

## THIS IS MY BELOVED SON

This Sunday's celebration of the Baptism of the Lord closes the Christmas season. In the scriptures we see one more epiphany, or manifestation, of the Spirit of God in Jesus—but this time it is as an adult, rather than as a child. Jesus' baptism also serves as the inauguration of his prophetic mission and the messianic age.

Today's reading from Isaiah describes God's chosen Messiah, upon whom God's spirit rests. In the Acts of the Apostles Peter says that "God anointed Jesus of Nazareth with the Holy Spirit and power" (Acts 10:38). Finally, in the proclamation from Matthew's Gospel Jesus' baptism in water goes almost unnoticed. The crucial moment comes when the Spirit of God comes upon Jesus and a voice from heaven echoes the words of Isaiah: "This is my beloved Son, with whom I am well pleased" (Matthew 3:17).

### 34<sup>th</sup> PLEDGE UPDATE & PAYMENTS COMPLETED

Sunday, January 5th, 2020  
THE EPIPHANY OF THE LORD

Dear Parishioners, Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

The remaining major projects are the new flooring design in the Church. We had hoped by Christmas 2019 to have completed the new Church flooring, but our plans and finances are scheduled for 2020. A monument on the site of the first Church building has been erected in remembrance of the first church in the parish and in honor of the generations of Catholics since 1949 in this faith community as disciples of this Body of Christ.

As pledges are made and paid, we will continue to address the one remaining project, which can be found on our parish website. See what this good parish has accomplished already in total pledges and number of donors! At this point in the Campaign, **923 donors** helped us reach **\$1,539,855 in total pledges**. **Total pledges paid are \$1,527,817. Balance due is \$12,037.** It is not the intention of the Fix-It Campaign to place the parish in debt. As a parish, we spent 9 years paying off the \$3.8 million debt. We will only address the project as we raise the funds to pay. As Thomas Jefferson advised, "Never spend your money before you have it!" My Grandmother Ryan said the same message in her own way! For details on the campaign, including the presentation that was shown at Masses as well as the information on Charitable Giving Options, visit our parish website, **[www.stfrancislzparish.org](http://www.stfrancislzparish.org)**. **Thank you to those who have already responded with a pledge toward the \$1.7 million goal.** St. Francis de Sales has a long history of generous giving. I respectfully ask for the prayers, involvement, and sacrifice of many, if not all, in the parish in making a pledge towards the Fix-It Campaign in addition to the generosity you provide each Sunday offering. For example, **if 1,000 parishioners pledge the suggested amount of \$850 per year for 2 years, we will reach our campaign goal immediately to conclude the project.** Please, everyone, participate through a prayer and a pledge. All the funds we raise in the Fix-It Campaign stay within the parish. I want to express my gratitude to Deacon John Sfire, Jason Sfire, and Amie Paige of The Fidelity Group for doing an extensive study of our parish campus, as was presented in the Fix-It Campaign presentation. I have asked the Fidelity Group, under the leadership of Deacon John Sfire and Jason Sfire, to serve as Project Managers of the Fix-It Campaign. I also want to offer my appreciation for the guidance and involvement of Tom Purtell, Chair of the Parish Pastoral Council (PPC), Marty Bush, Member of the PPC; Mike Carlino, Chair of the Parish Finance Council; Doug Samz, Member of the Parish Finance Council; Christine DePrez, Cornerstone Bank Liaison; Laura Angelini, Business Manager; and Pam Lynch, Director of Youth and Young Adult Ministries.

## Deacon's Corner

It is "Twas the night before Christmas and all through the house". Sound familiar? I guess we have heard that expression for many years, and what a great sound it is. First and foremost, we all celebrate the Birth of Jesus. And what greater gift could we receive than that? I can't think of one gift that will outdo the coming of our Savior. We all have the opportunity to bring family together, share a meal, give each other gifts and just plain love each other. As the Season of Advent/Announcements comes to an end with the Birth of Jesus, we should not look at this as the end but the beginning. For the Angel of the Lord said to the lowly shepherds; "Behold, I proclaim to you good news of great joy that will be for all people. For today in the city of David a Savior has been born for you who is Messiah and Lord".

Taking this opportunity as I reflect back in my life, I have many different memories of Christmas as I had said earlier. As a child, a young adult, an adult, a brother, uncle, husband, father and grandfather, I recall many of the memories that have taken place in my life. Some I liked and others I did not like. Jesus is the "gift that keeps on giving" every day, every moment of our lives and has been since His birth 2,000 years ago.

One thing that has remained constant in my life and hopefully yours too, is that we end up in Church to give thanks to God for giving us His only Son so our sins can be forgiven. I am confident if I asked everyone what Christmas means to you, each would have two answers. One of your answers would be different than everyone else's and the other would be the same. The same answer would be to celebrate the peace and joy given to each of us with the Birth of Jesus. With Christmas we celebrate the greatest event in history. And while we should live with this peace and joy throughout the entire year, Christmas gives us a time to feel a special reunion with Christ.

But God has given us so much more with the Birth of His Son. He has given us the ability to carry Jesus Christ in our hearts every minute of every day. Remember the angel said; "Glory to God in the highest, and on earth peace to those on whom His favor rests". We can be a shepherd or a king or anyone in-between, for God's love knows no boundaries of human existence. ### Who benefits from blood donation?

At Versiti Blood Center of Illinois, formerly Heartland Blood Centers, we never forget the patients who receive the blood we collect. Every unit of blood is collected from volunteer donors who meet specific criteria and have been screened according to strict guidelines. Every unit (pint) is collected, transported, tested and stored according to tightly-controlled procedures.

Examples of transfusion needs are:

- Cancer: up to 8 units/month
- Bone Marrow Transplant: up to 2 units/day
- Liver Transplant: up to 100 units
- Auto Accident: up to 50 units
- Cardiovascular Surgery: 2-25 unit
