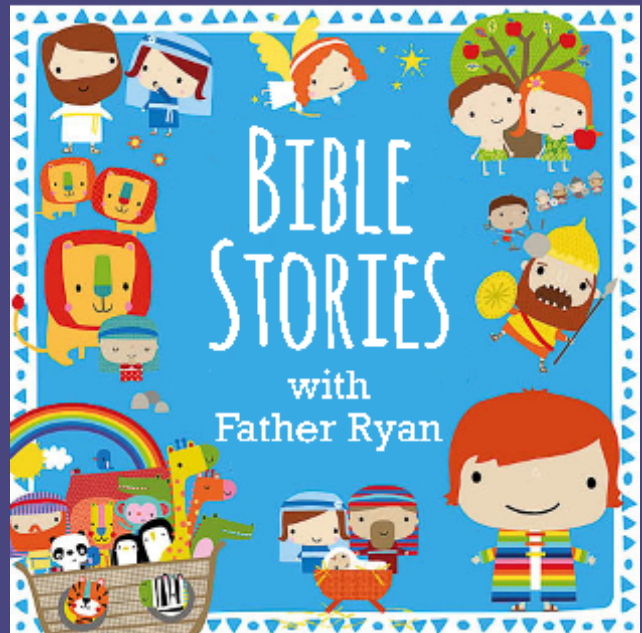

Deacon's Corner

Just a quick report. Achilles surgery last week went very well. Doctor was expecting to have to replace part of the tendon with another tendon from my foot but after opening up my leg, he determined that the second surgery was not necessary and was able to re-attach the Achilles to itself. That is big since it lessens recovery and PT time in the future. Thank you all for your thoughts and prayers as I am sure that is what helped the outcome. May God bless you all!

Being more homebound now than even before the surgery, and since I cannot put any weight on my leg for 6-8 weeks, I have more time now than ever to ponder subject matter for this week's DC. I keep coming back to the same area of thought and that is "how this present pandemic has and will continue to change our thinking on what is really important in our lives". I can say for me that I look at some of the most simple things that take place in my life, perhaps even take for granted, and now have developed a new and different outlook as to the blessings Our Lord has put in my life. Things like having a job, owning a company and helping others through employment opportunities, having enough food to eat each and every day, and the list goes on and on through and including the opportunity to have daily Mass live-streamed. How we have been so blessed.

How quickly approximately 30 million of our neighbors in the past couple months have lost their jobs, their weekly income and put them in a state of deep concern and desperation. The important thing that I want to stress is "we have to stop looking back at why and how this has happened". We have to stop trying to determine "who or what to blame" for this present situation. We must, as I mentioned in a homily last week, focus on "looking forward and stop looking back". I say this, as I have in the past, think about always looking behind you, your head turned away from going forward. By doing so, we might walk off a cliff or walk into a wall. And what does that accomplish? You are correct, nothing. We must look forward in our lives

and look to resolve any and all challenges put before us. Can we do this? I say YES.

Look back in the history of our country, of our society. We have really experienced more significant challenges than the one we are presented with today. And we have overcome them all, coming out stronger and better than before they took place. And how did we do it? From my perspective, we have been able to overcome enormous challenges primarily because of our faith in God. You see, that faith enabled us to find solutions to the challenges put before us. That faith, through prayers and continued belief in God, allowed us to "find the answers". We must trust in Our Lord to give us the answers to "give us back our lives". And I fully believe He will.

We must also trust in those in authority who are making decisions as to how to handle the future. Remember this is new to everyone. This health challenge is unprecedented, unusual, never before seen by any of us. In addition to putting our faith in Our Lord, we must give those in authority some leeway for the job they are doing. We may not always agree with some of their decisions, so that means for me, we must pray a little harder, pray more, speak with Our Lord to give them the guidance they need to help us overcome this health challenge. Don't try to second guess their decisions, but ask Our Lord to be their guiding hand. I am convinced that if enough of us ask Our Lord for His help, He will answer.

So in closing, I always say that no matter what happens in my life, it could always be worse. Think about that. For me, it makes any situation at the time seem a little more tolerable. I attribute those feelings to my faith in Our Lord. You see, I believe that Our Lord will "never give us more than we can handle". Sometimes that might be hard to accept or understand, but His love for us will always overcome present challenges.
