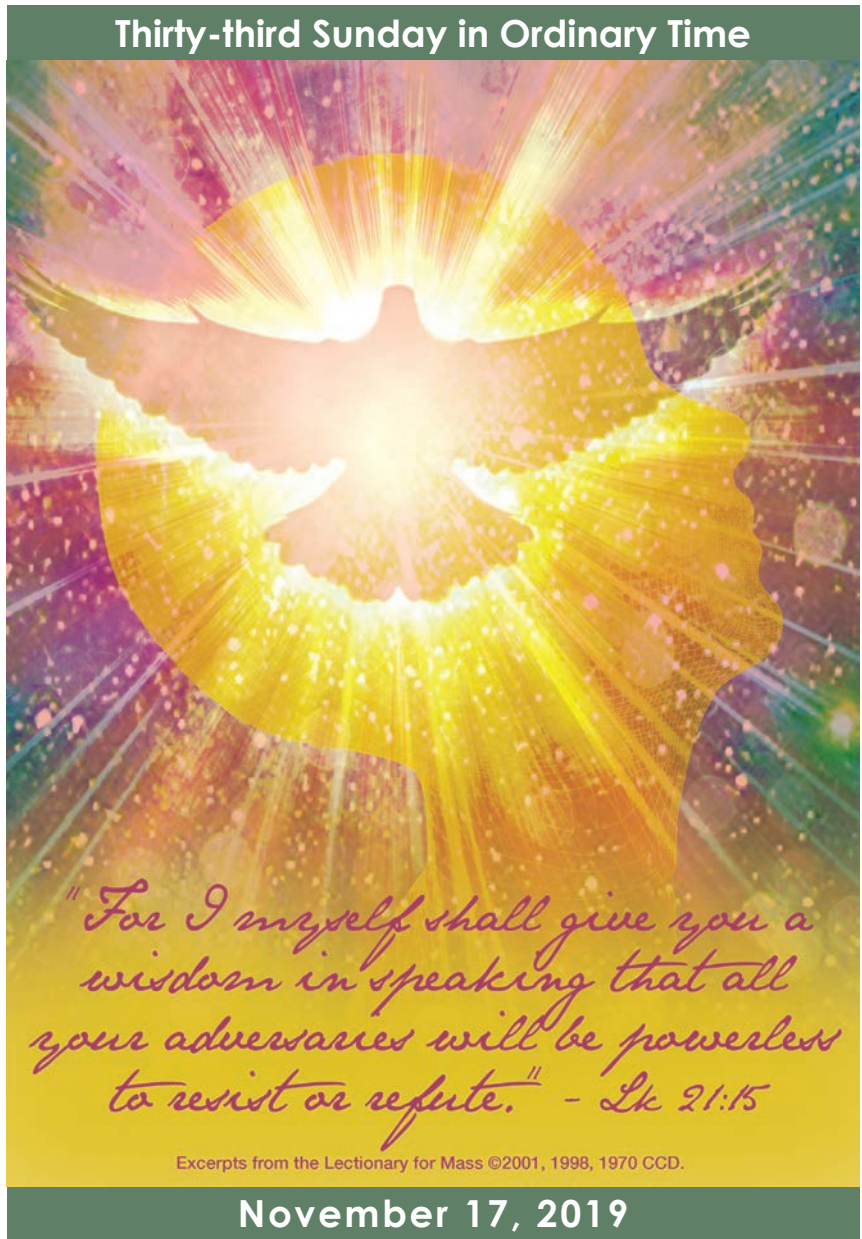

LIFE IS HARD, BUT HAVE NO FEAR

Today's readings take a fearless look at reality and reach a conclusion that we all know: life is hard. The prophet Malachi preaches fire and brimstone, warning us that evildoers will perish in flames. Saint Paul offers his own warning to the Thessalonians: keep busy, but never become a busybody. He reminds Christians that the apostles themselves worked in "toil and drudgery" as a model for how we ought to contribute to our community. The Gospel returns to the apocalyptic tone of Malachi, describing the utter chaos of the end-times. We will know the end is near when violence, catastrophe, and hatred dominate the earth. But we must not fear! God's saving plan brings peace to our hearts. Malachi speaks of the sun's "healing rays," and Jesus himself promises to protect every hair on our heads.

