

Reflections from George Stewart, President of the St Vincent de Paul Conference

The Society of St Vincent DePaul was founded in France in 1833 under the direction of blessed Frederic Ozanam. Born in 1813 he became a French literary scholar, journalist, lawyer and equal rights advocate. While a university student his faith was challenged by those who asked him what the Catholic Church was doing for the poor. In response he joined with a group of friends to form the Conference of Charity. The group was soon influenced by Blessed Sister Rosalie Rendu and the Daughters of Charity. She urged them to take the St Vincent DePaul as their patron saint and follow his teachings. The Daughters of Charity had spent many years caring for the needy in the slums of Paris. The conference adopted their methods of work and founded the Society of St Vincent DePaul. From then on they would be known as Vincentians. With over 800,000 members in 135 countries the society has helped millions of people in seeking charity and justice.

47 years ago a group of church members came together in a common effort to grow spiritually and fellowship by offering person-to-person service to help those in need. They joined the Chicago area St Vincent de Paul Society and with their help created the St Francis de Sales Conference. They started a pantry in the garage next to the original church. They did home visits all over Ela Township while keeping client files in the trunk of a car. From those early days all the way to today, the group has had the support of the good people of this parish. We value your support and work to keep your trust. Some years ago the pantry was moved to the Ministry Center and office space was provided.

St. Francis de Sales we have over 440 families in our database and serve their pantry needs 50 weeks a year. We Vincentians gather on Thursday evenings to serve an average of over a 110 families every pantry night.

57% of the food that we provide is donated from local community sources such as the Jewels from Lake Zurich, Barrington and Buffalo Grove, Target in Lake Zurich, Peapod, Mariano's and individual families. Food drives are held for us at Peace Lutheran Church, local schools, Menards and at the Old Post Office. During the summer we also receive donations from the Smart Farm in Barrington and from the Jubilee Garden. The Northern Illinois Food Bank is a source for discounted food purchases that we use monetary donations for.

Every week the society harvesters collect food donations and another group arranges and organizes the pantry

for distribution. Kathleen Murray and Stan Gudas set up the pantry efforts. We want to thank Pam Lynch and Cathy Chiarelli for allowing confirmation candidates to give service hours to the pantry. Lake Zurich High School Service Group has also provided many student hours of service. We thank them and all the many other volunteers that give their time and efforts. Last year over 9,000 hours of service was given. Sioban O'Leary handles the placement of workers each pantry evening.

We support Emmaus house here at Saint Francis de Sales Church by providing the meals and the fifth Sunday of the month.

In the last year, 30 families of Ela Township received over \$200,000 in financial assistance for rent, utilities and emergency housing expenses. The case workers, under the direction of Diane Brumley, meet with clients to assess their needs and work with other local agencies to find the best way to help them. Many times we coordinate our efforts with the Ela Township Social Services. At times we combine resources with other conferences to give help for special needs and disaster relief.

We report in are accountable to Lake County District 1, the Chicago area and the National Society of St Vincent de Paul, located in St Louis, for an annual service and financial statement. We also share information with Father Ryan. Alice Hnilo and Jim Westney are responsible keeping Financial records and collecting data. No member in our conference receives a salary or financial benefit from our efforts. we have a board of directors that needs 10 times a year to review and approve Financial reports and Conference programs.

We are always welcoming to those who want to give assistance. If you would like to gain experience and helping directly with residences or just want to give a hand a couple of days a month, stop by and speak with us after Mass. You would enjoy talking with you. I can discuss specific types of volunteer positions available. Check out our website and read today's bulletin for specific financial service information. Think about getting involved. We can use your help!

Intentional Disciples: Following Jesus (purposeful and deliberate)

Sherry Weddell's Forming Intentional Disciples

Statistics from the PEW Research Center (www.siena.org, pg. 4): For every 100 people who identify as Catholic:

- 51 never show up
- 45 go to Mass once a month
- 4 are the core, committed people who make church activities happen

Other Statistics:

- Only 30% of people who were raised Catholic are still practicing (p. 24).
- The fastest growing demographic is currently the un-affiliated/"NONE" (p. 19).
- Of the people who left to go to another church—the majority said their spiritual needs were not being met and they found a religion they liked more (p. 28).
- Of the people who left to become a NONE—the majority said they "just drifted away" and "stopped believing in the religion's teachings" (p. 32).

The key—and it's all about a Relationship with Jesus

The thresholds of Conversion:

- **Trust**—A person is able to trust or has a positive association with Jesus, the Church, or a Christian believer.
- **Curiosity**—A person is intrigued by or desires to know more about Jesus, His life, His teachings, or some aspect of the Christian faith.
- **Openness**—A person acknowledges to himself or herself

and to God that they are open to the possibility of a personal and spiritual change.

- **Seeking**—The person moves from being passive to an active seeking to know God.
- **Intentional Discipleship** (following Jesus)—This is the decision to "drop your nets" to commit to follow Jesus as an obedient disciple.

