CHANGE OUR LIVES

The letters of Paul to the Thessalonians are among his earliest writings, and are driven by his belief and the belief of the entire early Christian community that the return of Christ was imminent, and that devoting time or attention to anything else was foolish.

Today we may wonder, when we hear these readings about the coming end-times, if we should take them to heart, if we really believe that Christ still may come upon us as a "thief at night" (1 Thessalonians 5:2). Does this mean that we are to stop our long-range goal-setting, get rid of our yearly calendars and planners, or stop putting money in the college education fund? Of course not. What it does mean is that we need to change our lives, living like children of the light and illuminating the world around us with the light of the gospel. Then, on that day, when the details of our daily living become unimportant, we will be ready to find our peace and security in Christ Jesus.

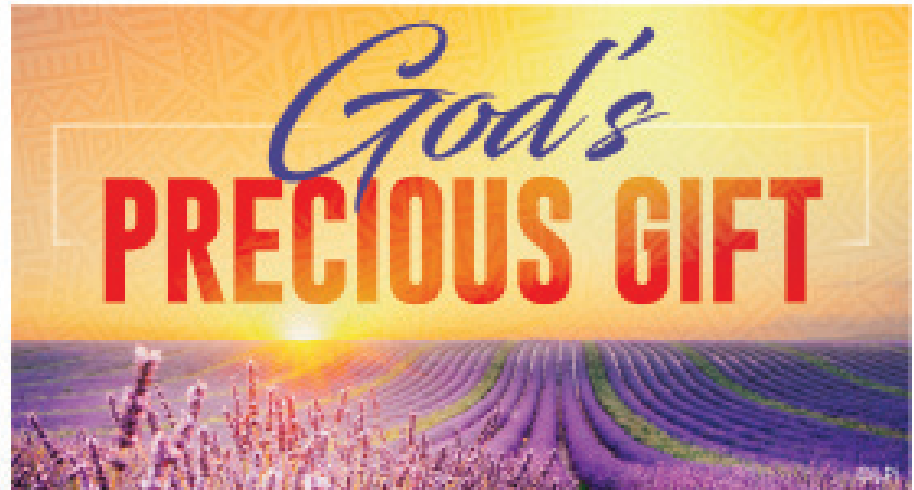
GOSPEL MEDITATION

ENCOURAGE DEEPER UNDERSTANDING OF SCRIPTURE

God gives us the gift of His very self and asks us to invest it. Investing God's greatest gift of Himself wisely, allows God's kingdom to grow and flourish. God trusts us with this pearl of great price in hopes that it will produce abundant fruit. While God's gift of self is realized in the gifts of faith, hope, and love, they are not meant to be solely for personal benefit. They are intended to be shared and are at the heart of Jesus' blueprint for happiness, the Beatitudes.

When we properly invest God's greatest gift, His most treasured possession, we invest in the wellbeing of all of our brothers and sisters and the world in which we live. We take up most seriously our call to be stewards and properly manage, not only our own affairs, but the affairs of those around and before us. God has put tremendous confidence in us. Do we have that same confidence in God?

We often go the extra mile and put in the additional effort when it comes to those concerns closest to us: our families, friends, careers, home and securities. But when it comes to things that are not as



close to us, we can become lax and less conscientious. Tending to God's treasure requires a great deal of focus and persistent hard work. It demands that I see the bigger picture, God's picture, in which self-sacrifice is a given as we labor for the establishment of God's kingdom, God's vision. Fear and a lack of trust can loom large, however. We are afraid of letting go of what is "mine" and apprehensive of jeopardizing what we have in order to venture into something bigger and more promising.

Fear and a lack of trust serve no purpose in God's kingdom. They benefit neither the person

nor God. What is required is a courageous resolve that produces the fortitude necessary to stay the course and do what God is asking. Doing all in our power to cultivate the seeds of faith, hope, and love in our world, working diligently to put all of our relationships in proper order, becoming attentive to systems and ideologies that hurt and oppress people, being mindful of injustice, and laboring on behalf of the poor and the needy are at the core of what each of us is asked to do. It is how we invest God's most precious gift wisely. If persistent, alert and attentive, then life will gradually improve around us, there will be greater peace and we will experience joy.

Like a time capsule, those things will not be buried forever. One day the giver of that gift will ask what you have done with it. When that day comes, I pray you don't need to find a shovel.

