Finally, Luke's Gospel calls to mind the kind of king Jesus chooses to be—a suffering servant, a man for others. By sacrificing his life for us, Jesus throws open the gates of Paradise.

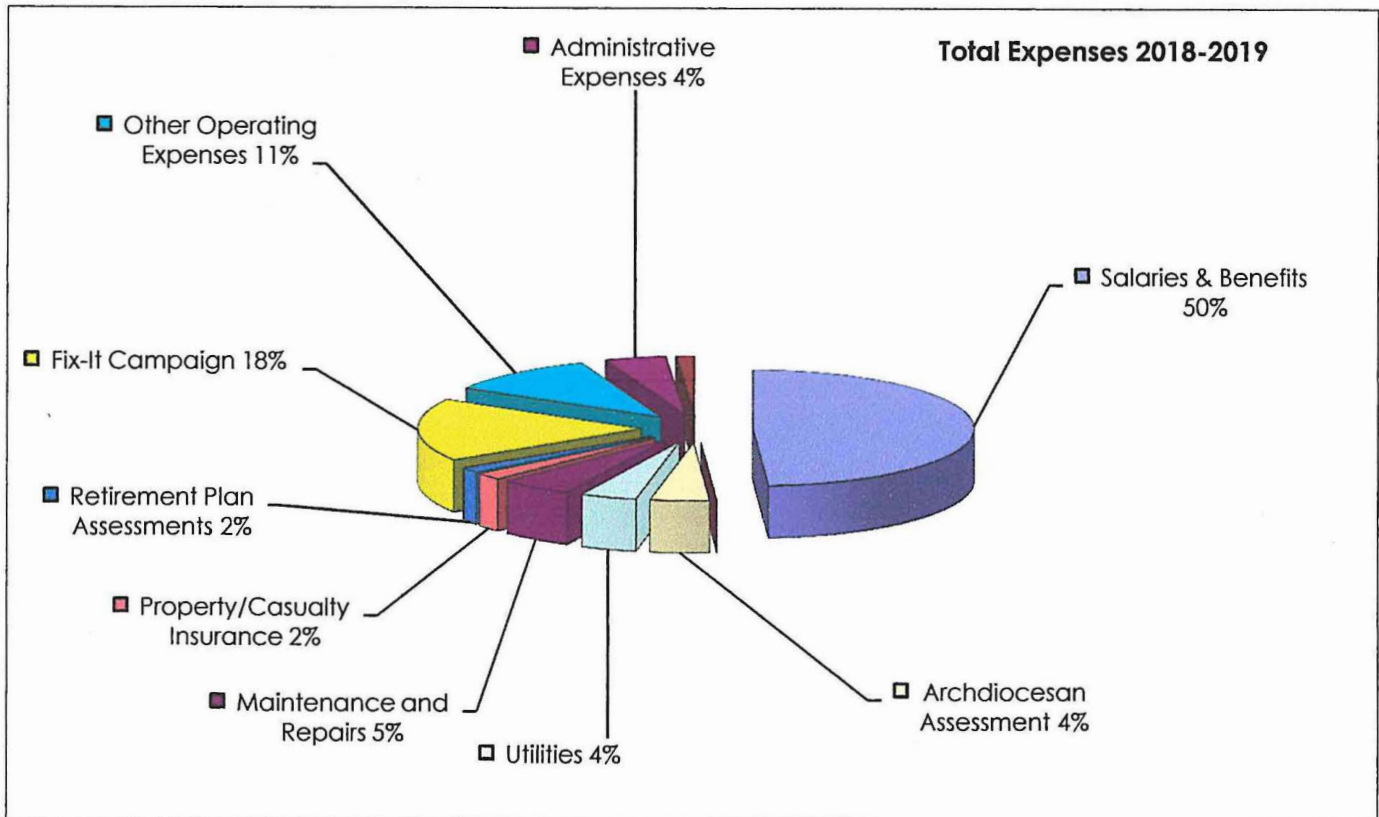
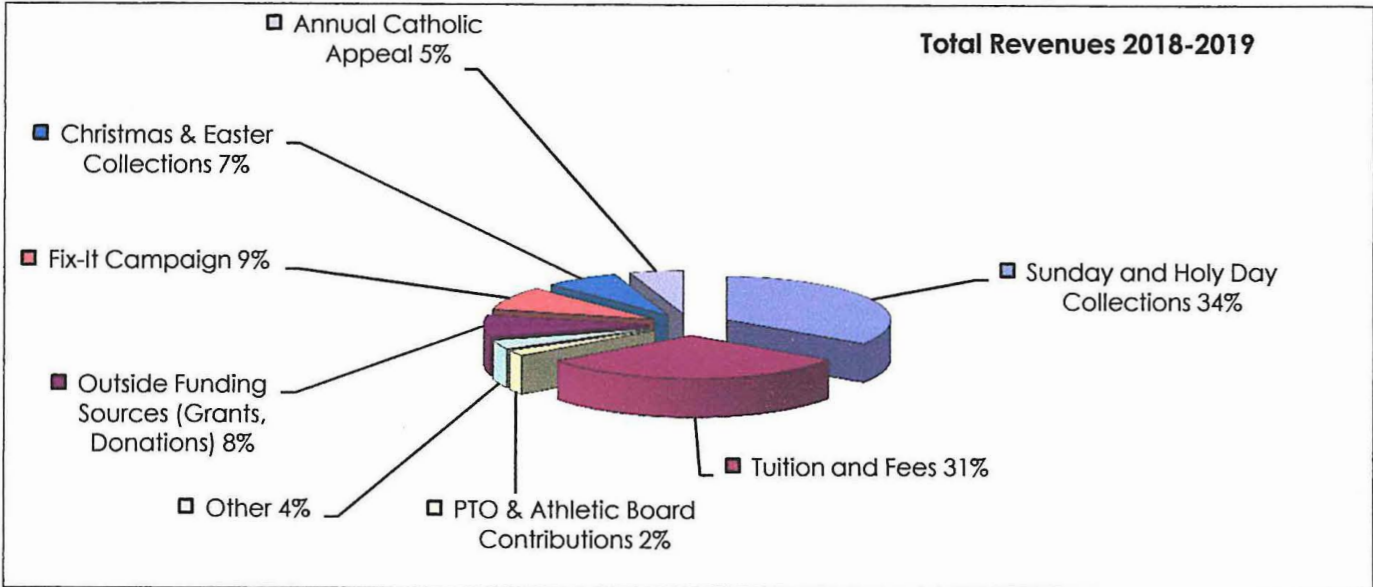

