RECONCILED DIVERSITY

A few years ago, during Rome's quiet summer, Pope Francis took a day off to visit privately with some old friends, whose identity took Catholic Italy by surprise: Evangelical Protestants. They welcomed Francis to their Pentecostal Church of Reconciliation, where Francis asked pardon for Catholic persecutions and celebrated the Holy Spirit's "pentecostal work." Unlike Satan, declared Francis, who creates division among God's children, the Holy Spirit creates a diversity rich and beautiful. And unity; not uniformity, Francis specified, but unity in diversity. Francis named the Spirit's gift "reconciled diversity." Pentecost's rich treasury of scriptural readings, for Saturday's vigil and Sunday's morning liturgy, traces the Holy Spirit's work from creation's beginning, through Jesus' resurrection, into the church's earliest days, now into our days. Kindled in our hearts, the Spirit's gentle fire is ours to share generously, even with those most strikingly different from us. All hearts are Spirit-warmed by reconciled diversity.

First off ... How about Josh Thompson and the Lake Zurich High School Marching Band ... they are out here every single Memorial Day ... rain, sleet, snow, heat.

Last year it was 95 degrees. It's a bit more bearable today. Thank You LZHS Band!

I am again honored to be here with you this morning as we reflect upon the "usual" theme of Memorial Day ... "Remember".

As the only veteran on the Lake Zurich Village Board ... I Remember.

We celebrate Memorial Day with parades and picnics, and we welcome in the unofficial beginning of summer. But ... We cannot and we should not forget what this day is really all about.

Remember ... the men and women who died while serving our country ... and the sacrifices that they and their families have made on behalf of our country.

As I thought about today and what I would say ... that hasn't already been said about Memorial Day (some things will be included in the Proclamation I will read in a few minutes) ... I had a thought about ... "the letter". "The letter" ... the one that starts with the so very sad phrase,

"It is with deep regret that I inform you of the death of ..."

and the unfathomable grief and sense of loss suffered by the spouses, parents and families who have received "the letter" ... a grief that cannot be relieved.

I began to think about how Memorial Day means more than just honoring and revering our war dead, but also to honor and revere those families who lost their loved ones.

These people truly know what sacrifice is, for it is they who have lost their loved ones, it is they who have had to go on and persevere, it is they whose lives have completely changed, It is they who have made, and continue to make, a sacrifice, each and every day, for our nation

For they did not die in defending our nation's honor and protecting our freedoms, but their loss is forever felt, and must be, of equal importance.

We must recognize that.

In the name of duty and service to our country that cost their loved ones their lives, they are the true, living face

of Memorial Day.

On behalf of all the families of the Village of Lake Zurich, I wish to thank all the Veterans and their families, all the local Veterans who could not attend today, and all our local sons and daughters presently serving in the military.

I extend our sincerest gratitude and thanks for your sacrifices as you make our country a better place for all of us.

I hope you enjoy the weekend ... but I hope you pause to reflect and remember.






