

23rd PLEDGE UPDATE & REPAIRS COMPLETED

Sunday, January 20, 2019 Second Sunday in Ordinary Time

Dear Parishioners,

As you have noticed, the new maintenance building has been completed, just north of the Blue Ribbon 2007 and 2018 parish school. On Friday, January 18th, the Village of Lake Zurich building inspectors and the Fidelity Group construction company with Jason Sfire, inspected the building and granted occupancy. Congratulations to the Fidelity Group and the parish. The remaining major project is the new flooring design in the Church. We had hoped by Christmas 2018 to have completed the new Church flooring, but our plans and finances are scheduled for 2019. A monument on the site of the first Church building will be erected in remembrance of the first church in the parish and in honor of the generations of Catholics since 1949 in this faith community as disciples of this Body of Christ. This monument is scheduled for the spring of 2019.

As pledges are made and paid, we will continue to address the one remaining project, which can be found on our parish website. See what this good parish has accomplished already in total pledges and number of donors! At this point in the Campaign, 861 donors helped us reach \$1,365,694 in total pledges. Total pledges paid are \$1,310,968. Balance due is \$54,726. It is not the intention of the Fix-It Campaign to place the parish in debt. As a parish, we spent 9 years paying off the \$3.8 million debt. We will only address the project as we raise the funds to pay. As Thomas Jefferson advised, "Never spend your money before you have it!" My Grandmother Ryan said the same message in her own way! For details on the campaign, including the presentation that was shown at Masses as well as the information on Charitable Giving Options, visit our parish website, www.stfrancislzparish.org. Thank you to those who have already responded with a pledge toward the \$1.7 million goal. St. Francis de Sales has a long history of generous giving. I respectfully ask for the prayers, involvement, and sacrifice of many, if not all, in the parish in making a pledge towards the Fix-It Campaign in addition to the generosity you provide each Sunday offering. For example, if 1,000 parishioners pledge the suggested amount of \$850 per year for 2 years, we will reach our campaign goal immediately to conclude the project. Please, everyone, participate through a prayer and a pledge. All the funds we raise in the Fix-It Campaign stay within the parish. I want to express my gratitude to Deacon John Sfire, Jason Sfire, and Amie Paige of The Fidelity Group for doing an extensive study of our parish campus, as was presented in the Fix-It Campaign presentation. I have asked the Fidelity Group, under the leadership of Deacon John Sfire and Jason Sfire, to serve as Project Managers of the Fix-It Campaign. I also want to offer my appreciation for the guidance and involvement of Tom Purtell, Chair of the Parish Pastoral Council (PPC), Marty Bush, Member of the PPC; Mike Carlino, Chair of the Parish Finance Council; Doug Samz, Member of the Parish Finance Council; Christine DePrez, Cornerstone Bank Liaison; Laura Angelini, Business Manager; and Pam Lynch, Director of Youth and Young Adult Ministries.

Dear Brothers.

Today I write to share the news that St. Joseph College Seminary will close at the end of this 2018-2019 school year. Enrollment at St. Joseph has declined over the years, and at present there are only 20 students, 13 of whom are Chicago seminarians. This has led to a financial situation that is no longer tenable if we are going to be good stewards of our limited human and financial resources.

The closure of St. Joseph College Seminary does not mean that the Archdiocese of Chicago's college seminary program is also ending. We have made arrangements with Saint John Vianney College Seminary at the University of Saint Thomas in St. Paul, Minnesota as our new location for college seminarians studying for the Archdiocese of Chicago. St. John Vianney has an excellent reputation as a seminary well-suited to forming young men in character and the spiritual life. We are grateful to the warm welcome they have offered us in this time of transition.

In a special way, I want to thank Father Peter Snieg, Rector of St. Joseph College Seminary, and the faculty and staff for their dedicated work in the service of priestly vocations. We are also grateful to Loyola University Chicago for having collaborated with the Archdiocese for so many years on seminary formation at the college level.

As we all continue to encourage priestly vocations in our Archdiocese, I want to ask you to pray for more vocations and to encourage the young men in your parish to consider the priesthood. Please refer interested candidates for seminary at all levels to Father Timothy Monahan, Director of Vocations, at 312-534-8298. I am also grateful to Father Thomas Byrne, Director of Chicago Seminarians, for accompanying our current college seminarians as they prepare to transition to a new seminary.

In these times, we are invited into deeper brotherhood with the Lord Jesus and with each other in the presbyterate. Please know of my prayers for all of you.



