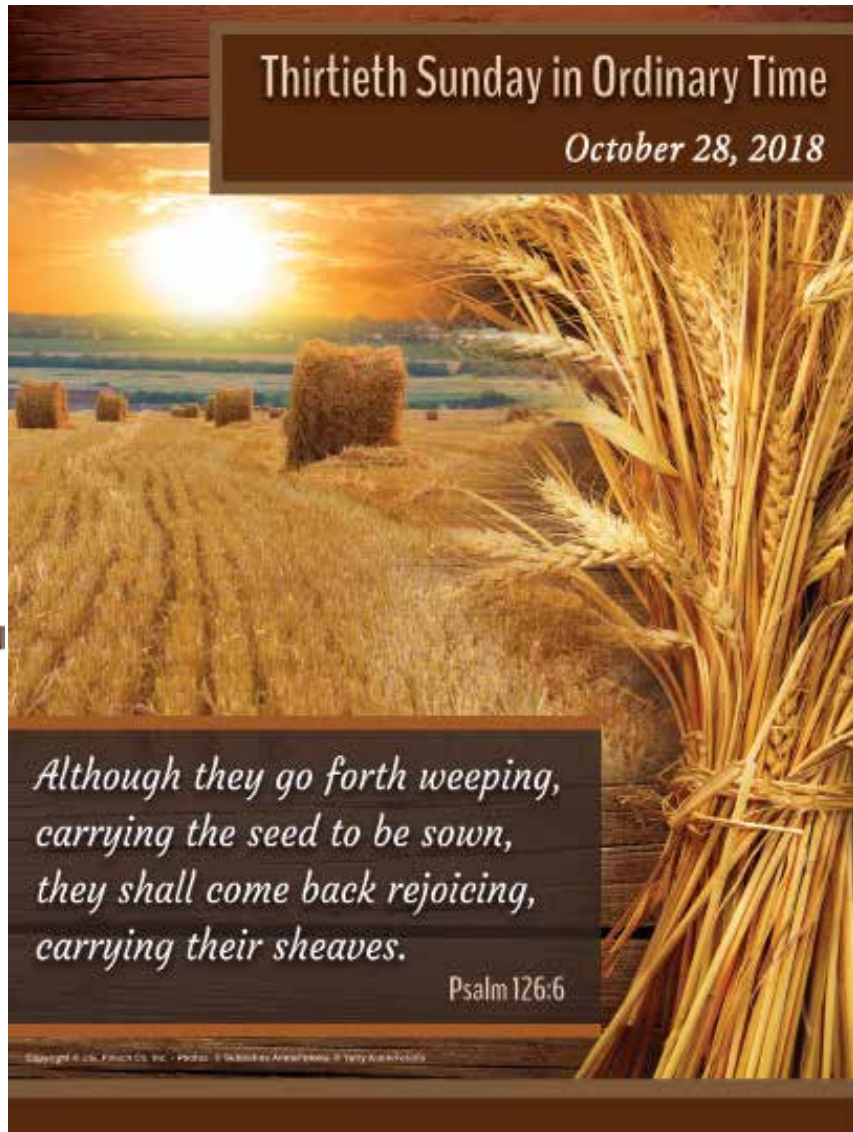

Statement of the Archdiocese of Chicago on Lawsuit Filed Today

This message is going to all priests, deacons, parishes, and pastoral center staff of the Archdiocese of Chicago.

We understand a lawsuit has been filed against the six dioceses in Illinois and the Catholic Conference of Illinois by attorneys Marc Pearlman and Jeff Anderson on behalf of sexual abuse victim-survivors from some Illinois dioceses. We have not had time to review the lawsuit. In 2006, the Archdiocese of Chicago published on its website the names of diocesan priests against whom there were substantiated allegations of child sexual abuse. The list can be found at protect.archchicago.org.

In January 2014, and again in November 2014, the Archdiocese of Chicago released documents from the files of the priests with substantiated allegations of abuse against them listed on its website. Only the names of victims, material that would identify them or material protected by law was redacted in the more than 20,000 pages released. This information contains the details about the abuse the lawsuit seeks. These documents can be found on our website at docinfo.archchicago.org.

History

In 1991, Cardinal Joseph Bernardin convened a lay commission to review the Archdiocese of Chicago's procedures for handling accusations of sexual abuse.

In 1992, the Archdiocese of Chicago put in place policies and procedures to address allegations and issues related to sexual abuse of minors. It created one of the first offices of Victim Assistance Ministry to provide direct outreach and support to victim-survivors and their families and created an independent office (now known as the Office of Child Abuse Investigations and Review) to receive allegations of abuse of minors by clergy.