Deacon's Corner

I know it's hard to believe, but yes, Thanksgiving Day will be here in just a couple weeks. And while you might be saying; "Deacon John, you very often write about thanksgiving". Not necessarily about the National Holiday itself, but "thanksgiving" as it pertains to what Webster has defined as; "giving thanks for what we have, especially to God". This subject was renewed in my mind this morning as I was thinking about an appropriate subject to write about as I read my daily devotional titled; "Every Day in His Presence". Actually, I had formulated another subject over the week-end and even when I got up this morning but after reading the devotional, I decided to shelve that subject until next week.

For me, and perhaps for you also, the concept of "thanksgiving" in and of itself is one that I utilize, profess, and expound upon every day of my life. I can say that because as you might recall in prior DC writings, I speak about "thanksgiving" often. And one of the messages that struck me as meaningful is from Deuteronomy 8:18 which says; "Remember the Lord your God, for it is He who gives you the ability to produce wealth". And no, this is not only referring to material wealth. It is all of the wealth we accumulate over our lifetime. Most importantly the spiritual wealth given to us each day from Our Lord and Savior. It doesn't mean at all that material wealth is not good, but let's look today at the spiritual wealth that we receive from Our Lord and it begins when we are baptized. And this brings back a memory of what I always say while participating in a baptism. That we are now "accepting a new soldier in the Army of Jesus Christ". That Our Lord, through His infinite love and mercy, has brought another soldier into this world to love and serve Him. And the end result of every baptism is that all attending are always full of "thanksgiving" to Our Lord for the blessing of a new soldier, no matter how old they are.

