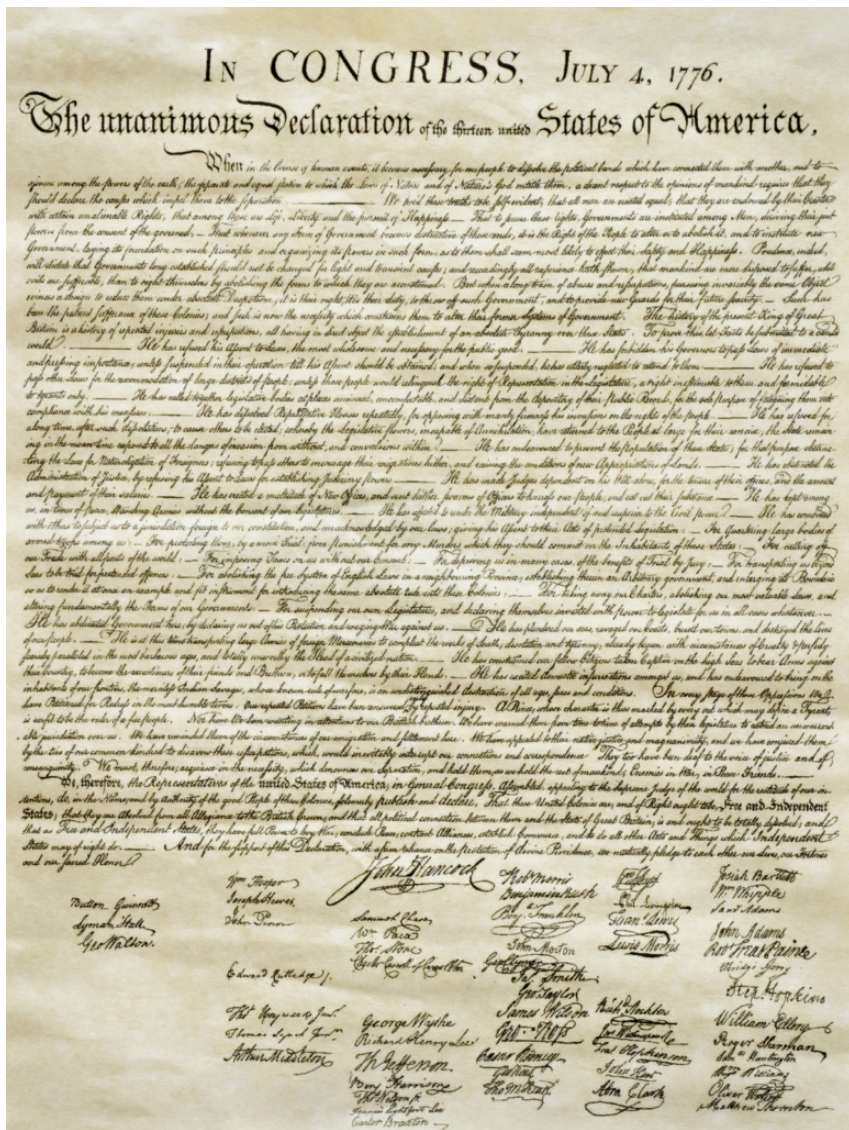

On June 10, the Archdiocese certified our parish for a gradual reopening of Masses. It is truly a special blessing to worship Jesus in our church building, gathering together and receiving His Body. As we keep our eyes fixed on Jesus, we find that He is always with us and has a good plan for our future. Our HOPE and TRUST is in Him.

Daily Noon Mass: We are excited to have you join us in church again to celebrate our daily noon Masses. At this time, 50 worshippers or less will be able to gather in our church for daily Mass. Registration required.

The daily Mass will continue to be live streamed to YouTube and Facebook.

Sunday Mass: On June 28, we began inviting 50 people to our 6:30am & 9am Sunday Masses. Registration required.

The 9am Mass will continue to be live streamed to Youtube & Facebook.

Outdoor Sunday Mass: We will continue to offer our Sunday 11:15am Mass outside in the west parking lot. No registration is required.

Private Prayer: Our church will be open to 10 or less for private prayer on weekdays between the hours of 2pm and 3pm. We will continue with Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament on Wednesdays during the hour of private prayer. We are using a registration process (see below)

Mass Broadcast: A previously recorded Mass will be broadcasted on Wednesdays at 7am & 4pm, Fridays at Noon, and 12:30pm on Sundays by the Village of Lake Zurich on Comcast cable channel 4 and AT&T U-Verse channel 99.

SHARE THE BURDEN

"Come to me, all you who labor and are burdened, and I will give you rest" (Matthew 11:28). These words of our Savior seem to be in stark contrast to the previous chapter from the same Gospel, when we were told that if we do not take up our crosses, we are not worthy of Christ. Connecting these two messages might help us on our faith journeys. Being a follower of Christ surely means that we must embrace the cross, in its mystery of both suffering and triumph. This is something that we need not do alone, for the burden is often too heavy for us to carry by ourselves. Who, then, do we turn to? We can turn to the Body of Christ—the community of disciples gathered for worship. When we find the burden too heavy, let us remember that we can share that burden with our Christian sisters and brothers, who can help bring us rest.

