DO NO HARM

We listen quite a while before we get to the "punch line" of the first reading today: even though it would be an easy thing to do, David will not harm the anointed one of the Lord. We, of course, know that Jesus is the Messiah, the anointed one of God, but the Bible uses this term for many different people. It is scripture's way of indicating who has been chosen by God for a special place and mission in salvation history.

In today's Gospel, Jesus presents a greatly enlarged list of those who, as children of God, we should not harm, but love instead: our enemies, those who curse us or do us harm, those who owe us money, the ungrateful, the wicked. The point of Jesus' teaching is not to encourage these kinds of behaviors in others, but rather to form us in the image of our heavenly Father by increasing our opportunities to love unconditionally, expecting no return; to be merciful and forgiving, even when it would be easier not to. Archdiocese of Chicago's Response to Sexual Abuse of Minors

Early and Decisive

1991

Cardinal Joseph Bernardin convened lay commission to review the Archdiocese of Chicago's procedures for handling accusations of sexual abuse.

1992

The Archdiocese of Chicago put in place policies and procedures to address allegations and issues related to sexual abuse of minors.

The Archdiocese of Chicago created the first Office of Victim Assistance Ministry to provide direct outreach and support to victims-survivors and their families.

The Archdiocese of Chicago created an independent office (now known as the Office of Child Abuse Investigations and Review) to receive allegations of abuse of minors by clergy.

1993

The Archdiocese of Chicago's Independent Review Board convened to review allegations of abuse and to make direct recommendations of the accused clergy's fitness for ministry to Cardinal.

Comprehensive and Sustained

The Archdiocese of Chicago created the **Office for the Protection of Children and Youth (OPCY)** in 2003 to bring together the various ministries within the archdiocese that had been operating to ensure the archdiocese is a safe place for children. The following offices work together to stay current on preventing and responding to child sexual abuse:

Office for Assistance Ministry (OAM) personnel reach out and extend supportive services to victims-survivors from the moment they come forward with an allegation of clergy sexual abuse. This includes traveling throughout the country

with personnel from the Office of Child Abuse Investigation and Review (CAIR) to meet with and listen to victims-survivors. OAM personnel also provide the opportunity for victims-survivors to get independent professional counseling from fully accredited therapists. Additionally, OAM personnel have worked in collaboration with victims-survivors to respond to their need for healing. This has led to the development of the Healing Garden, annual Mass for Hope and Healing and Pinwheel Service for Child Abuse Prevention, victim-survivor led peace circles, and the Healing Voices magazine. To date over 400 victims-survivors and family members have been served by OAM personnel.

Office of Child Abuse Investigation and Review (CAIR) is headed by a lay professional who provides a compassionate and thorough process for receiving and investigating reports of child abuse against archdiocesan personnel. Archdiocese personnel notify public authorities of all reports of possible abuse of any kind and from any date, regardless of legal requirements.

- The Director of CAIR serves as staff for the Independent Review Board, which is an advisory board for the Cardinal. The Board's main charges are ensuring the safety of children and determining a cleric's fitness for ministry. Over 230 recorded Board meetings have been held. The Board has determined 296 allegations of abuse to be substantiated and determined 75 allegations of abuse to not be substantiated.

Safe Environment Office personnel provide resources to educate archdiocesan clergy, employees and volunteers on how to prevent child sexual abuse, how to recognize sex offender behavior and how to create safe environments for children and youth.

Since 2003 more than 3,700 training sessions in the archdiocese have been held training more than 263,000 adults.

- Archdiocesan parishes and schools are required to provide valuable training to children and youth on how to recognize, respond and report grooming or abuse.
- Safe Environment Office personnel also screen, through name-based background checks, all clergy, employees and volunteers. Office personnel also receive and review fingerprint results for school personnel.

- All employees and volunteers who work with children and youth in the archdiocese must submit a CANTS (Child Abuse and Neglect Tracking Systems) Form.
- All employees and volunteers in the archdiocese must abide by the archdiocese's Code of Conduct.
- The archdiocese requires Mandated Reporter Training for all clergy, school personnel, religious education personnel, youth ministers and coaches as part of the archdiocese's Safe Environment Compliance.

