Nearly ten years before, a son and father had parted ways when the business they shared went bankrupt. The son blamed the father. They did not speak to each other again. Then the father became seriously ill. The mother called the son and told him he had better come soon. The son walked sheepishly into the hospital room. The father motioned his son to him and whispered: "Did you ever think you could do anything that would keep me from loving you?"

Resentment and anger are foul things, the first reading from Sirach tells us. Remember the last things. Stop hating. Live by the commandments. As St. Paul writes to the Romans, we are to live for the Lord and die for the Lord.

Jesus' parable in today's Gospel reminds us of God's compassion. The immense sin of humanity has been forgiven and stricken from the record. We are to forgive others in the same way.

GOSPEL MEDITATION

ENCOURAGE DEEPER UNDERSTANDING OF SCRIPTURE

What right do we have to limit the amount and degree of forgiveness we show to others when we are so desperately in need of it ourselves? In not wanting someone who hurt us to downplay or forget the gravity of their wrong, we cling to anger, resentment, and wrath as a way of maintaining control. It is a way to acknowledge and express our deep hurt. We fail to realize that in doing so we hold ourselves hostage to these destructive feelings and actually become mired in the bondage of sin. All we gain is further alienation from ourselves, others, and especially God. We are no longer free but tethered to all of this unresolved negativity. Don't we really want to let it go? The fact is that we need to.

A good self-reflective posture will quickly show us that when the shoe is on the other foot and we are the ones in need of forgiveness, we desire it above anything else. This is especially true with our relationship with God. It is hypocritical to want one thing for ourselves and something else for another. Yet, many act in precisely this way.

Perhaps we think that in offering forgiveness, even for the most grievous of wrongs, somehow excuses the person of their wrong and makes it almost acceptable. This is what makes revenge, retaliation, and punishment so attractive. We see forgiveness as being an eraser



that easily wipes away the offense without consequence. Or, we may believe that in offering forgiveness I must somehow forget the wrong and open myself as a victim of even greater possible hurts in the future. In fact, forgiving my sister or brother of their wrongful actions or attitudes involves none of this. It does not erase anything or position me vulnerably as a doormat to be walked on.

Forgiveness is an act of freedom that restores honest dialogue, shares true, and heartfelt feelings and acknowledges the consequences of an action. It admits that the wrong has caused a hurt that must be healed and squarely positions responsibility on the offender. The act of forgiveness recognizes our sinfulness and brokenness. It also admits that the most saintly among

us is capable of doing very grave and deep harm to another person. It sees that we all can be victims of our passions and works in progress that deserve unlimited chances to get it right. With forgiveness, I release myself from the bonds of negativity and pursue a path of restoration, wholeness, and healing. I do not forget the wrong nor do I dismiss it. Sometimes, we have to stay far away from the one who hurt us. But we can still heal internally and be free.

For the one who wants to be forgiven and the one who needs offer forgiveness, the journey can be an adventure in learning what brought us to this place and what is needed to move forward. This is exactly how God treats us. Why would we not want to do the same for others?

These teens volunteered to come to St Francis de Sales Church almost every day this summer. We live streamed our daily noon Masses and our Sunday 9am Masses through Facebook and YouTube.

Allison welcomed people each day with a smile as they came back to our in-person Masses. She warmly greeted those arriving for Mass while following the safety guidelines set in place by our archdiocese.

The tech team expertly handled all aspects of live streaming including the video camera, video streaming controls, software and trouble shooting any sound issues.

They worked as a team and took full responsibility for ensuring that people not only from the Lake Zurich community, but from all across the country, were able to participate in our Masses, Rosaries, Children's Bible Study and Adoration.

And then, if that was not enough, they showed up again and again to enable many to experience the joy of the sacraments through multiple

services of 1st Communion, Children's Catechumenate, Adult Confirmation and Teen Confirmation both by checking people into the events as well as enabling live streaming for all those who could not attend in person. Some Sundays they helped at three different events throughout the day.

They worked to ensure everyone had an excellent experience by troubleshooting issues when they arose, constantly looking for ways to improve technique and even adding Mass responses and comments for audience participation.

They all went above and beyond

These teens have been a very important part of a team which has helped spread the Good News of Jesus both in person and through technology. Since March 15th, we have been streaming weekday noon Masses as well as the Sunday 9:00am Mass.

As of August 28th there have been over 150,000 Facebook and Youtube views.

Dear Rev. David F. Ryan,

I hope you and your loved ones are safe and well during these challenging times. The events of the last few weeks and months rest heavy on our hearts, especially for those most in need.

Sadly, about five children die every day in America from abuse and neglect. **Maryville Crisis Nursery** is an innovative program designed to help parents or guardians get through stressful times. We offer up to 72 hours, around the clock, child care for children ages birth to 6 years of age. Families facing medical emergencies, mental illness, homelessness, domestic violence or other crises often have nowhere to turn to. Maryville's Crisis Nursery is free of charge and provides a safe and loving environment for their children. Most recently, first responders and essential workers for COVID-19 relied on the Crisis Nursery for emergency child care.

A second program, our **Children's Healthcare Center**, is a transitional healthcare facility. Tragically, some children with complex medical needs are compelled to leave hospitals well before their families are able to care for them. Our team of pediatricians, nurses and medical providers deliver 24-hour nursing care for children ages birth to 21.

Father, it is often the ones we least expect who are in the most need. So please, share this information several times over the next few weeks with all of your parishioners and community by including it in your mass announcements and your bulletin. **People can call our 24-hour Crisis Hotline at (773) 205-3637.**

Since 1883, Maryville's mission has been to help children and families reach their fullest potential by empowering their intellectual, spiritual, moral and emotional growth. These two vital programs, located in a shared facility on Chicago's Northwest side, can be a great resource for your parishioners.

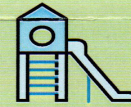

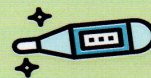

Completing temperature checks for all children, parents and staff entering the building. Screening regularly for any symptoms.



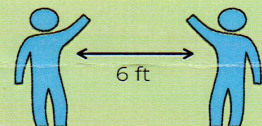
24-Hour Helpline

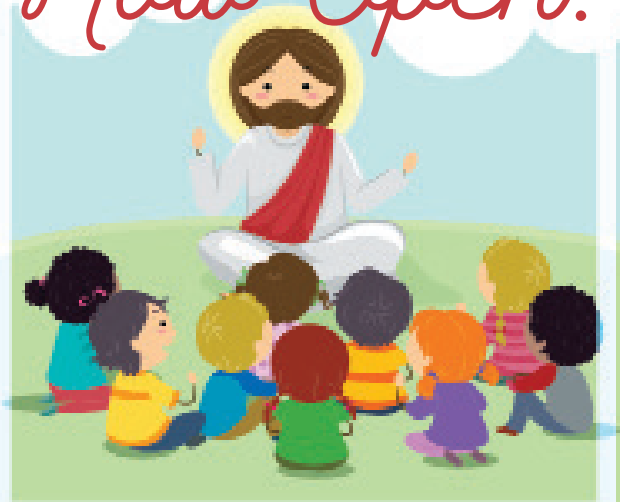


