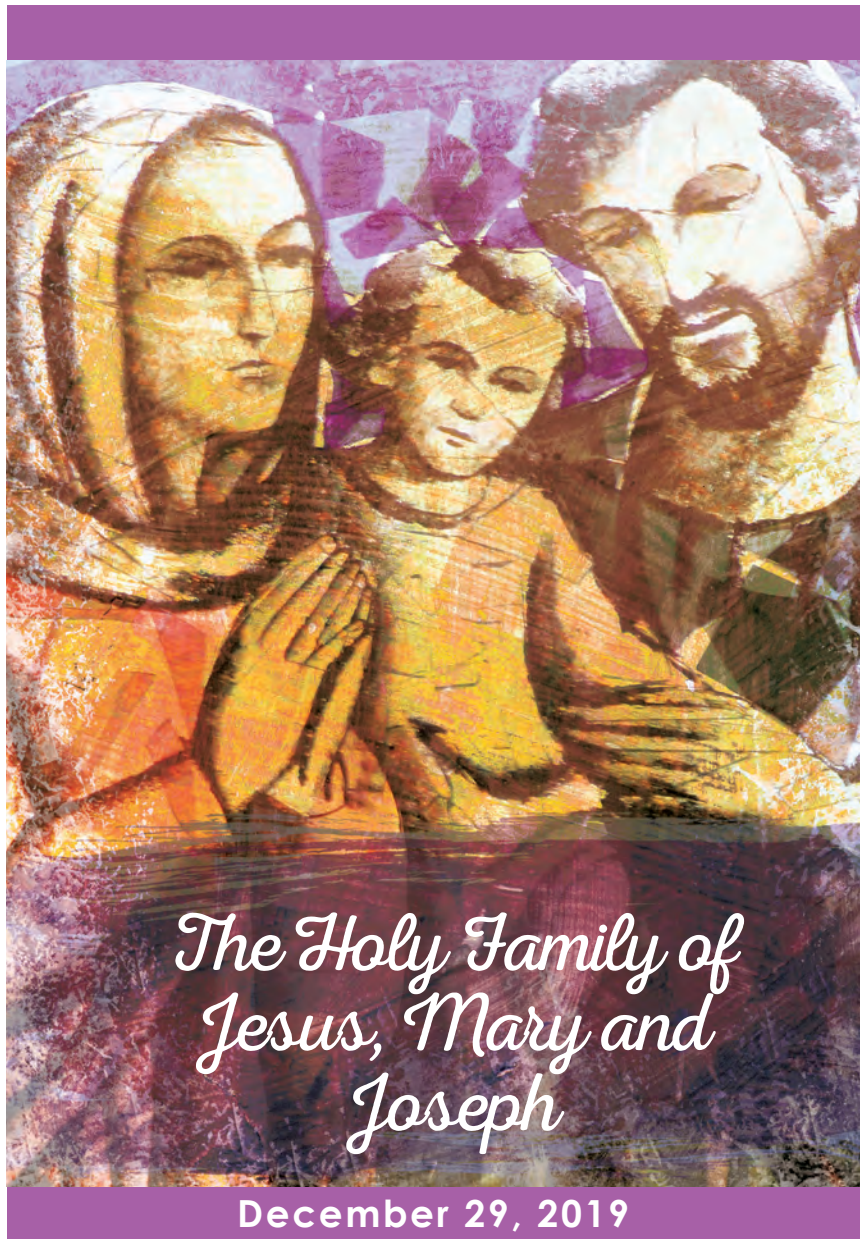

SALVATION IN DAILY LIFE

This Sunday is the feast of the Holy Family, which comes on the first Sunday after Christmas Day. Today's feast celebrates how the humanity of Jesus (including his entire family life) has brought saving significance into the daily rhythms of our human family life.

The scriptures offer instruction and encouragement on how to share—within our families, parish families, and the wider human family—the love that God shares with us in Jesus. Selections from Sirach, Psalm 128, and Colossians encourage us to reflect divine love and thus find holiness in all our human relationships. The reading from Matthew's Gospel offers a living example of love in the actions Joseph took to protect his young family from danger and to nurture them within the larger family of faith of their time.

33rd PLEDGE UPDATE & PAYMENTS COMPLETED

Sunday, December 15th, 2019
THIRD SUNDAY IN ADVENT

Dear Parishioners, Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

The remaining major projects are the new flooring design in the Church. We had hoped by Christmas 2019 to have completed the new Church flooring, but our plans and finances are scheduled for 2020. A monument on the site of the first Church building has been erected in remembrance of the first church in the parish and in honor of the generations of Catholics since 1949 in this faith community as disciples of this Body of Christ.

