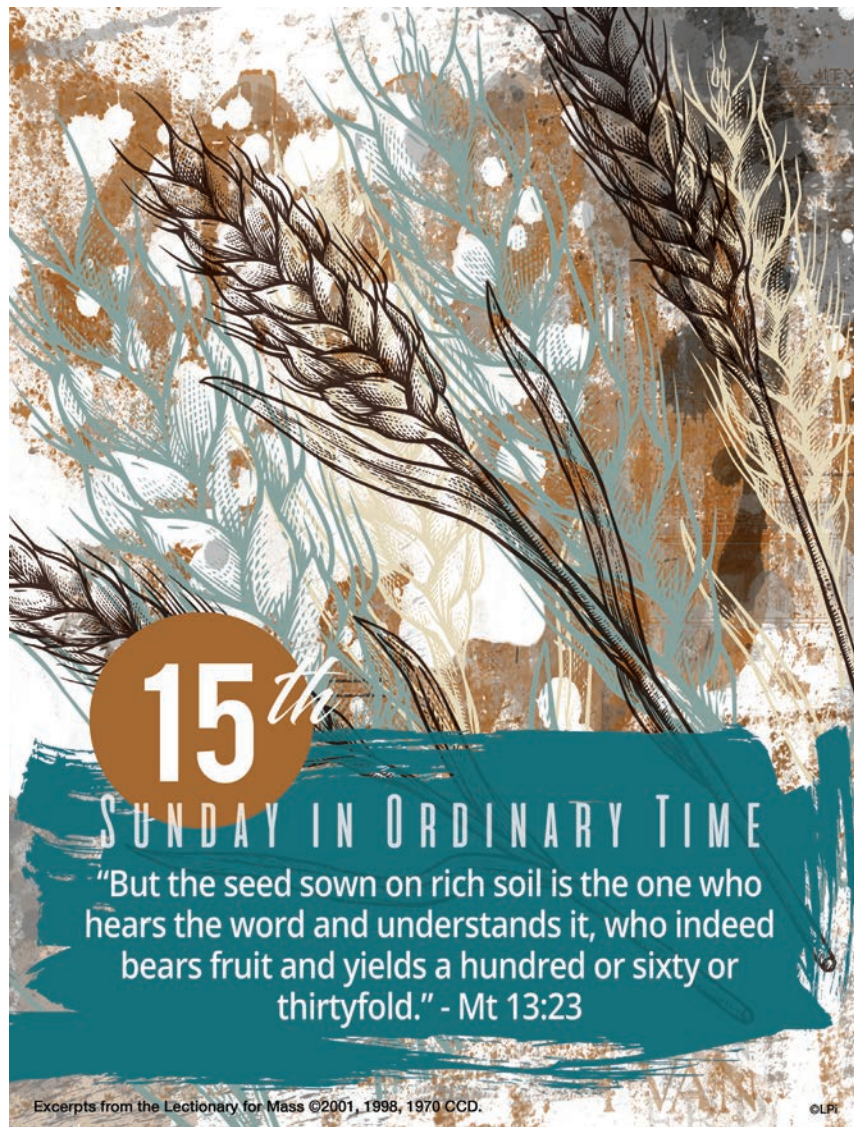

Daily Noon Mass: We are excited to have you join us in church again to celebrate our daily noon Masses. At this time, 50 worshippers or less will be able to gather in our church for daily Mass. Registration required.

The daily Mass will continue to be live streamed to YouTube and Facebook.

Sunday Mass: On June 28, we began inviting 50 people to our 6:30am & 9am Sunday Masses. Registration required.

The 9am Mass will continue to be live streamed to Youtube & Facebook.

Outdoor Sunday Mass: We will continue to offer our Sunday 11:15am Mass outside in the west parking lot. No registration is required.

Private Prayer: Our church will be open to 10 or less for private prayer on weekdays between the hours of 2pm and 3pm. We will continue with Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament on Wednesdays during the hour of private prayer. We are using a registration process (see below)

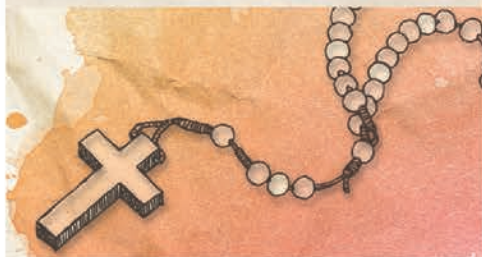

GOSPEL MEDITATION

Encourage Deeper Understanding of Scripture

Using the best seeds doesn't always guarantee the best plants. An older Italian gentleman straight from Italy gave me these amazing tomato seeds that he claimed produced the best tomatoes ever grown. Without doubt, the fruit he shared with me was a testament to that fact. These tomatoes were amazing! I couldn't wait until the next growing season to plant these seeds and harvest my own tomatoes. The whole experiment ended up a failure. I did everything the gentleman said, but my fruit didn't even come close. What happened? At first I was perplexed, then some years later the light dawned. The problem wasn't the seeds, it was the soil!