In 1993, the Archdiocese of Chicago's Independent Review Board was convened to review allegations of abuse and to make direct recommendations on the accused clergy's fitness for ministry to the archbishop.

In 2002, the Archdiocese of Chicago adopted the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops' Charter for the Protection of Children and Young People, including its "one-strike" rule that removed priests with even one substantiated allegation of child sexual abuse permanently from ministry. Every allegation, regardless of when the abuse is alleged to have occurred, is referred to the civil authorities.

Building on a decade of experience in handling abuse cases, in 2003, the Archdiocese of Chicago created the Office for the Protection of Children and Youth (OPCY) to bring together the various ministries within the archdiocese that had been operating to ensure the archdiocese is a safe place for children. Its offices work together to stay current on preventing and responding to child sexual abuse.

Office for Assistance Ministry (OAM) personnel reach out and extend supportive services to victim survivors from the moment they come forward with an allegation of clergy sexual abuse. This includes traveling throughout the country to meet with and listen to victim-survivors. OAM personnel

also provide the opportunity for victim-survivors to receive independent professional counseling from fully accredited therapists. Additionally, OAM personnel have worked in collaboration with victims-survivors to respond to their need for healing. This has led to the development of the Healing Garden, annual Mass for Hope and Healing and Pinwheel Service for Child Abuse Prevention, victim-survivor led peace circles, and the Healing Voices magazine. To date more than 400 victim-survivors and family members have been served by OAM personnel.

Office of Child Abuse Investigation and Review (CAIR) is headed by a lay professional who provides a compassionate and thorough process for receiving and investigating reports of child abuse against archdiocesan personnel. Archdiocese personnel notify public authorities of all reports of possible abuse of any kind and from any date, regardless of legal requirements. The Director of CAIR serves as staff for the Independent Review Board, which is an advisory board for the Cardinal. The Board's main charges are ensuring the safety of children and determining a cleric's fitness for ministry. More than 230 Board meetings have been held.

Safe Environment Office personnel provide resources to educate archdiocesan clergy, employees and volunteers on how to prevent child sexual abuse, how to recognize sex offender behavior and how to create safe environments for children and youth. Since 2003, more than 3,700 training sessions in the archdiocese have been held, training more than 263,000 adults.

- Archdiocesan parishes and schools are required to provide valuable training to children and youth on how to recognize, resist, respond and report grooming or abuse.
- Safe Environment Office personnel also screen, through name-based background checks, all clergy, employees and volunteers. Office personnel also receive and review fingerprint results for school personnel.
- All employees and volunteers who work with children and youth in the archdiocese must submit a CANTS (Child Abuse and Neglect Tracking Systems) Form.
- All employees and volunteers in the archdiocese must abide by the archdiocese's Code of Conduct.
- The archdiocese requires Mandated Reporter Training for all clergy, school personnel, religious education personnel, youth ministers and coaches as part of the archdiocese's Safe Environment Compliance.

Priest Monitoring Program is the Archdiocese of Chicago's stringent monitoring program of clergy with substantiated cases of sexual abuse against them. These men have been withdrawn from ministry and are prohibited from presenting themselves as priests. They are required to comply with numerous restrictions to provide safety for the community, the program participants, and the Church.

In 2006, the Archdiocese of Chicago published on its website the names of all diocesan priests against whom there were substantiated allegations of child sexual abuse. The list has been updated as necessary. The list can be found at protect.archchicago.org.

In January 2014, and again in November 2014, the Archdiocese of Chicago, released documents from the files of the priests whose names appeared on our website list of men with substantiate allegations against them. Only the names of victims, material that would identify them or material protected by law was redacted in the more than 20,000 pages released. These documents can be found on our website at docinfo.archchicago.org.

In September 2018, Cardinal Cupich called for an independent review of the archdiocese's policies and procedures and the creation of a Truth and Reconciliation process to heal victim-survivors, their families and the community.

TOM PURTELL TO BE INSTITUTED INTO THE MINISTRY OF ACOLYTE

Please continue your prayers for deacon candidate Tom Purtell as the Most Rev. Joseph N. Perry will preside at his institution into the Ministry of Acolyte on November 4, 2018 at the Chapel of the Immaculate Conception, University of Saint Mary of the Lake in Mundelein. Tom is one of 24 candidates to be instituted into this ministry.



INSTITUTE FOR
DIACONAL STUDIES

As is noted in the words of the Rite, instituted acolytes "have a special role in the Church's ministry." The Rite notes the following responsibilities:

- Assist priests and deacons in carrying out their ministry at the Eucharist;
- As special ministers, they are to give Holy Communion to the faithful at the liturgy, and to the sick;
- Because they are specially called to this ministry, they should strive to live more fully by the Lord's sacrifice and to be molded more perfectly in its likeness;
- They should seek to understand the deep spiritual meaning of what they do so to offer themselves daily to God as spiritual sacrifices acceptable to Him through Jesus Christ.