As pledges are made and paid, we will continue to address the one remaining project, which can be found on our parish website. See what this good parish has accomplished already in total pledges and number of donors! At this point in the Campaign, **920 donors** helped us reach **\$1,514,710 in total pledges**. **Total pledges paid are \$1,500,320. Balance due is \$13,889.** It is not the intention of the Fix-It Campaign to place the parish in debt. As a parish, we spent 9 years paying off the \$3.8 million debt. We will only address the project as we raise the funds to pay. As Thomas Jefferson advised, "Never spend your money before you have it!" My Grandmother Ryan said the same message in her own way! For details on the campaign, including the presentation that was shown at Masses as well as the information on Charitable Giving Options, visit our parish website, **www.stfrancislzparish.org**. **Thank you to those who have already responded with a pledge toward the \$1.7 million goal.** St. Francis de Sales has a long history of generous giving. I respectfully ask for the prayers, involvement, and sacrifice of many, if not all, in the parish in making a pledge towards the Fix-It Campaign in addition to the generosity you provide each Sunday offering. For example, **if 1,000 parishioners pledge the suggested amount of \$850 per year for 2 years, we will reach our campaign goal immediately to conclude the project.** Please, everyone, participate through a prayer and a pledge. All the funds we raise in the Fix-It Campaign stay within the parish. I want to express my gratitude to Deacon John Sfire, Jason Sfire, and Amie Paige of The Fidelity Group for doing an extensive study of our parish campus, as was presented in the Fix-It Campaign presentation. I have asked the Fidelity Group, under the leadership of Deacon John Sfire and Jason Sfire, to serve as Project Managers of the Fix-It Campaign. I also want to offer my appreciation for the guidance and involvement of Tom Purtell, Chair of the Parish Pastoral Council (PPC), Marty Bush, Member of the PPC; Mike Carlino, Chair of the Parish Finance Council; Doug Samz, Member of the Parish Finance Council; Christine DePrez, Cornerstone Bank Liaison; Laura Angelini, Business Manager; and Pam Lynch, Director of Youth and Young Adult Ministries.

An Essay by Katie McCormick
January 15, 2019

Good morning. My name is Katie McCormick. I have been attending St. Francis de Sales School since I was three years old and I am in my eighth and final year, "the home stretch" I've called it. As I work toward leaving this school, one question I've asked myself is "what opportunities have I been given by going to St. Francis?" Now I have realized I have been given so many advantages here that I might not have gotten anywhere else. And I want to thank those who have given them to me.

By attending St. Francis, I have received the knowledge and understanding of life skills. Ever since preschool, I have been taught the foundations of friendship. I have known most of my best friends for most of my life. After I leave St. Francis, I will have to say goodbye to many good friends that have been with me since the beginning. But I don't think of it as "goodbye." In high school, I will make new friends but I still can hold on to my old friends. I have been so lucky to have seen these people I care about every day at school for nine years, and I consider this a big opportunity.

St. Francis has a valuable curriculum. Here at St. Francis we host an annual speech contest. Every year, students must prepare, memorize, and perform a speech or poem in front of their class and teacher. Some students then move on to perform in front of judges, and the final winners are awarded medals as they perform in front of the entire school. The speech contest, as much as some students despise it, is actually very beneficial. Students are taught how to use their voices to inspire others at an early age. They are also taught to use their voices in their own writing in language arts class. Thank you, teachers, who have taught us these skills.

I have also been given the opportunity of being involved in extracurricular activities, such as sports and the spring musical. I have been on the basketball

team since third grade and the volleyball team since fifth grade. From these teams, I have learned important values like teamwork and perseverance. I have been taught that losing is just as important as winning and that I should never give up on myself or my teammates. I also have learned that hard work pays off. This year, our eighth grade volleyball team won conference. This was not because we were just good at the sport. We won because we worked hard, never gave up, and played as a team. St. Francis' sports have taught me many important life lessons, and for that, I am grateful.

I also have been in our spring musical since sixth grade. I am very thankful for the chance to express myself and do something I am passionate about. So, thank you coaches and those who have donated time and money for allowing students like me to experience both the wins and losses in sports and life.

Another great thing about St. Francis is that I have been taught the most important of thing all: the value of faith, hope, and love. A few years ago, I remember playing with my dog in my backyard, the same thing any other kid might do after school. I ran to the bottom of the hill my house sits on and looked straight into the sky. At this moment, watching the clouds move and the tree limbs sway from side to side in the wind made me realize something. God is always with me. No matter what I'm doing, even if it is just a thing any kid might do, He is always with me. Growing up in a school like St. Francis where I have learned so much about my faith has made such an impact on my life. Thank you teachers and Father Ryan for allowing me to express my faith freely and for helping me grow in my beliefs. And thank you parishioners for funding St. Francis de Sales School. Without you, none of us students would be where we are today and would get to where we are headed in the future.
