GOD'S CALL

The person who has been "saved," who has "heard the good news of salvation," still lives in an unsaved world, a world sadly oblivious to the presence of God. Today's readings outline how the disciple is present in the world.

The outline begins with Isaiah: "Share your bread . . . shelter the oppressed . . . clothe the naked" (Isaiah 58:7). Those who hear the word of salvation are not insensitive to the urgent needs of others. Then Paul reminds his flock that he brought Christ to them not in eloquence or wisdom, but by being with them in the "weakness and fear" of their daily lives (1 Corinthians 2:3). Finally, Jesus tells his disciples to go out into the gloom and darkness of the streets of the world and let God's light shine through their good deeds.

We disciples don't save the world. To the extent, however, that we have heard the word of God and been awakened to God's presence, we may spread that word and bring that presence to others.

Reasons to go to Mass every week

My dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

Anticipating the celebration of Christmas, a TV reporter from NewsChannel 20 interviewed me at the Cathedral before Mass on the Sunday before Christmas. The reporter started out by citing recent polls that showed a decline in weekly Mass attendance and wanted to know if we were doing anything special to get people to come to Mass for Christmas. I replied, "Getting people to church for Christmas is not a challenge. The challenge is getting them to come back on a regular basis every week." Indeed, we had overflow crowds in the Cathedral Atrium for the 4 p.m. Christmas Eve Mass, and the Cathedral was nearly full for Midnight Mass.

I added that I was hopeful because there are signs that people have not abandoned their faith entirely. People who do not go to church regularly often say that they are spiritual, but not religious, meaning that they are not atheists, but even though they believe in God, they just do not go to church on a regular basis. If that describes you, then this reflection is meant especially for you. In talking to you directly about this, my intention is not to berate you, or to chastise you, or to make you feel guilty. My hope is to encourage you with a warm invitation to become a regular part of our worshipping community on a weekly basis. As Pope St. John Paul II used to say, the church does not impose, but proposes.

So why should you come to Mass every week?

First and foremost, being a Christian is about a relationship, namely, our relationship with Jesus as Our Lord and Savior. That means that Jesus loves us and cares deeply about us. In return, he asks us to love him and care deeply about him as well. Most of us have no problem with that.

But think about this some more. If you have a loving relationship with someone, that relationship needs to be nurtured on a regular basis. For example, think of a person you love very much, such as your spouse, your Mom or Dad, your children, or a close friend. Now, what if you said to that person, "I love you very much. It was nice visiting with you today. I'll see you again same time and same place — a year from now!" Perhaps some married couples would welcome that! Most people, however, would recognize that it would be hard to sustain a deep, loving relationship if you only see your loved one once or twice a year. So why would anyone think

that our loving relationship with God would be any different? God's love for us will never diminish, but our love for God will grow cool if we do not express it frequently and fill our hearts with his love on a regular basis.

That leads to the next reason why we should go to Mass every Sunday: to receive Our Lord into our hearts in holy Communion. Of course, that will mean something only to those who believe that holy Communion is not just a symbolic reminder of the Last Supper but is actually the Real Presence of Jesus Christ. Perhaps the reason why weekly Mass attendance hovers nationally at about 30 percent of Catholics is because polls indicate that almost 70 percent of self-identified Catholics do not believe that the bread and wine become the Body and Blood of Christ during the consecration at Mass. At the Last Supper, Jesus was quite clear, as described in the Gospel of St. Matthew, who wrote, "While they were eating, Jesus took bread, said the blessing, broke it, and giving it to His disciples said, 'Take and eat; this is my body.' Then He took a cup, gave thanks, and gave it to them, saying, 'Drink from it, all of you, for this is my blood of the covenant, which will be shed on behalf of many for the forgiveness of sins'" (Matthew 26:26-28). If we truly believe that Jesus is really present in the Eucharist, how could we not want to receive Christ into our hearts as often as possible?

The next reason why we should go to church every week is because we need each other to remain spiritually strong. Christ did not come to us as some sort of personal philosopher with wise sayings for us to follow like Confucius, but Jesus established his church as a community of believers built on the solid rock of St. Peter and his successors, despite their human weaknesses, and sent his Holy Spirit to guide them. People are social beings, and we crave the support of others to strengthen us in our work as well as in play. Without this support, our energies wane. People accomplish so much more when they work together rather than as isolated individuals. Sports teams constantly talk about teamwork in order to succeed. Imagine how impoverished society would be without Catholic schools, Catholic hospitals, and Catholic Charities. Yet all of these efforts to improve the human race and lessen human suffering are

Dear Parishioners, Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

The remaining major projects are the new flooring design in the Church. We had hoped by Christmas 2019 to have completed the new Church flooring, but our plans and finances are scheduled for 2020. A monument on the site of the first Church building has been erected in remembrance of the first church in the parish and in honor of the generations of Catholics since 1949 in this faith community as disciples of this Body of Christ.

