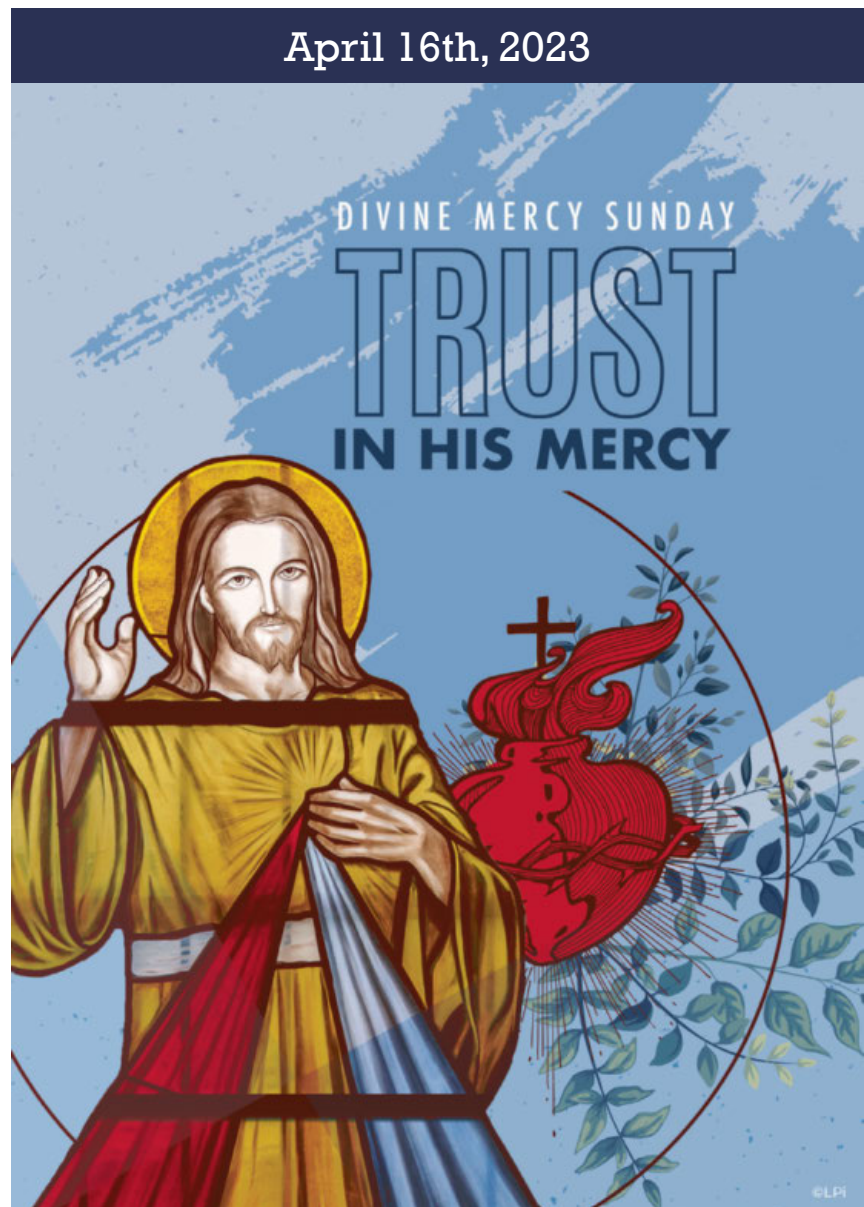

EXEMPLAR OF THE FAITH

Poor Thomas. Singled out from among the disciples because he refused to believe what they were telling him—that they had seen, in the flesh, their friend and their Lord, Jesus Christ. Can any of us really blame him? All of the disciples were terrified, crestfallen, hiding. But what of Thomas? Just where was he when Jesus appeared the first time to the group huddled in fear? He had gone "out"—out of the community where his faith had life. Maybe this was actually a blessing for Thomas and not the curse associated with the "doubting Thomas" moniker bestowed on him by tradition. Oh, the divine mercy of the Lord! Could Thomas be the forerunner of all of us who come in fragile hope and uncertainty to the Christian community, so beautifully described in the reading from the Acts of the Apostles? Could Thomas be an ultimate exemplar of the faith described in the First Letter of Peter?