Regarding the Ministry of Acolyte, Canon Law also notes that newly instituted acolytes must regularly exercise their ministry from this point forward if they are to be considered for the possibility of Holy Orders.

This year, Tom continues to be involved in multi-dimensional study, prayer and preparation for possible Holy Orders. Academic and formation courses include Sacramental Theology, Christology, Soteriology, Homiletics, Christian Anthropology, Spiritual Theology, Presiding at the Rites, Moral Theology; a retreat for candidates and wives; monthly meetings for theological reflection; monthly Spiritual Direction; and a retreat prior to his institution to the Ministry of Acolyte. He also has been involved in a series of field education and internship experiences. Thus, he continues his four-year preparation as a candidate for the diaconate.

Please keep Tom, his wife Jocelyn, and his family in your prayers. Tom Purtell is also Chair of our Parish Pastoral Council.

St Francis de Sales parish has three high school representatives on the Archdiocese Pastoral Youth Council: Kelly Bush (Lake Zurich High School), Tino Alivia (Carmel Catholic High School), and Michelle Roesner (Stevenson High School). "On September 30 Tino, Michelle and I attended our first APYC meeting of the year. The purpose of this youth council is to answer questions sent by the Cardinal regarding the youth viewpoint on the church and what improvements can be made. We were sent 3 questions ahead of time to ponder and get input from other teens in our communities. The first question was "What makes you come to Church", and the answers from many teens on the council centered around the community aspect of the church and feeling that Mass is a way to regroup before the next week. Second, "Do you feel addressed in the church". Although we have such an amazing youth group here at St Francis, we learned that many churches are not as fortunate as us and do not feel that effectively addressed in the church since that do not have youth groups to become involved in. Another surprising response was that all the churches aren't working together to give the teens similar experience no matter the church they attend. Lastly, we were asked what our feelings are towards the current scandals in the church. This was a more heavy topic and the council spent a long time digging deeper into these events within the church. Most council members agreed that the problem is not being effectively addressed by the higher ups in the Church; however, we feel that this is a problem with the institution not with our relationships with Jesus. Overall, we look forward to the upcoming meetings and if anyone has any questions/concerns that they would like us to address to the council please let us know." - Kelly Bush

Seven Archdiocese of Chicago Catholic Schools have been named 2018 National Blue Ribbon recipients, including our very own St. Francis de Sales School! Congratulations to our administration, staff, students, and families under the leadership of Principal Kyle Schmitt and Father Ryan, Pastor, on a job well done! We are proud of our school! Chicago, IL (October 1, 2018) – The Archdiocese of Chicago announced today that seven of its Catholic schools – Cardinal Joseph Bernardin Elementary School (Orland Hills), Queen of All Saints School (Chicago), Sacred Heart School (Winnetka), St. Bede School (Ingleside), St. Francis de Sales School (Lake Zurich), St. Francis Xavier School (Wilmette) and St. Therese School (Chicago) – have been recognized this year by the U.S. Department of Education with Blue Ribbon Awards. The National Blue Ribbon Award is presented to schools based on a school's overall academic excellence or the school's progress in closing student achievement gaps. The Archdiocese of

Chicago Catholic Schools have received 102 Blue Ribbon Awards, more than any other school system – public and private – in the country.

"I am extremely proud of our Catholic schools for being recognized by the U.S. Department of Education," said Dr. Jim Rigg, superintendent of Catholic Schools. "The honor of achieving Blue Ribbon designation status reinforces the academic excellence and quality Catholic education we provide students and their families throughout the Archdiocese of Chicago."

All seven schools were recognized under the category of "Exemplary High Performing Schools," meaning the schools are among the state's highest performing schools as measured by state assessments or nationally normed tests. Five of the archdiocese's 2018 recipients have earned this prestigious honor twice: Cardinal Joseph Bernardin Elementary School (2008), Queen of All Saints School (2008), **St. Francis de Sales School (2007)**, St. Francis Xavier School (2012) and St. Therese School (2011).

Secretary of Education Betsy DeVos recognized 349 schools as National Blue Ribbon Schools for 2018. On November 7-8, the Secretary and the Department of Education will celebrate with 300 public and 49 private school honorees at an awards ceremony in Washington, D.C. The Blue Ribbon Award celebrates the idea that all students, regardless of background, ability or location, deserve an excellent education.

"I'm pleased to celebrate with you as your school is named a National Blue Ribbon School," said U.S. Secretary of Education Betsy DeVos in a video message to the honorees. "We recognize and honor your important work in preparing students for successful careers and meaningful lives. 