You cannot sow seeds in any old place and in a haphazard way and expect them to be at their best. It doesn't work that way. Planting the seeds is the easiest part. Preparing the soil is the challenge. Tilling, mulching, enriching, and building up the nutrients are all required for good fruit. Then after the seeds are planted, more care is required in order to maintain that healthy, nutrient rich environment for those seeds to sprout, grow, and flourish. God happily sows the seeds of his Word. What do we do with them?

If we expect to be a passive bystander and have good fruit magically grow, we are mistaken. Bearing the good fruit of God's Word requires preparation and work. We have to cultivate the soil of our lives so that those seeds can find a proper home. This one thing alone takes a great deal of patience, time, and effort. What kind of preparation have we put into our lives so that we can be a recipient of God's seed? It takes a great deal of soul-searching and ego-checking to properly prepare. God is the ever faithful and persistent sower. If the seeds do not bear fruit the first time, God will come back time and time again, giving it another try.

If we have created a suitable bed for sowing, then once the seed is sown, we must properly maintain them. What is our maintenance plan for the seeds of God's Word? We need not only a source for water but a watering schedule. We need to weed, aerate the soil, nurture the young plants, protect them, and provide proper nutrients. What does our spiritual maintenance plan look like? If we have done all things well, imagine what the seeds of God's Word could produce in us!

Deacon's Corner

Have you ever given much thought to the expression; "status quo"? I am not sure I have either although this afternoon (Sunday), I realized that I should begin thinking about a subject for this week's DC and this is what came to mind. "Status quo" kind of reminds me of "same old, same old" so I began to give some thought to how that expression really pertains to me and my life.

The first thing that comes to my mind when I think about "status quo" has only to do with physical and/or material things in my life. Remember, I am only expressing my own views in each DC that I write. I only hope that all who read it end up asking themselves some questions about its content and how it might relate to each of us.

I know while growing-up (and sometimes I think I still am), the physical and/or material parts of my life seemed to be important to me. Those parts of my life were something I never took for granted. I always felt, and many times still do, that I should always continue to improve both aspects of my life in order for me to be happy. How about you? Can you relate to what I am saying? And while many of you who read this are my age or near to it, at least I realize that as time goes on, sometimes I feel like the "old machine" is slowing down a bit from where it used to be. The important thing is that this is OK.

Looking back in time, I can see where I may not have put the same emphasis on the continued development of my spiritual life as I did other aspects as mentioned above. So I have posed the question to myself as to why? Perhaps as we go through life, we may take for granted that all that we have been taught, all that we have learned and/or experienced regarding our spiritual development had come from an outside source. What I mean by that is, having attended Catholic schools for twelve years of education, and being taught religion every year, we may have felt that we have "learned all we need to learn" to be OK in our spiritual development. If you think back, the Catholic Church has made some doctrinal changes over time, but never changed the

basic premise that "Jesus Christ became human to die on the Cross, only to Resurrect on the third day". And why did He do this? I know we all know the answer to that question. So that our sins may be forgiven. Jesus Christ died on the Cross so that we can have life

Remember, Jesus knew what His journey on earth was to consist of. He knew that He would be ridiculed, spat upon, scourged at the pillar, crowned with thorns and then nailed to a Cross. But what if Jesus had said, "Father, I don't want to do this, I don't want this to happen to Me". Where would we be today? How would we look at our life without Jesus Christ having laid down His life for us? Everything Jesus did in His life put Him "in harms way". He never lived in "status quo". He never did the "same old, same old". From the moment Jesus changed the water into wine at the wedding in Cana, His public life began. And He never stopped healing, praying, preaching, teaching even until the time of His death on the Cross. Was His life agonizing at times, yes. But Jesus persevered for us.

As I have been talking and writing about this recent Season of Pentecost, I suggest we make a change in our lives that will last forever. Let's get off the "status quo" wagon and make some commitments to Our Lord and ourselves about moving our spiritual life to the next level. And don't think for a minute that you are "as far as you can go" in your own spiritual development. If you think that for one minute, you are listening to the evil one sitting on your left shoulder advising you the wrong way. Listen to your guardian angel on your right shoulder who will always give you the correct advice. For our guardian angel is like a conduit giving us advice from Our Lord and Savior and we know that is always "good" advice. So always remember, "it is never too late to do the right thing".

SACRAMENTS

Sacrament of Baptism: Baptism is celebrated after parental participation in a preparation meeting. Please call the Parish Office for a date to attend. Do not finalize your plans until this formation meeting.

Sacrament of Confirmation: Preparation for Confirmation takes place during the high school years with the celebration of the Sacrament taking place no sooner than the end of sophomore year in high school. For more info and registration please contact the Youth Ministry Office at 847-726-4842.

Sacrament of Reconciliation: Saturdays between 11am and Noon.

Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick: This Sacrament offers the Lord's healing strength and peace to anyone who is seriously or chronically ill, hospitalized, or about to undergo surgery. Please contact the Ministry Center 847-438-6622, or Fr. Ryan at 847-726-4723 if you wish to have someone anointed, or the Last Rites near death.

Sacrament of Marriage: Arrangements should be made at least six months in advance and no other plans should be finalized until the Parish Priest or Deacon has been consulted.

Sacraments for Adults: Adults interested in the Sacraments of Initiation (Baptism, Eucharist, Confirmation) should contact the Ministry Center at 847-438-6622.