HEALING IN THE CHURCH

Resources from the Archodiocese of Chicago

We know these are difficult times for our Church, and you probably saw the headlines in the last few days regarding the Attorney General's report in Illinois. The church everywhere and in Archdiocese of Chicago recognizes and mourns the grave damage done to many people harmed by clergy sexual abuse and regrets the failures to respond. The report released by the Illinois Attorney General refers to the entire State of Illinois, and the statements made do not refer specifically to our archdiocese. Contrary to what has been reported, the Archdiocese presented clear evidence to the attorney general that it has reported all allegations the law enforcement has reached out to all those bringing allegations and offered pastoral care. Please visit the website www.heal. archchicago.org for more information about the sex abuse crisis in the steps the Archdiocese of Chicago continues to take to prevent abuse and offer healing to victims. Please continue to pray for the victims of sexual abuse and for our church in making their forms needed for healing and accountability.

Clarifying Summary Messages Regarding Attorney General Report

It is important to remember that the Attorney General's report relates to the entire state of Illinois, not the Archdiocese of Chicago alone.

Allegations of 500 clergy started in the Attorney General's report include the following:

- Clergy from all six diocese in Illinois
- Allegations determined to be unsubstantiated
- Allegations made when the priest was deceased when the allegation was made

The Archdiocese of Chicago has reported every allegation of child sexual abuse to civil authorities, whether or not it was substantiated.

All allegations have been promptly reported since 2002. Moreover, in 2002 we reported all historical allegations to the authorities. Copies of these reports were provided to the attorney general staff. The vast majority of allegations relate to conduct prior to 2002.

The Archdiocese of Chicago has been working to develop strong policies and procedures to heal victims and to prevent abuse since 1992.

- Every person who comes forward with an allegation is offered the services of our Victim Assistance Ministry before any investigation has begun. These services are made available regardless of when they abuse occurred or whether the accused is alive.
- We have published the names of clergy with substantiated allegations since 2006, when few diocese have done so. Our independent review board Dean's and allegation to be substantiated if it is determined that there is a reason to suspect abuse occurred, a very strict standard.
- We have a robust safe environment program aimed at preventing abuse. We screen all employees and volunteers and provide training to employees, volunteers and children and how to recognize, resist and report abuse.

General Talking Points for use with Parishioners, Friends and Family

- The Archdiocese of Chicago recognizes and mourns the grave damage done to many people harmed by clergy sexual abuse.
- The Archdiocese of Chicago will always need to own and express deep regret for the suffering caused both by the abuse and the past failures to respond.
- The report released by the Attorney General refers to the entire state of Illinois and the statements made do not refer specifically to our archdiocese. The Archdiocese has been working to develop strong policies and procedures to heal victims and prevent abuse since 1992.
 - Since 1992, the Archdiocese of Chicago has maintained one of the first and largest victim assistance programs in the nation.
 - Starting in 2002, the Archdiocese of Chicago has reported all allegations of child sexual abuse to civil authorities and, at the time, reported all historical allegations. The vast majority of allegations are related to conduct before 2002.
 - Since 2006, the Archdiocese of Chicago published names of diocesan priests with substantiated allegations of abuse.
 - The Archdiocese of Chicago conducts background screenings of all employees and volunteers and a comprehensive safe environment training is in place for all adults and for children.
- The Archdiocese of Chicago remains committed to the prevention of abuse the healing of victims and is always working to improve its response to the issue that is faced by all institutions that care for children.

CLASSES BEGIN FEBRUARY 12TH FOR FAMILY MEMBERS OF THOSE AFFECTED BY MENTAL ILLNESS

One-in-five. That's the number of adults who are dealing with a mental illness this year. Yes, twenty percent! This number might surprise you since many people living with these illnesses and their families don't talk about the illness due the stigma surrounding mental illness.

If this has hit your family, you know that living with a family member who has a mental illness can take a real toll not just on the individual with the illness, but on those in the family as well. In many cases, family members of those who have been diagnosed with depression, bipolar disorder, an anxiety disorder, borderline personality disorder, or schizophrenia feel isolated from the community due to stigma, shame, and the fear of being judged.

The good news is that you are not alone and there is a program that can help you learn more about these illnesses, and how to help your ill family member and yourself. The National Alliance on Mental Illness will be offering a 12-week program designed specifically for those who have a family member with a mental illness. The class will be held at St. Francis on Tuesday evenings, from February 12th – April 30th. For more information and to register, please contact Teri Latter at 847-809-6038.