Mental Health First Aid Training Session

Mental Health First Aid training was held on Wednesday, October 30th and Wednesday, November 6th, from 1pm to 5pm at the Ministry Center. This training was provided by the Lake County Health Department and Community Health Center and is coordinated by the National Council for Behavioral Health, the Maryland Department of Health and Mental Hygiene, and the Missouri Department of Mental Health. Mental Health First Aid USA is coordinated by the National Council for Behavioral Health, the Maryland Department of Health and Mental Hygiene, and the Missouri Department of Mental Health. It was made possible by a grant from the Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration (SAMHSA), US Department of Health and Human Services (HHS).

Mental Health First Aid teaches you to know how to help someone who is developing a mental health problem or experiencing a mental health crisis.

Topics covered:

- Depression and mood disorders
- Anxiety disorders
- Trauma
- Psychosis
- Substance use disorders

During the course, we learned how to apply the Mental Health First Aid action plan in a variety of situations, including, at Mass, a meeting, and/or on parish property, when someone is experiencing:

- Panic attacks
- Suicidal thoughts or behaviors
- Non-suicidal self-injury
- Acute psychosis (e.g., hallucinations or delusions)
- Overdose or withdrawal from alcohol or drug use
- Reaction to a traumatic event

We learned by getting involved with the material and relating to real life applications through discussion, scenarios, and other activities. These late hours of training was sponsored by the Lake County Health Department and Community Health Center in partnership with Saint Francis de Sales Catholic Church. participants had to attend both sessions in order to receive certification.

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

In Pope Francis's message regarding the Third World Day of the Poor, which will take place on Sunday, November 17, 2019, the Holy Father implored that, "If the disciples of the Lord Jesus wish to be genuine evangelizers, they must sow tangible seeds of hope. I ask all Christian communities, and all those who feel impelled to offer hope and consolation to the poor, to help ensure that this World Day of the Poor will encourage more and more people to cooperate effectively so that no one will feel deprived of closeness and solidarity."

Organizations funded by the Catholic Campaign for Human Development (CCHD) lead the call for all of us to stand in solidarity with those who have been marginalized in their communities and to act against injustice. For example, the Coalition to Save Our Mental Health Centers works to ensure that all Chicago residents, especially those who are low-income and underinsured, have access to adequate and affordable mental health services. For over two decades, it has worked to unite mental health consumers, professionals, faith leaders and community residents to keep Chicago's system of centers open and fully funded in the face of constant budget cuts. Since 2011, the Coalition has opened three new self-funded and community-controlled clinics to serve areas of the city that have been impacted by poverty, violence and other trauma.

By emphasizing self-help, participation and solidarity, the Catholic Campaign for Human Development is working to create safe, healthy and resilient communities where all of our neighbors can flourish. To learn more about CCHD's impact or to donate online, please visit www.CCHDChicago.org.

Your generous support of the CCHD Annual Collection, which will take place on Saturday, November 23 and Sunday, November 24, is the primary source of funding for nearly thirty grassroots organizations working to combat poverty and injustice in Cook and Lake Counties. 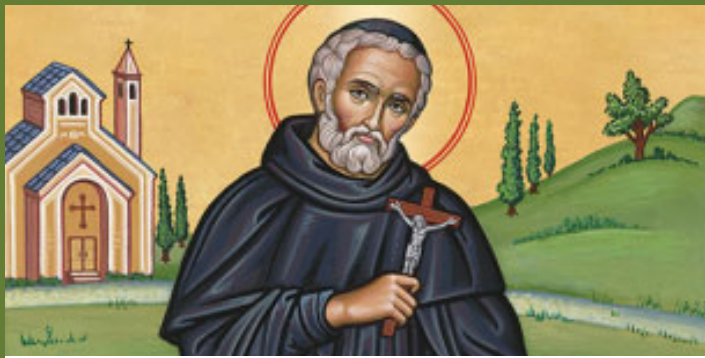