As the Catechism and Matthew 28:19-20 states: "The Church by her very nature is missionary, sent by Christ to all the nations to make disciples of them." (CCC 767, Mt 28:19-20) Our goal/the Church's goal is to follow Jesus' call and help others follow Jesus' call.

Keith also facilitated the Archdiocese Intentional Discipleship day with Sherry. He is the former Director of the Office for the New Evangelization and a deacon for the Archdiocese of Chicago.

He has identified 3 steps in this process:

- **Making**—make disciples—help people encounter Jesus and say yes.
- **Maturing**—grow and deepen their relationship—once you get it, you long to know Jesus more.
 - Sacraments are seen in a new way.
 - Living a moral life is not imposed, is a choice, a response.
- **Missioning**—go out and share with others.

When you are a disciple, when you choose to follow Jesus—You long to know Jesus more...

Notes on Intentional Discipleship/Parish Mission from the Parish Pastoral Council Meeting Minutes (October 28, 2018)

Judy Reilly gave the group an update on Intentional Discipleship and the Parish Mission. She distributed a handout so everyone could follow along. The topics she discussed included the following:

Why make disciples?

How do we make Jesus Christ relevant in people's lives, and how do we offer others this gift of friendship with Jesus?

The timeline of the Parish's mission of Intentional Discipleship from 2007, when there were Bible study classes, through August 2017, when Deacon Keith Strohm was brought on board, to today's date when there are now the Build and Equip groups.

Formation Fruit: Judy discussed what groups have

developed as "fruit" of this mission which include the Called and Gifted workshop, the Growing Disciples corner in the church bulletin and newsletter, a mom's group, continued monthly meetings of first generation of Equip, Judy speaking at the school to staff regarding discipleship, the ABLAZE parish mission, and now the second generation groups of BUILD (building a friendship with Jesus) and EQUIP (equipping with tools needed to share Jesus with others). There are currently 32 facilitators with 135 new participants comprised of 31 in EQUIP and 102 in BUILD.

What's next?

- A 3rd generation of Build/Equip
- Alpha – A formation process exploring the big issues and the basics of the Christian faith, including the Gospel message. This would take place over 11 weeks.
- 2019 Mission
- The continuation of Bible study

Deacon's Corner

This past Sunday, we celebrated the Feast of Pentecost. Many have called Pentecost the "birthday of the Church". It was the time that Jesus instilled in His disciples the Holy Spirit with the direction to "go out and teach ye all nations". And what is most important to understand is that Jesus was not just giving this direction to the group of disciples gathered in the upper room, he was directing all of us, for we are all disciples of Our Lord.

The question I ask today is; "how much time in our life do we truly obey the Lord?" That question, at least for me, provoked a great deal of thought. Because we are Catholic, we should obey the Lord in all that we do and say, each and every day, but do we? I, for one, know that I do not. Not all of the time. It is easy to engage in Christian activities because it is the right thing to do, but God, our Heavenly Father, wants us to obey Him, His teachings, His Commandments out of love, joy and gratefulness, not out of obligation. He wants to pour Himself into us, to shine through us, and show His genuine love for us so that we will join Him in His mission here on earth. Remember, God has already sent His only begotten Son to walk among us, be persecuted by us, and die on the Cross of Salvation in order for us to gain eternal life. But that was just the beginning, not the end of His mission here on earth. God has left all of us to join Him, as He did with the twelve apostles, to continue to spread the Word of the Lord to all corners of the earth.

When Jesus chose His twelve apostles, he chose Peter (Simon) to be the Head of the Church. And we know that Peter, as were many of the other Apostles, was uneducated and who had no idea about what was to become of him when Jesus said; "Come follow me, I will make you fishers of men". But they all put down their lives and followed Jesus. They all began to "start over" as they

watched Him perform miracles, preach to the multitudes and finally suffer persecution and death on the Cross. But during their time with Him, Jesus instilled in each of them the power of the Holy Spirit to go out and "preach the Word of God". And they did, for this was the Will of God that they follow His direction as we also should do for I say again, "we are all disciples of Jesus Christ".

So it is with us, even today, that God fills us with the power of the Holy Spirit to go out and "preach the Word of God". How do we do that, you ask? By listening to what God says to us each day. And each day, He might say something different to us, we might have to change our direction, we may have to do something that we don't like, but knowing that all that He does and says to us is the right thing to do. We all know that there will be constant challenges from the evil one that will attempt to steer us in the direction away from Christ, but we must be strong and persevere in our journey toward eternal salvation.

So when I decided to put the header at the top reading; "It is never too late to start over", I don't mean that we must begin a new life. But it affords us the opportunity to redirect our focus of "what is important" in our lives and the most important conclusion we must always arrive at is that our obedience to Our Lord and Savior is the most important thing in our lives. Mainly because obedience to Him will cause all other facets of our lives to fall into place and bring us to everlasting life.