Deacon's Corner

It is 5AM this Tuesday morning and, until just a few minutes ago, I was not sure what this week's DC was going to be about. As I was making my morning coffee, it came to me. The subject of this week's DC is an expression that I hear every day at the end of our noon Mass. "Count your blessings". It is an expression that Fr. Ryan says at the end of each Mass and has said it for years. And every time I hear it, I say softly; "everyday".

I can say for myself that there have been times in my life that I may have taken that expression for granted. I guess it may have been easier to look at what is taking place in my life without really thinking about what led up to that circumstance and all the benefits and blessings that had surrounded it. In this particular instance, I am referring to the loss that Bobbi and I suffered a few days ago with the loss of our dog, Ace. He had been with us for the past ten years and recently contracted a fungal infection that took his life. Many of you knew Ace as he was a kind and loving friend for many years. We will miss him.

When I do a eulogy at a funeral, one of the things I always say is to "stop for a moment, close your eyes, and think about a special time you spent with the person whose life we are here to celebrate". You see, I feel that while there is sadness in any loss in our lives, no matter who or what it is, there is a time that we can always recall that brought us happiness and joy at some point in our relationship. And I believe that is an important thing to remember. And I also believe that for whatever reason we are all together to celebrate life, thinking back about the reason we are all together and I am sure everyone has a different reason, for whatever purpose we are together, a good thought about a "special time together" is what will bring us some happiness and joy for whatever sense of loss we are feeling.

Looking back in my own life, I suffered the first loss I can recall at the age of nine. My Uncle Ed, my father's

brother, passed into the light suffering a heart attack. I can remember my parents coming into my bedroom and telling me that Uncle Ed had passed and I don't think I fully understood what that meant at the time. I can say that over the next week or so, I recalled many good and fun times I had with Uncle Ed like him buying me my first fishing rod, taking me fishing in Lake St. Clair for perch and going to his house to visit and seeing him on his couch on Sunday after Church smoking a cigar (I guess that is where I got the habit of cigar smoking), and so many other good and fun times with my Uncle Ed.

Since that time back in 1954, I have suffered the loss of many friends and relatives including my parents. And one of the things I can truly say is that recalling good memories of time spent with all of them is something I still cherish today. Think about it! I know many of you reading this, if not all of you, have suffered some kind of loss in your lives over the past decades. And I hope and pray that you are all able to look back often and "stop for a moment, close your eyes, and think about a special time you spent". That is what I refer to in the expression "Count your blessings". I feel as I am sitting here writing this that the message of this DC is best directed toward myself.

And this all came together for me (and Bobbi) in a card that Fr. Ryan gave us yesterday at Mass that read in part "you were blessed with Ace and Ace was blessed with you, count your blessings". And we have been counting the blessings over the years, not only with having Ace as a good friend and companion, but for all the "blessings" God has put in our lives. They are like the Saints in Heaven, there are too many to count. So I offer in closing for all to heed the words "Count your blessings" each and every day of our lives, knowing that Our Lord will never give us more than we can bear.