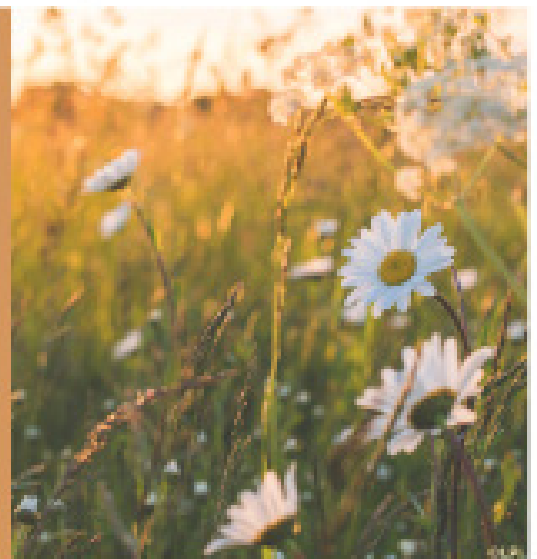

GOSPEL MEDITATION

Encourage Deeper Understanding of Scripture

We are all familiar with the refrain, "You have put on Christ. In him you have been baptized. Alleluia, alleluia!" In Baptism, we "put on" Christ. In putting on Christ, we put on all that Christ is and represents: hope, faith, and love. We are no longer bound to the sins and failures of the flesh, that part of us that resists God and relies exclusively on human means. It also means that we are not in debt to our past, complete with its sins, failures, regrets, fears, and unfulfilled dreams. There is always hope. In putting on Christ, we put on God's vision for the world, for all of His children and for us. We have been given a road map to guide our paths and a blueprint to follow for our life's journey.

There is no need for regret, and we are not tethered to our past. Is there anything in your past that you regret? Any decision or memory that continues to haunt you? We have all made mistakes, and we have this uncanny ability to continue beating ourselves up over things we can no longer do anything about, except learn from them. To put on Christ means that I can now bring God's unconditional love to my hurtful memories and sinful choices. With each new moment and every new choice, I can start clean and live in freedom.

Imagine adults when the disciples were preaching and baptizing. They came to baptism not really knowing who they were, with pasts that were broken, seeking to live the joy of the Gospel they heard spoken to them and wanting the love they saw witnessed in the lives of those who believed. What tremendous celebrations their baptisms must have been! They could now have the support of a community, full participation in the sacraments of the church, focus for their disordered lives, consolation, healing, and an understanding of what life is really all about.

Our lives are meant to be celebrations of the Spirit we have received in Baptism. How does that joy get expressed in and through you? When we truly understand that we have put on Christ, our burdens can become much lighter. It is odd that so many Christians look like they are carrying the weight of the world on their shoulders. Wouldn't it be wonderful if those weights could be lifted and joy experienced?

Virtual EUCHARISTIC ADORATION

THEOLOGY 101

BY FATHER LOUIS J. CAMELI, S.T.D.

QUESTIONS AND ANSWERS

In 1929, Paulist Father Bertrand Conway published a very popular book: *The Question Box*. He collected questions from participants in parish missions, whom he met in his travels around the country. On occasion, I will use this popular format for our Theology 101 feature in the *Lumen Cordium* magazine. Our launch begins below.

Q. Is hell real? Isn't God ultimately merciful? How could he punish someone forever?

A. Yes, Virginia, hell is a real possibility. It has nothing to do with God punishing people for what they have done or failed to do. Hell is radically a state of separation from God that is of our own making. It is about our freedom and the horrible possibility that lies in our hands when we push away from God, who never imposes himself on us. *The Catechism of the Catholic Church* teaches: "To die in mortal sin without repenting and accepting God's merciful love means remaining separated from him forever by our own free choice. The state of definitive self-exclusion from communion with God and the blessed is called 'Hell.'" (1033) The Church's teaching about hell, the *Catechism* adds, means taking responsibility for our freedom and embracing a continuous conversion of heart. Remember the words of St. John of the Cross: "In the evening of our lives, we will be judged by how we have loved."

Q. I'd like to read the Bible, but where do I start? How do I not end up getting confused and maybe missing the real message?

A. Ideally, you may want to join a parish group that together reads, studies and prays with the Bible with the help of commentaries. This approach is available in many places, and it is worth checking with your parish to see if it's available. Another possibility might be to begin on your own by following the Sunday readings for the liturgy.

The texts, along with commentaries, are available at the Bishops' Conference website at usccb.org/bible. If you read and pray the Sunday texts during the week, you will be ready to hear the word proclaimed and preached at Mass. Over time, the cycle of readings covers a good portion of the Bible.



Q. How often should I go to confession? If I don't think I've committed serious sin, should I still go to confession?

A. If we are conscious of serious sin and we repent of it, we should seek forgiveness through the sacrament of penance as soon as possible. If we examine our conscience and perceive that our relationship with God is broken, we ought to take all necessary steps to mend it. That includes contrition and confession. But what about less serious, or venial, sin? The *Catechism* has this to say: "Without being strictly necessary, confession of everyday faults (venial sins) is nevertheless strongly recommended by the Church. Indeed, the regular confession of our venial sins helps us form our conscience, fight against evil tendencies, let ourselves be healed by Christ and progress in the life of the Spirit. By receiving more frequently through this sacrament the gift of the Father's mercy, we are spurred to be merciful as he is merciful." (1458) There is no exact formula for determining how often we ought to approach this sacrament. I often suggest to people that they come with a frequency that enables them to stay in touch with how much they depend on the mercy of God in their lives. ■
