated high school, I had amassed well over \$10,000. which in 1963 was a lot of money.

It wasn't until some years later that I came to realize that the "riches" we work to attain really aren't based on how much money we have. And that lesson didn't come easy after being immersed in the world of "how much do you have". So how do we now go about determining the level of 'riches' we all have and/or are available to all of us? For myself, it has become pretty simple. And in the balance of this Deacon's Corner, I am going to use some of the phraseology out of one of the devotional books I read every morning. These thoughts were spurned on after reading the words written for this week.

What do you think when you hear the word heir. Does it evoke thoughts of wealth handed down Deacon John

bestowed upon us". And since this is a thought that on earth. The truth is that not many people inherit a vast estate or receive great gifts from wealthy continue on the same path with this week's Corner. relatives, at least I know that I didn't. But that It is important to remember that I write based on my is if you look at what someone left you from a monetary standpoint. I know now there is a different perspective that has taken precedent in my life.

> I have found that by opening my heart to Jesus and all of His teachings, I have become a co-heir of all of God's immeasurable "riches". He wants to be your fullness and abundant supply for every aspect of your life. Think about it! If you need strength, God has all power and gives you energy to complete every task. How about wisdom? He supplies discernment and insight that can cut through even the densest fog of confusion. And how about if you are seeking contentment? God, our Father, gives us peace beyond our human understanding.

> The biggest challenge I have found is understanding and accepting what Our Lord offers to each of us. Jesus Christ came to walk among us only to relinquish His human form for us, so that our sins can be forgiven. What greater sacrifice/inheritance could be offered to us. I say none! So let us remember most importantly, that material wealth is something that can come and go in our lives. But the inheritance we can receive by trusting and abiding in the Lord is unchanging and can never be depleted. It is up to us to keep the inheritance he give us in our lives alive and well. He will never take it away from us but often we set is aside. Abiding in Him and keeping His inheritance in our lives will keep us on the "path to eternal salvation" and I promise you that in the end, we will all receive that big "tip" for keeping Him in our lives.