The Doors We Lock

As a child, and even for a while as a teenager, I experienced an enormous amount of anxiety whenever I went to confession. For so many years I feared it. For so many years I waited in the confession line trembling, feeling sick to my stomach.

In the upper room after Christ's Passion and death, the anxiety of the disciples was so strong that they locked themselves away. But still Christ found a way into their midst. He would not be prevented from bringing mercy and hope to a place shrouded in despair. No door barred in a moment of fear could keep him out.

This is the genius of the sacrament of Reconciliation — and of all sacraments, really. Here we are, restricted in so many ways by an existence that is woefully physical. We feel fear, and our body reacts, just as we feel anger and our body reacts.

How can God deliver mercy to us in this flesh-bound state? Through that very flesh which can feel so confining. Through confession, which requires a physical action, and the physical participation not just of the penitent but of the priest.

I don't know how or why my anxiety around the sacrament has lessened over the years. Sometimes, I still feel it come roaring back unexpectedly, and maybe one day it will come back to stay. It doesn't surprise me: after all, I am in the flesh, and I will, as Peter says today, "suffer through various trials." But in all of them Christ will find me. He will not be kept away.

Why do we do that? Catholic Life Explained

Question:

Do children need to receive the Sacrament of Reconciliation before their First Communion?

Answer:

For centuries the Catholic Church has taught that a person needs to be in a state of grace (free from mortal sins) in order to worthily receive the Eucharist. To that end, Catholics should make an effort to celebrate the Sacrament of Reconciliation any time they recognize the need for the sacrament (and in keeping with the precept of the Church that asks that we celebrate this sacrament at least once each year).

In the case of children preparing for their First Communion, the Code of Canon Law is very clear that they should also celebrate the Sacrament of Reconciliation before receiving the Eucharist for the first time: "It is the responsibility, in the first place, of parents and those who take the place of parents as well as of the pastor to see that children who have reached the use of reason are correctly prepared and are nourished by the divine food as early as possible, preceded by sacramental confession" (Canon 914).

While some might question the significance of the Sacrament of Reconciliation — especially in the case of children who might not fully understand the reality of sin or the meaning of the sacrament itself — a child's "First Confession" can be a wonderful time for families to reflect together on the quality of their relationships, how they put their faith into practice, and, when it is possible, to celebrate the sacrament as a family. In the end, the celebration of these two sacraments marks important moments in the spiritual journeys of children and we hope their "First Confession" and "First Communion" help instill in them a love of the sacraments of the Church.

Liturgical Life

Now a week later his disciples were again inside and Thomas was with them. Jesus came, although the doors were locked, and stood in their midst and said, "Peace be with you." Then he said to Thomas, "Put your finger here and see my hands, and bring your hand and put it into my side, and do not be unbelieving, but believe." - Jn 20:26-27

A Eucharistic Revival that Renews the Church: Part II By Cardinal Blase Cupich

As I noted in [Part I](#) of this series, with his letter on liturgical formation, “Desiderio Desideravi,” Pope Francis has made a unique contribution to the three-year eucharistic revival launched by the U.S. Catholic bishops.

By showing the link between the Church remaining faithful to the mission of Christ and the celebration of the liturgy, the Holy Father is inviting “the whole Church to rediscover, to safeguard, and to live the truth and power of the Christian celebration, (lest) the beauty of the Christian celebration and its necessary consequences for the life of the Church ... be spoiled by a superficial and foreshortened understanding of its value or, worse yet, by its being exploited in service of some ideological vision, no matter what the hue.”

This Concern Is Not New

His concern about a superficial understanding of the liturgy that disconnects our worship from the Church’s mission is not new. Pope Pius XII warned that the liturgy cannot be understood merely as “decorative ceremonies or a mere sum total of laws and precepts that govern the cult” (“Mediator Dei”). So, too, the bishops who gathered for the Second Vatican Council 60 years ago made it clear that the aim of the liturgical reforms was not about cosmetically modernizing our worship.

Rather, like all of Vatican II’s reforms, the goals were “to impart an ever-increasing vigor to the Christian life of the faithful; to adapt more suitably to the needs of our own times those institutions which are subject to change; to foster whatever can promote union among all who believe in Christ; to strengthen whatever can help to call the whole of mankind into the household of the Church” (“Constitution on the Sacred Liturgy”).