As pledges are made and paid, we will continue to address the one remaining project, which can be found on our parish website. See what this good parish has accomplished already in total pledges and number of donors! At this point in the Campaign, **929 donors** helped us reach **\$1,605,036 in total pledges**. **Total pledges paid are \$1,593,770. Balance due is \$11,265.** It is not the intention of the Fix-It Campaign to place the parish in debt. As a parish, we spent 9 years paying off the \$3.8 million debt. We will only address the project as we raise the funds to pay. As Thomas Jefferson advised, "Never spend your money before you have it!" My Grandmother Ryan said the same message in her own way! For details on the campaign, including the presentation that was shown at Masses as well as the information on Charitable Giving Options, visit our parish website, **www.stfrancislzparish.org**. **Thank you to those who have already responded with a pledge toward the \$1.7 million goal.** St. Francis de Sales has a long history of generous giving. I respectfully ask for the prayers, involvement, and sacrifice of many, if not all, in the parish in making a pledge towards the Fix-It Campaign in addition to the generosity you provide each Sunday offering. For example, **if 1,000 parishioners pledge the suggested amount of \$850 per year for 2 years, we will reach our campaign goal immediately to conclude the project.** Please, everyone, participate through a prayer and a pledge. All the funds we raise in the Fix-It Campaign stay within the parish. I want to express my gratitude to Deacon John Sfire, Jason Sfire, and Amie Paige of The Fidelity Group for doing an extensive study of our parish campus, as was presented in the Fix-It Campaign presentation. I have asked the Fidelity Group, under the leadership of Deacon John Sfire and Jason Sfire, to serve as Project Managers of the Fix-It Campaign. I also want to offer my appreciation for the guidance and involvement of Tom Purtell, Chair of the Parish Pastoral Council (PPC), Marty Bush, Member of the PPC; Mike Carlino, Chair of the Parish Finance Council; Doug Samz, Member of the Parish Finance Council; Christine DePrez, Cornerstone Bank Liaison; Laura Angelini, Business Manager; and Pam Lynch, Director of Youth and Young Adult Ministries.

made possible because people of faith banded together to work cohesively to accomplish a common goal.

Most important, we should come to church and receive holy Communion every week because we need to do so for our eternal salvation. Again, Jesus was clear, as recorded in the Gospel of St. John: "Amen, amen, I say to you, unless you eat the flesh of the Son of Man and drink his blood, you do not have life within you. Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood has eternal life, and I will raise him on the last day. For my flesh is true food, and my blood is true drink. Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood remains in me and I in him." (John 6:53-56).

It is customary to make New Year's resolutions, but odds are that most people have already forgotten or abandoned their New Year's resolutions by now. That being the case, I warmly invite you, in fact I plead with you: Please make a new and real New Year's resolution that you will keep, namely, a firm promise to come to Mass every week. That will benefit you infinitely more than anything else I could possibly imagine! If you already come to Mass every week, then please pass this invitation on to someone you know who is not coming to Sunday Mass, with your own warm words of encouragement.

May God give us this grace. Amen.

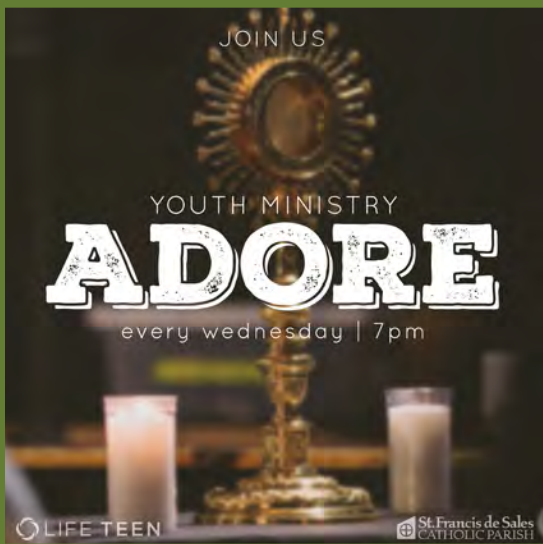