Priest Monitoring Program is the Archdiocese of Chicago's stringent monitoring program of clergy with substantiated cases of sexual abuse against them. These men have been withdrawn from ministry and are prohibited from presenting themselves as a priest. They are required to comply with numerous restrictions to provide safety for the community, the program participants, and the Church.

The Charter for the Protection of Children and Young People

The *Charter for the Protection of Children and Young People* was approved in 2002 by the bishops of the United States Catholic Conference.

The latest revision was approved June 2018.

The Charter reinforced what the Archdiocese of Chicago was doing by requiring all dioceses to:

- Heal and promote reconciliation of victims-survivors and their families;
- Make prompt and effective response to abuse allegations;
- Cooperate with civil authorities;
- Discipline offenders;
- Create a safe environment for children and young people through training and screening;
- Provide means of accountability for the future and to ensure the problem continues to be effectively dealt with through the **Secretariat of Child and Youth Protection** and the **National Review Board**.

Every year the Archdiocese of Chicago participates in an audit of the implementation of the *Charter's* requirements. Every year the archdiocese passes the audit.

Deacon's Corner

We are still in Arizona and, I must admit, I am really enjoying being here. This is the first time in my past life that I have taken this much time (two full months) away from home (and the office). Before we left on December 30th, I had said I will come home for a few days every 3-4 weeks. I can say that never happened. I am so comfortable with the "goings on" in the office, that I have stayed here since arriving and have no intention of coming home until our stay here is complete. I am sleeping much more than I ever have, playing a lot of golf, being with great friends and just having a good time. Thanks Jason for making it all possible.

Thinking about a subject for today's DC, I was going through mine and Bobbi's joint checking account a few days ago and pulled up a check that she had written. We both have separate checks for the same account. I noticed a phrase that was written on her checks above the signature line that read; "WORK HARD, PRAY HARD". I read it a couple times, at first thinking it was a mis-print from the old expression; "Work hard, Play hard", but then I realized that this being Bobbi's check, the saying is not a surprise being as spiritual she is.

This brought to my mind many thoughts about myself and my younger days. I say that because, if you recall, my father was in the grocery business as I was growing up. And looking back at our lives in those days, working hard was a way of life, at least in our family. My father worked six days a week (in those days, no business was open on Sunday), and he left the house at 4:30AM every day and returned home around 5:30PM. Sunday, as Our Lord put it, was a day of rest. And I had the experience of going to work with him every day that I did not have school e.g. summer vacation, Christmas, Easter, Spring Break, etc.

Looking back, I believe that is what taught me a work ethic that I still have today. And when my father passed into the light when I was nineteen years old and I took over the operation of his business, I worked even more than I had in

the past when my father was alive. And having attended St. Clare grade school and Austin Catholic High School and attending Mass every day, I am convinced that my WORK HARD experience carried over into my PRAY HARD discipline from then until today as I write this.

I say all this because it kind of blends into the homily I gave this past Sunday here in AZ. It was based on the gospel of John, chapter 12:23-30. I suggest you stop for a moment, grab your Bible, and read this. I feel it is one of the most important gospels, and the main verse reads; "Unless a single grain of wheat falls into the earth and dies, it remains a single grain of wheat, but if it dies, it bears much fruit". You might ask; "Deacon John, what does this gospel have to do with WORK HARD, PRAY HARD, it seems to deal more with death than work and prayer?"

In a sense, you are correct. But I believe that work in our lives, prayers in our lives and our eventual death are all part of our spiritual journey to come to Eternal Salvation with Our Lord. While we can recognize the value in hard work, we must also recognize the value in hard prayer. You see, I believe that sometimes, perhaps most of the time we pray, we are usually asking Our Lord for something. Be it healing from an infirmity of ourself or others, a new job, a new house, new clothes, peace in our family or the world, and the list goes on and on. And while we pray hard for those things, our prayers seem to be a "to do" list for God. I say that is OK, but we should always add to our prayers; "Thy will be done", accepting and THANKING Our Lord for whatever outcome He sees fit.

As for the "death" part, I don't have enough paper to expound enough, so it will follow next week. But I will say that if we live in THE WORD OF GOD, there will be no fear or sadness when our time comes to enter into the light with Our Lord. More to follow.
