Immigration Letter

Dear Brothers in Christ,

I write to you again to express my support as we stand together in solidarity with many of our parishioners were deeply troubled by government actions related to refugees and immigrants. Despite our repeated calls through the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB) For comprehensive and compassionate reform of our broken immigration system, our voices in our prayers have gone unanswered.

Moreover, conditions at the U.S. Mexico border have continued to deteriorate with daily reports of the overcrowded and inhumane conditions to which are brothers and sisters - and particularly children - are being subjected. Compound the situation, the president has recently announced that US Immigration and Customs Enforcement (ICE) raids will occur in US Cerise sometime after the July 4th holiday, "unless we do something miraculous." We have also learned that the expected ICE raids will target not only people with deportation orders, but also any undocumented person.

Threats of broad enforcement actions by ICE are meant to terrorize communities, adding to the suffering of thousands of children and families. Forming our immigration system must be accomplished and a bipartisan effort that keeps the dignity of all persons at the forefront of decision making. It is simply immoral to use human beings as bargaining chips in the negotiations and sweeping raids as inducements to capitulation.

I reaffirm that the Archdiocese of Chicago supports the dignity of all persons without regard to immigration status. Standing together, however, does not imply that we stand idly by and simply watch as fear grips the most vulnerable in our society, pushing them further into the shadows.

To that end, in coordination with the USCCB and other

organizations, we have developed educational resources and the legal options available to immigrants. Links to these materials, available in both English in Spanish, accompany this letter. I ask that you review these resources and share them with your parishioners through your bulletins and other direct forms of communication.

Many of our parishes are already providing pastoral accompaniment, legal Information and educational resources for immigrant families and individuals across Chicagoland in the Immigration Ministry of the Office of Human Dignity and Solidarity. https:/pvm.archchicago.org/human-dignity-solidarity/immigration-ministry/about-us. If you would like this assistance for your parish, please contact Miguel Salazar, are Senior Coordinator for local Immigration Ministry, at msalazar@archchicago.org or 312-534-8509.

As a reminder, we have not named our churches as "sanctuaries" solely because it would be irresponsible to create false hope that we can protect people from law-enforcement actions, however unjust or inhumane we may view them to be. Moreover, immigration law does impose criminal penalties and fines on anyone who conceals, harbors or shields from detection, in any place, an alien who has entered or remains in the United States in violation of the law.

Per Archdiocesan policy, only those who are ordained and assigned to live in the rectory or another ecclesiastical facility may reside there. Specifically, this means that written permission of the Archbishop or the Vicar General is needed for those not assigned there.

Before you allow immigration officials entry to parish premises, please ask for identification, the reason for the visit, and any documents pertaining to their need to enter, such as a warrant. If they have a warrant from ICE, please ask them politely for the Catholic, parish-based immigration ministries. Please opportunity to review the warrant and to contact legal counsel for the Archdiocese of Chicago, before they enter and contact the office of Legal Services immediately, (Olgo Rojas at 312-534-8332). If they do not want to wait, have someone contact the Office of Legal Services while you cooperate with the government official. If They do not have a warrant and it is not a situation where someone is in imminent danger, tell them politely they cannot come on the premises, ask them for the contact information, and tell them to contact the Office of Legal Services. You should then contact legal services to report this interaction.

Please know we will continue to provide services, such as food, shelter and legal aid through a related organizations, including Catholic Charities, Archbishop of Chicago

regardless of a person's national origin, religion or immigration status. For more information on Catholic Charities Services, visit https://www. catholiccharirites.net.

Once again, you should never he sitate to reach out to our Office of Legal Services (Olgo Rojas at 312-534-8332) if you have any questions. Additionally, Rebekah Azar Rashidfarokhi, from Chicago Volunteer Legal Services has offered to host community presentations and/or legal clinics in our parishes. if you are interested, please contact Ms. Rashidfarokhi at (312-332-7399). You can also refer your parishioners to Catholic Charities Legal Assistant department, at 312-948-6821, for individual safety plan assistance.

Next week, the Archdiocese of Chicago is hosting representatives from 13 Catholic US diocese at the Instituto Pastoral Migratoria July 10-14, 2019 at the Catholic Theological Union. Members of the archdiocese's Pastoral Migratoria will train diocesan, pastoral and lay leader on how to start their own ministry with the goal of forming a nationwide network of

pray for the participants and the success of this important program.

Join me in also extending prayers to those who have been directly affected by our government's unfortunate actions, as well as to those living in fear who may fall victim to indiscriminate enforcement activities.

Please accept my personal thanks for all you do with and for your parishioners during these emotionally trying times. Please be supportive of one another and know that I stand with you.

JULY 9, 2019 Deacon's Corner

n many of my DCs in the past, I spoke about "spirituality" from two different perspectives. And today I want to continue with the thoughts about "spirituality" as it pertains to all of us personally. Keep in mind that I am writing from my own experiences and pray that all who are reading this can derive some benefit for themselves.

Today's DC was spurned by an email response to a previous DC which made me begin to think about how to reach more souls with my message. Naturally, I am referring to our children and grandchildren who are presently embarking on their own "spiritual" journey (at least we hope they are). And how do they do that? What direction do they take and what means of information do they look for to make the correct decisions as it relates to their own "spiritual" journey?

So over the past few weeks in anticipation of writing this Deacon's Corner, I spent some extra time in evaluating how young people get information to live by. And in so doing, I realize that all information is available with the touch of our fingertips. Not like when we were growing up, when we had to read the newspaper, listen to news on TV, listen intently at school or just get updated in life by speaking with our peers. And I must say the last way I mentioned seems a little dangerous even today. Today, if you want to know more about almost any topic, all you have to do is push a couple buttons on your iPhone or Android, and boom, there it is.

Let me preface the following with the understanding that "I saw it on the internet, so it must be true" is not something I abide by and I hope you don't either. But while there is so much available to all of us on the "information highway", how much of that information do we use to help us grow in our own "spirituality"? I heard just this morning on the news

that a new app that just came out a week or so ago, is being used an average of 46 minutes a day by everyone who has downloaded it since its inception. To me, that is unbelievable from the perspective that we seem to have our values going in the wrong direction. Although I will say that it seems that everywhere you go, everyone seems to be immersed in their iPhone or Android whether texting, calling, facebooking, twitter, and the list goes on and on. When do we take the time to actually communicate with one another the old fashioned way, just talk to each other! What's the solution? I haven't the foggiest idea but I do have a suggestion. What if there was an app to put us in touch with Jesus? And if there was, would Jesus update His app as time goes on? After all, we all know that with technology moving faster than anyone could have foreseen, if upgrades are not made on a continuing basis, we lose interest and soon that app will disappear. And while the Church continues to make changes in, what I call, the human side of religion, the message sent from Jesus Christ remains the same. Love the Lord, thy God and love your neighbor as yourself.

The problem I see is that too many spend way too much time with sharing your lives on Facebook, twitter, etc., etc. and not enough time giving God, our Father, His due time. I did not include myself because I have no social media participation whatsoever. Don't let sharing every minute of your life with others through social media become your daily activity. Remember that "it is by the love of God" that we are able to have each day. And when our journey is complete here on earth, I promise you joy and happiness if you dedicate adequate time to God, our Father, each and every day.