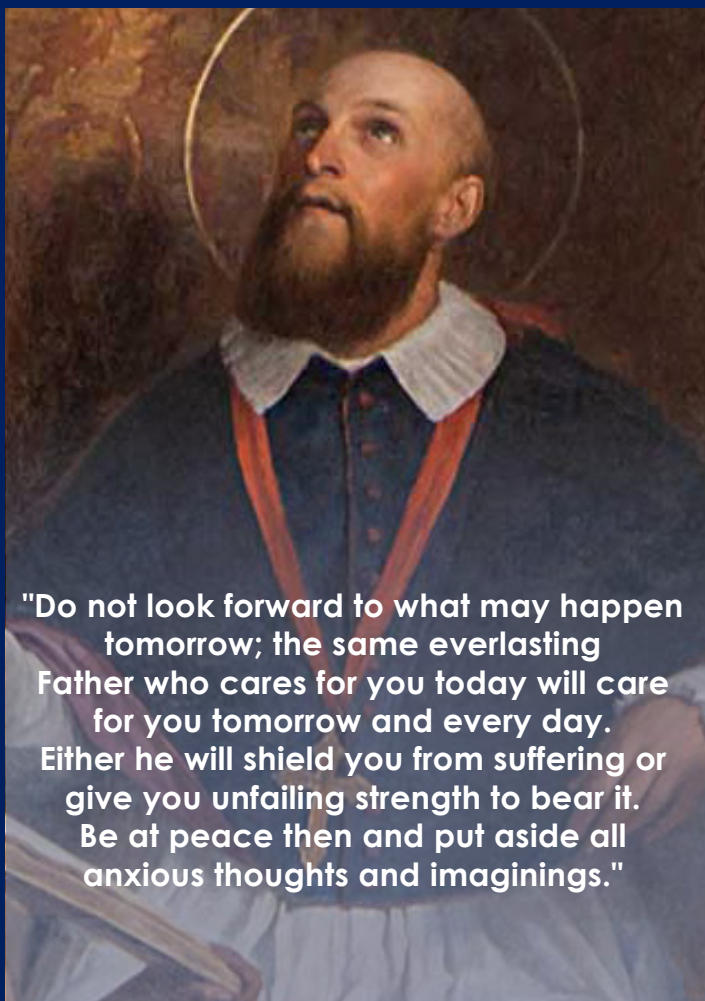
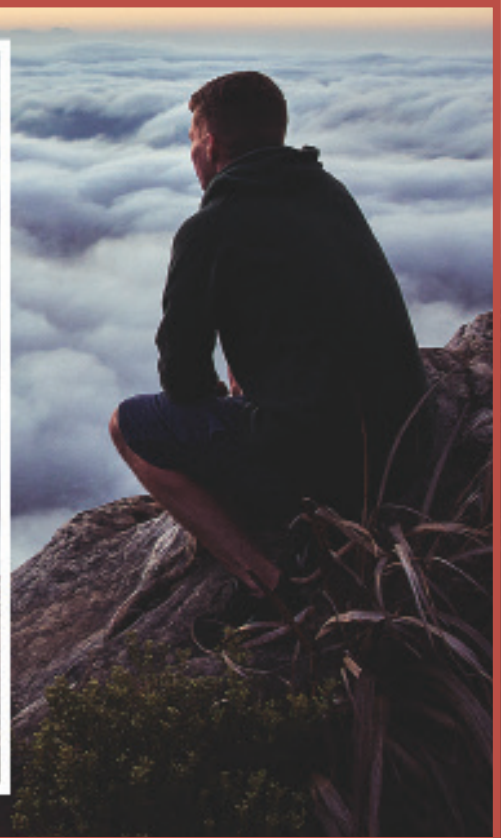

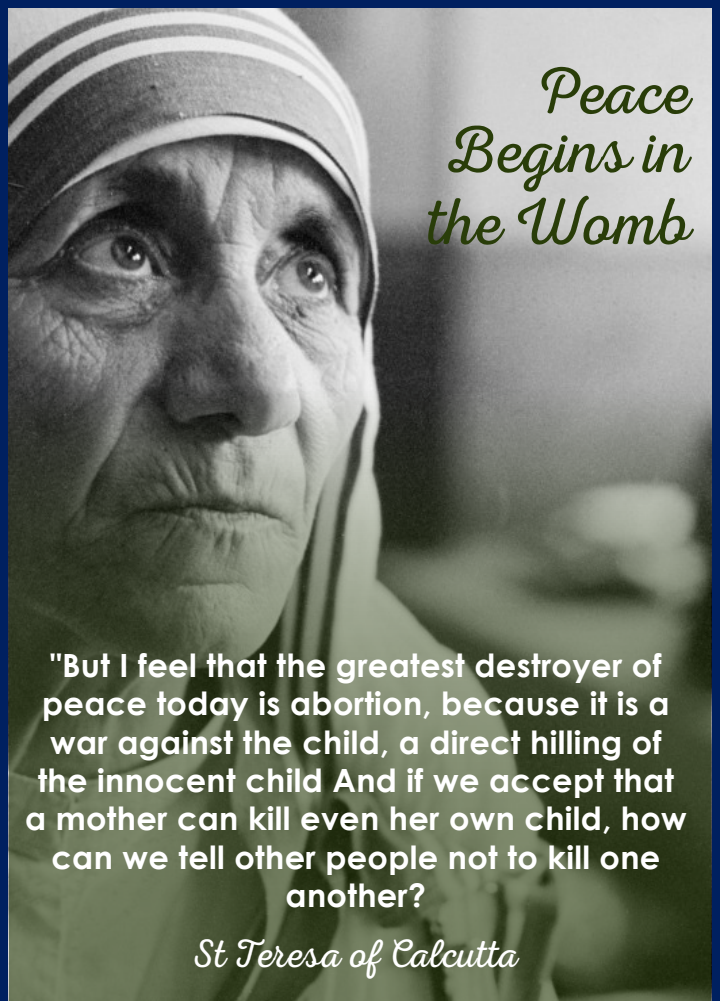