The starting point for the renewal envisioned by the Council was the promotion of the full, active and conscious participation of all the baptized in the full breadth of church life, including the liturgy. Engaging all the members would be needed if the Church was going to respond to the precise challenges facing believers and all of humanity.

Historical Context

Consider the historical context of the decision by Pope St. John XXIII to call a council, and the contemporary challenges facing the Church. By the time Angelo Roncalli was elected pope in 1958, humanity in the 20th century was deeply divided, having suffered through a global pandemic and economic depression.



Similarly, Christians, particularly in Europe, expressed doubts about the significance of their faith following two world wars fought for the most part by “Christian nations.” People wondered whether faith and religion really mattered, since the Gospel of Christ, the Prince of Peace, preached and celebrated among these people for nearly 2,000 years, seemed to have little impact on these “Christian nations.” Likewise, many of the faithful expressed the concern that the only time the Church seemed to engage the world was to offer criticism or condemnation.

A “Light to All Nations”

For the Church to be a credible “light to the nations,” all her members need to embrace their responsibility for building solidarity within the human family and reaching out to it with love and concern. The bishops at the Council expressed this new vision of the role of each of the baptized and the Church as they addressed the modern world: “The joys and the hopes, the griefs and the anxieties of the men of this age, especially those who are poor or in any way afflicted, these are the joys and hopes, the griefs and anxieties of the followers of Christ. Indeed, nothing genuinely human fails to raise an echo in their hearts. For theirs is a community composed of men. United in Christ, they are led by the Holy Spirit in their journey to the Kingdom of their Father and they have welcomed the news of salvation which is meant for every man. That is why this community realizes that it is truly linked with mankind and its history by the deepest of bonds” (“Gaudium et Spes”).

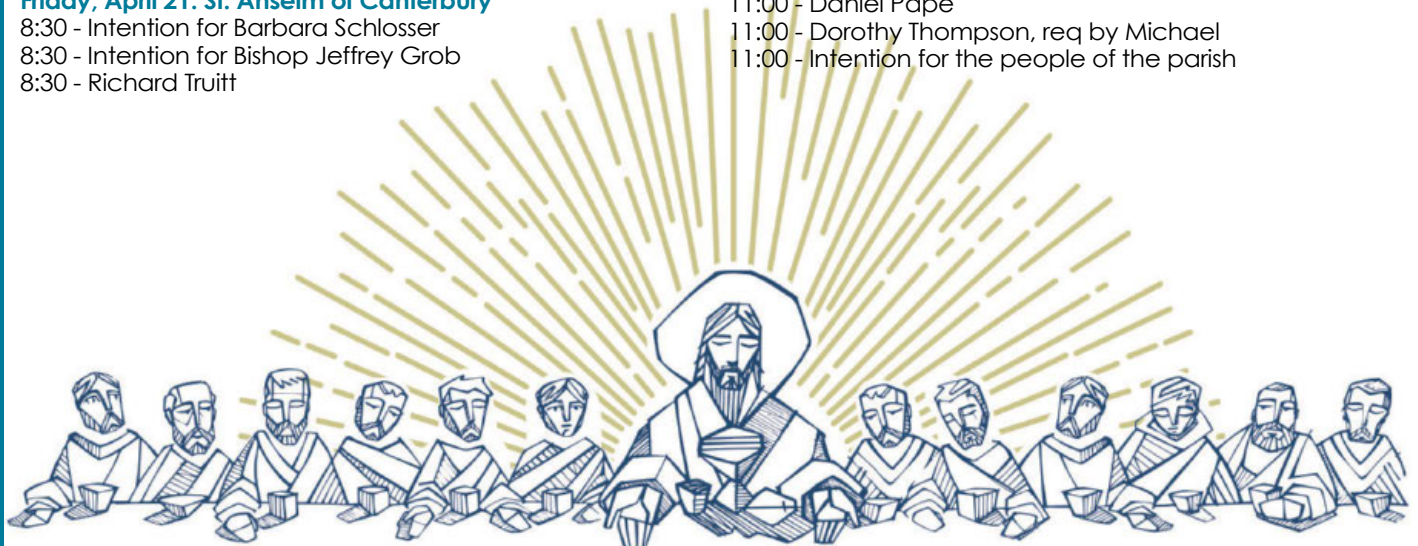