Another line from the Bible that struck me is from Proverbs 11:18 which reads; "he who trusts in his riches will fall, but

the righteous will flourish". In other words, it doesn't matter how much you have in the form of what we consider both material and spiritual wealth. What does matter is how obedient you are with what has been entrusted to you by Our Lord. For me, I find myself asking the question; "why has Our Lord given this to me?" Whether it is what I consider a trial or tribulation or a blessing. And sometimes I come up with the answer to be both. And the most important thing that I try to remember to do each and every time I ask myself that question is to always say; "Thank you, Lord". If you are like me, and we are all human, sometimes I question why Our Lord has given "this" to me. No matter how we consider what we have been given, be it good or bad, happy or sad, it all comes from the Will of God and for that we must always be thankful.

This scripture reading is from Psalm 34:10. It is written; "They who seek the Lord shall not be in want of any good thing". This verse has me thinking all the way back to my childhood. I say this because as I get on in years, I tend to look back at certain events that have taken place in my life. Whether I consider them to have been, as I mentioned above; good or bad, happy or sad. And one theme I have adopted and work hard to abide by is that all that has taken place in my life is "the Will of God" occurring in my life, and for that I always say "Thank you, Lord".

In summary, I know sometimes it is hard to "Thank Our Lord" for all things in our lives. But after looking back at all of the blessings He has bestowed upon each of us every day, I urge you (and myself) to "look again" and always say; "Thank you, Lord" for all that has taken place. So while we should celebrate "Thanksgiving Day" every day, starting today let us give "thanks" to our Heavenly Father and share the love and grace and blessings He has given to each of us.

Mental Health First Aid Training Session

Mental Health First Aid training was held on Wednesday, October 30th and Wednesday, November 6th, from 1pm to 5pm at the Ministry Center. This training was provided by the Lake County Health Department and Community Health Center and is coordinated by the National Council for Behavioral Health, the Maryland Department of Health and Mental Hygiene, and the Missouri Department of Mental Health. Mental Health First Aid USA is coordinated by the National Council for Behavioral Health, the Maryland Department of Health and Mental Hygiene, and the Missouri Department of Mental Health. It was made possible by a grant from the Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration (SAMHSA), US Department of Health and Human Services (HHS).

Mental Health First Aid teaches you to know how to help someone who is developing a mental health problem or experiencing a mental health crisis.

Topics covered:

- Depression and mood disorders
- Anxiety disorders
- Trauma
- Psychosis
- Substance use disorders

During the course, we learned how to apply the Mental Health First Aid action plan in a variety of situations, including, at Mass, a meeting, and/or on parish property, when someone is experiencing:

- Panic attacks
- Suicidal thoughts or behaviors
- Non-suicidal self-injury
- Acute psychosis (e.g., hallucinations or delusions)
- Overdose or withdrawal from alcohol or drug use
- Reaction to a traumatic event

We learned by getting involved with the material and relating to real life applications through discussion, scenarios, and other activities. These late hours of training was sponsored by the Lake County Health Department and Community Health Center in partnership with Saint Francis de Sales Catholic Church. participants had to attend both sessions in order to receive certification.

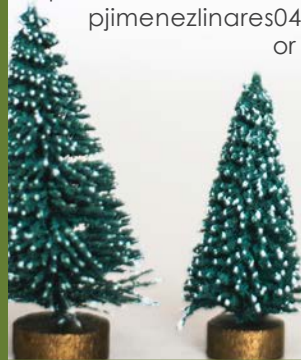
a Holiday Tradition *a Gift of Love*

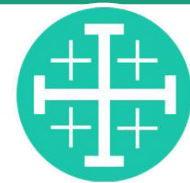


