

Deacon's Corner

t is Sunday afternoon and I am looking out my study window ride in on? Because in those days, a horse symbolized war at 5" of wet, heavy snow and more to come as we go into the evening hours. I guess the funny thing is that our weather report says it should be 70 on Tuesday. Go figure. That's enough about that.

Today is Palm Sunday and the beginning of Holy Week which culminates on Easter Sunday, the Resurrection of Our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ. I was fortunate enough to serve five Masses today and preach at four of them. Our new Vicariate Bishop, Alberto Rojas, presided at the 9:30 Mass and he preached that Mass. I bring this up because in the reflection Bishop Rojas gave, he mentioned something about Holy Week that struck a cord with me. As a matter of fact, the next two Masses I preached, I used his thought about Holy Week in my homily.

Bishop Rojas talked about Holy Week and how it is not the same for everyone. And what I gleened from what he was saying is that Holy Week is an individual thing for each of us. In other words, we can make it as holy (or not so holy) by our actions during the week. You see, the Church has numerous special events almost every day of the week, and it is everyone's own choice to participate (or not) in as many events as they choose. And really that makes perfect sense, although I had never looked at it from that perspective. So I encourage all of us to make this the best Holy Week ever. Spend more time than you would normally enjoying time in Church with Jesus and perhaps you will agree with the content of today's homily.

Today I spoke about what I feel are two significant themes and both are extremely important. They both pertain to Jesus Christ and His life, but more focused on His entrance into Jerusalem. Talking about that, I always wondered why Jesus chose a donkey (colt) to ride into Jerusalem. Also why did all of His followers lay palm branches covering the road as Jesus approached the city? Why didn't Jesus choose a horse to

and violence, a donkey symbolized peace. And the palm branches also symbolize peace. And that concludes your history lesson for today.

Going back to the themes that were the basis of my homily, they were LOVE and HUMILITY as shown by Jesus. When we were reading the Passion of Christ at all five Masses, one thing kept coming back to my mind. The fact that Jesus continued on His journey through life knowing that this week would come only culminating with His excruciating torture and death on the Cross, and yet He followed the will of His Father. He only asked His Father once "if you will, remove this cup from my hand, but if it is your will, I will follow". Jesus had known about the fate that awaited Him before He was born. So why did He go through with it? We all know that is a rhetorical question, but if Jesus had not suffered death and resurrect into Heaven "to sit at the right hand of His Father", OUR SINS WOULD NEVER HAVE BEEN FORGIVEN. And He did this out of LOVE for us, and for us to attain eternal salvation, He requires two things from US; "TO LOVE THE LORD, THY GOD, WITH YOUR HEART, MIND AND SOUL, AND LOVE YOUR NEIGHBOR AS YOURSELF". Most important to remember is that Our Lord said; "you cannot love the Lord and NOT your neighbor and expect to find the Kingdom of Heaven". You cannot have one without the other. And how HUMBLY did Jesus walk that path. Paul in 2 Corinthians 8:9 wrote; "you know the grace of Jesus Christ, that though He was rich, for our sake, He became poor, so that by His poverty you might become rich". Jesus walked this path to "empty

So let's finish this Lent by upgrading our own spiritual life by asking Jesus to strengthen us in LOVE and HUMILITY so we can embrace Him both now and forever.

The Catholic Church and turning away confirmation (compared with more That is the simplistic way of reporting still identify as Catholic). the results of several major surveys, but some data also suggests that this trend is not irreversible.

The study "Going, Going, Gone," released earlier this year by Saint Mary's Press and the Center for Applied Research in the Apostolate at Georgetown University, focused on young adults who were raised Catholic but have left the church. As the authors write, "A contributing factor in drifting away from the faith is the lack of companions on a spiritual. 
Eucharistic Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament
